

## Upcoming Series

Stanford Baseball (23-17, 10-8 Pac-10), winners of two straight after four straight losses, will head to Long Beach State this weekend for a three-game series following a win, 8-3, on Monday over Santa Clara and a 10-7 Tuesday win over fellow county rival, San Jose State. This weekend the Cardinal head to Long Beach for the first ever three-game series between the Dirtbags (20-20) and Cardinal, play-off rivals from 1998 to 2004. Stanford returns home to host Santa Clara May 10. Freshman third baseman Kenny Diekroeger is on a 14-game hit streak entering the weekend series, raising his average to .367. Junior first baseman Jonathan Kaskow is flirting with .400, batting .402 on the season.

## Leading Off

- The streaky Cardinal have won two straight after dropping four straight. Two weeks ago they had won eight straight.
- Brett Mooneyham struck out 13 last Friday, the most by a Cardinal pitcher since Erik Davis in 2008. He has 23 strikeouts the last two weeks.
- Close games are the team's mantra this year, as the Cardinal are 8-2 in games decided by one run, winning eight times in its last at-bat.
- Stanford's 15-inning affair at Washington was one of its longest in school-history, match a 15-inning game in 2002 against SCU and an 18-inning game at Arizona in 2002.

the season ranked as high as No. 25 nationally in USA Today in the preseason.

### Out of Left Field

• Cuba a longtime nemesis of USA Baseball also has both head coaches this weekend in common. Mark Marquess and Mike Weathers (then a collegian at Chapman College), have both played and coached against Cuba as members of Team USA. Weathers played for the U.S. in 1970, losing to the Cubans for a silver medal at the World Games, Marquess won a gold medal at the 1967 Pan American Games. Weathers was an assistant with Team USA in 2003 and the head coach in 2007, winning silver medals. Marquess was the head coach in 1981, 1987 and 1988, winning golds at the 1988 Seoul Olympics and at the 1981 World Games.

### About the Dirtbags

• Mike Weathers is in his ninth year at the helm as LBSU is 20-20 on the season, playing at Pepperdine on Wednesday after losing two of three at Cal Poly last weekend. Miami transfer Joey Terdoslavich is the team's leading home run hitter with six homers and a .335 average, while first baseman Steve Tinoco is batting .348 with 40 RBIs. Terdoslavich also has a team-leading 40 RBIs. Shortstop Devin Lohman has a .420 average. On the mound, RHP Andrew Gagnon is the team's stopper with a 5-4 record and 2.82 ERA as the Friday night starter.

### Long Beach State Series

• The two programs will be competing in its first weekend series. Stanford holds an 8-4 series record. Stanford has played at Long Beach State just three times, 1968 and 1969, when Stanford Coach Mark Marquess was a two-sport star for the Cardinal and in 1990, all Stanford wins. From 1998 to 2004 the team competed against one another in four NCAA Regionals. LBSU eliminated the Cardinal in 1998 and in 2004, the latter behind Jered Weaver; while Stanford eliminated the Dirtbags hopes thanks to Ryan Garko and company in 2002 and 2003.

## Stanford Coaching Staff

Clarke and Elizabeth Nelson  
Director of Baseball

• Mark Marquess '69 enters his 34th season as the Clarke and Elizabeth Nelson Director of Baseball. He entered the season with an overall record of 1356-694-7, producing 2 NCAA titles (1987, 1988), 7 Super Regionals (six titles), 14 College World Series, 25 NCAA Regionals and 12 conference titles. He is one of just 10 coaches to have played and coached in a CWS, doing so while a player in 1967. He also won a Gold medal as the head coach of the 1998 Seoul Olympic team and won a gold medal at the 1967 Pan Am Games. He carries a 120-55 (.686) postseason record and 36-25 CWS mark.

### Longtime Lieutenant

• Fellow alum, Dean Stotz '75, has been with Marquess for all 34 years. In his current role, he is the team's primary hitting coach, since 1997. He has developed such Major Leaguers as Carlos Quentin, Johnny Bench Award winner Ryan Garko, Sam Fuld, Jody Gerut and Jed Lowrie. From 1993 to 1996 he was the team's pitching coach, working with Cardinal stars Kyle Peterson, Chad Hutchinson and Jeff Austin.

### Pitching

• Veteran coach Rusty Filter, who spent the last 17 years at San Diego State will serve as the team's pitching coach. San Diego State led the Mountain West Conference in ERA in six of the league's first 10 seasons, ranking in the top-three in each of those years. Individually, four players were named the MWC's Pitcher of the Year, including Stephen Strasburg the last two years (2008, 2009), Bruce Billings (2005), and Scott Shoemaker (2004). In 2009, four of his hurlers--Cincinnati's Aaron Harang, St. Louis' Royce Ring, Boston's Jason Masterson and San Francisco's Alex Hinshaw, pitched in the Majors.

### On the bases

• Dean Stotz '75 will be the third base coach and Mario Iglesias '96, the starting pitcher of the team's 1996 CWS team, will coach first base.

### Coaches of Note

• Two of the Cardinal's national title stars from the 1987 and 1988 are in opposing dugouts, David Esquer (Cal) and Ed Sprague (Pacific). Esquer was the starting shortstop for the 1987 club, while Sprague was the starting third baseman for both the 1987 and 1988 clubs. Sprague also won a World Series title with the Blue Jays.

## Stanford Wins on Monday

• Dave Giuliani hit his first career home run, a three-run shot in the third as Stanford (22-17) snapped a four-game losing streak with an 8-3 win over cross-county rival, Santa Clara (18-24) on Monday. Freshman Dean McArdle (3-0), in his first career start, went a pre-determined four innings, giving up two runs on five hits for the win. Mark Appel pitched the final five innings for his second save, allowing just a single run.

## Cardinal Swept in Washington

• Stanford were swept in Washington, pushing its losing streak to four games following three straight losses in the Pacific Northwest (L 2-4, L 1-8, L 3-4 (15)). In the opener, Brett Mooneyham had his best start of the season, to date, striking out 13, in a complete game loss, giving up four runs (two earned) on four hits. In the Saturday game at Safeco Field, Stanford could manage just one run against Andrew Kittredge, committing four errors on Saturday and seven in the first two games. In Sunday's finale, in a brisk four-hour, 15-inning game, closer Alex Pracher threw seven shut-out innings after entering the game in the eighth, before throwing a wild pitch in the 15th to allow the winning run to score. Stanford hit just .195 for the weekend. Kenny Diekroeger with three hits a piece on Saturday and Sunday to extended his hit streak to 12 games.

## Garko Named to All Legends Team

• Former Stanford star and current major leaguer Ryan Garko was one of the 28 players selected to be a part of the College World Series Legends Team, to be honored during the 2010 championship series at Rosenblatt Stadium. Garko was one of two catchers selected, joining South Carolina's Landon Powell. Garko, currently playing for the Rangers, starred for the Cardinal during Stanford's three-straight CWS seasons in 2001, 2003 and 2003. He finished his Stanford career ninth all-time in batting

## Stanford Professionals

Six former Stanford baseball players started the season in the Majors in 2010, with another three on the cusp of their Major League debuts. 23 additional players were in the minors. The Cardinal featured 11 players in the Major Leagues in 2009, including the 84th player to go to Stanford and player in the Majors, John Hester, who made his debut for another Cardinal great, A.J. Hinch, who was his manager for the Diamondbacks.

## Tough Breaks

Another two former Major Leaguers from Stanford will begin the season on the disabled list. Jed Lowrie, who has played for the Red Sox the previous two years, is on the DL with mononucleosis, while Greg Reynolds, who missed most of last year with a shoulder injury, was hit on the elbow in spring training and will start the season on the DL. According to insiders, Reynolds had been pitching well this spring.

## Coming to a Show Near You...

Three additional players should be in a Major League uniform soon: Oakland outfielder Michael Taylor, Astros catcher Jason Castro and last year's closer Drew Storen. Taylor and Castro will start the season in Triple-A, Storen in Double-A with another first round pick of the Nationals, Stephen Strasburg.

## World Champions

Since Tillie Shafer in 1912 and 1913 with the New York Giants, 16 former players have appeared in the Fall Classic, winning a combined 12 rings. Former Yankee Bobby Brown won four titles with the Yankees in the 1940s and 1950s, while Ed Sprague won back-to-back titles with the Blue Jays in the 1990s. Sprague also part of Stanford's CWS national title runs.

## Award Winners

Former greats Jim Lonborg (1967) and Jack McDowell (1993) have each won Cy Young Awards. Bob Boone won a gold glove at catcher seven times from 1978 to 1989 and Mike Mussina was a gold glove winner from 1996 to 2008, seven times. Lonborg (1967), Boon (1976, 78, 79, 83), Ed Sprague (1991), McDowell (1991-93), Mussina (1992-94, 97-98) and Carlos Quentin were all All-Stars.

• Brett Mooneyham struck out a career-best 13 at Washington, after 10 the week prior against Cal. Despite just four runs (two earned) on four hits, he took the loss up in Seattle after giving up just one earned against the Bears. Over his last two starts he has a 1.76 ERA.

## Freshman Excels at Third

• Kenny Diekroeger, a prep shortstop, has adjusted to third base this season, leading the team with 18 multi-hit games and eight multi-RBI contests. He is hitting .367 overall with 34 runs, 10 doubles and 28 RBIs. He rides a 14-game hit streak into the weekend. Diekroeger has the longest hit streak since 2004. The Cardinal received 59 points, behind three-time defending champion, Arizona State (78 points and 7 first place votes), Oregon State (67, 2) and UCLA. The rest of the Pac-10 preseason picks are: Arizona (fifth), Washington State, Cal, USC, Washington and Oregon.

• Including Heisman runner-up Toby Gerhart (running back and outfielder), current head coach Mark Marquess (who was a quarterback, defensive back and punt returner) and NFL Hall of Famer John Elway (and outfielder and quarterback), the Cardinal have had a number of great two-sport stars. A four-year Major Leaguer with the Diamondbacks and White Sox. Pac-10 players included: UCLA second baseman Chase Utley, Oregon State outfielder Jacoby Ellsbury, USC pitcher Mark Prior and Washington pitcher Tim Lincecum.




