Stanford vs. Pepperdine

Stanford Regional

Stanford, Calif.

- Stanford swept a postseason doubleheader for the first time since the 2005 season, when the Cardinal bested UT-San Antonio and TCU in back-to-back games to advance to the championship of the Waco Regional.
- The meeting between the Waves and Cardinal was the 33rd all-time and the first since 1992, when Stanford fell 5-4 in a contest at Pepperdine. Stanford is now 27-7 all-time against the Waves.
- Stanford's win was its 36th of the year, the most since 2004 when the Cardinal captured the Pac-10 title and won 46 games.
- Sophomore Toby Gerhart went 4-for-5, with three doubles, a homerun and three runs scored. His four hits were a career high, and his three runs matched a career high he set against USC earlier this year (4/26).
- Stanford's 13 runs scored were the most since Stanford scored 15 against Santa Clara on May 12. The Cardinal has now scored 10 or more runs 14 times this season.
- Stanford's one run allowed marked the seventh time this season that the Cardinal has allowed its opponent only one run. It was also the second time in the last three games that the Cardinal has done so.
- Cardinal freshman Danny Sandbrink threw the first complete game of his career. Sandbrink's complete game was just the sixth thrown by a Stanford pitcher this year.
- The 13 runs scored allowed by the Waves matched the team's second highest total of the season. Pepperdine has not given up that many since UC Santa Barbara scored 14 runs against the Waves on Apr. 1.
- Juniors Cord Phelps and Jason Castro both recorded their 28th multi-hit games of the season, a figure which leads the team.
- Stanford's three homeruns in the game matched a season high.
- Stanford has homered three times in seven games this season.
- Stanford will face Pepperdine in the regional final Sunday evening, marking the first meeting between the Cardinal and Waves since March 25, 1992. The Waves won that midweek contest in Malibu, 5-4.
