Pepperdine vs. UC Davis

Stanford, Calif.

- Pepperdine evens its all-time record to 26-26 in NCAA Regional/District competition. UC Davis, playing in its first-ever NCAA Division 1 Regional, is now 1-1.
- Pepperdine is 4-0 this year in games played at neutral sites.
- The Waves pounded out at least 10 hits for the third consecutive game, representing the fourth time that has occurred this year.
- Four different Pepperdine players chipped in with at least two hits in Saturday's victory. Included in that mix was Denny Duron, who is batting 5-7 with a home run, two runs scored and four RBI over two games this weekend.
- Pepperdine pitchers have combined for 23 strikeouts through the first two games.
- Pepperdine is now 30-0 when leading after eight innings. The Waves are also 31-1 when registering more hits than their opponent.
- Bryce Mendonca has been successful in three stolen base attempts so far this weekend, making him a team-best 32-37 in that category for the year.
- UC Davis allowed seven runs on Saturday night- the most since surrendering that same total in a 7-6 loss at UC Riverside on May 11.
- For the weekend, Ty Kelly has been UC Davis' hottest hitter and is batting 7-9 with one run scored, two doubles and two RBI.
- Jake Jefferies, UC Davis' leading hitter with a .396 average heading into the postseason, was held hitless for the second game in a row and is now 0-8 in NCAA Regional action. Jefferies has been held without a hit for back-to-back games only twice this year.
- Brad McAtee has lasted at least seven innings in nine different starts so far this year, including each of his last four outings.
- UC Davis and Stanford will square off for a fourth time this year when the two squads meet Sunday in an elimination game. The Aggies have won all three meetings so far, including a 4-2 win during Friday's opening round. The winner of that contest faces Pepperdine at 5 p.m.
