

Up Next

The No. 6 Stanford men's golf team will begin play at the four-day, 72-hole 2008 NCAA Division I Championships Wednesday, May 28 at the Birck Boilermaker Golf Complex in West Lafayette, Ind. The Cardinal will be looking to repeat as national champions and win their ninth title overall.

For the team title, five golfers from each team will play each day, with the top-four scores counting toward the team total for the round. All 30 teams will compete in the first three rounds, but only the top 15 teams will play in the fourth and final round. The six individual golfers will play in all four rounds. The first round of action begins with tee times (determined by seeding) starting at 7 a.m. ET on Wednesday, May 28. Thursday's tee times will also be determined by seeding, while Friday's tee times will be based on the 36-hole score for each team.

The Field

30 teams and six individuals will be competing for a chance to be called an NCAA Champion. Stanford received the No. 10 seed in the tournament. Also qualifying for the championships (in order by seed) is No. 3 USC, No. 1 Georgia, No. 17 Wake Forest, No. 5 Oklahoma State, No. 14 Clemson, No. 7 Florida, No. 4 UCLA, No. 27 UAB, No. 2 Alabama, No. 6 Stanford, No. 16 Auburn, No. 8 Charlotte, No. 18 Texas A&M, No. 10 East Tennessee State, No. 24 Indiana, No. 44 Oregon, No. 43 Augusta State, No. 42 UC Irvine, No. 47 Illinois, No. 23 Louisville, No. 38 Mississippi State, Washington, No. 50 St. Mary's (Calif.), No. 19 Arizona State, No. 33 Kent State, No. 40 Penn State, 36 San Diego State, No. 31 Texas, No. 49 Middle Tennessee State and Virginia. The individuals in the field are James Sacheck of TCU, Eric Shriver of Pepperdine, Joel Sjoholm from Georgia State, who is ranked No. 4 as an individual, Derek Tolan from Colorado, No. 45 Jurrian Van Der Vaart of Virginia Tech and Dan Woltman of Wisconsin.

Stanford So Far In 2007-08

Stanford has accumulated two top-10 and eight top-five finishes in 11 tournaments this year, winning the UH-Hilo Invitational on February 8. The Cardinal most recently finished sixth at the 2008 NCAA West Regional. The team is averaging 303.1 strokes per round, and has shot a low round of 263 and a tournament-low of 813.

Stanford In The NCAA Tournament

This is the fourth trip to the NCAA Championships in the last 10 seasons for the Cardinal. Last year, Stanford won its eighth team title. Two Cardinal golfers have won individual championships: Sandy Tatum in 1942 and Tiger Woods in 1996.

STANFORD CARDINAL QUINTET 2008 NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS

Freshmen Steve Ziegler will hit the first drive for the Cardinal from the Hole No. 1 tee at 1:17 pm on Wednesday. Following him ten minutes later will be sophomore Jordan Cox. Junior Dodge Kemmer will begin at 1:36 p.m, senior Rob Grube at 1:46 p.m., and freshman Sihwan Kim at 1:55 p.m. Thursday's tee-off order will remain the same, but the Cardinal will start from Hole No. 10 at 8:07 a.m.

SIHWAN KIM

2008 Pac-10 Freshman of the Year and first-team All-Pac-10 honoree Kim is the highest ranked Cardinal golfer, checking in at No. 10. He has taken to the fairways in every tournament Stanford has played thus far and holds the lowest stroke average of the team (71.4). He has amassed one even-par and 16 under-par rounds in 34 outings and has finished in the top-10 six times and the top-25 four times. His best finish came at the CordeValle Collegiate in November when he tied for individual crown with two other golfers. He also holds the team's best low-round with 63 strokes, and is tied with teammate Grube for a tournament-low 199.

ROB GRUBE

No. 22 Grube was awarded his fourth consecutive first-team All-Pac-10 award at the Pac-10 Championships, and was most recently named the Pac-10 Men's Golf Scholar Athlete of the Year. In 11 tournaments this season, he has five top-10 and four top-25 finishes. His two best places came at the Pac-10 Championships (T3) and also at the UH-Hilo Invitational, where he tied for second with teammate Kim and shot his round and tournament lows of 65 and 199. He is currently averaging 71.9 strokes per round, and has notched three even-par and 12 under-par rounds.

STEVE ZIEGLER

Ziegler has had a sensational rookie campaign. The All-Pac-10 honorable mention golfer improved immensely over the spring, showing he can golf with the best. His best finish was a tie for seventh at the U.S. Intercollegiate Invitational. He is averaging 73.6 strokes per round and has shot two even-par rounds and six under-par rounds, including two consecutive under-par rounds at the 2008 Pac-10 Championships, where he aced the 11th hole in the second round. He has a low-round best of 65 and a tournament-low of 211.

JORDAN COX

Cox has shot 28 rounds in nine events for the Cardinal, and is currently shooting 73.5 strokes per round. He has shot even-par nine times, and under-par on four occasions. He has two top-10 and two top-25 performances. His round and tournament lows are 68 and 210, respectively.

DODGE KEMMER

Kemmer has played in all but one event this year for Stanford, and is averaging 74.6 strokes per round. He has recorded one even-par round, and five under-par rounds. He boasts two top-10 and two top-25 finishes, while stroking a low round of 66 and tournament-low 214.

THE KNOWLES FAMILY DIRECTOR OF MEN'S GOLF, HEAD COACH CONRAD RAY

Last season, Ray helmed one of the most successful Stanford teams in history, guiding the Cardinal to its first national title since 1994. Ray, a member of that 1994 squad, is one of the elite few NCAA head coaches to have won an NCAA title as both an athlete and coach. Under Ray's guidance, the Cardinal led wire-to-wire at the 2007 NCAA Championships in Williamsburg, Va. and claimed an eighth national title for the program. The 12-stroke victory capped an impressive season, during which the squad won seven tournaments and earned a No. 1 national ranking. All five Stanford golfers were named All-Americans at the conclusion of the season, the most to earn the honor in a single-season in program history. Additionally, the squad produced an Academic All-American, three Pac-10 All-Academic honorees, five All-Conference selections, five All-Region selections and a GCAA All-Freshman selection. Ray was named the 2007 Pac-10 Coach of the Year, the Pacific Regional Coach of the Year and the Dave Williams/Eaton Golfpride National Coach of the Year following the 2007 campaign.

In 2005-06, Ray's second year at the helm of the program, the Cardinal posted ten top-10 finishes and advanced to the NCAA West Regional in Tucson, Ariz. Sophomore Rob Grube was tabbed Pac-10 Co-Player of the Year and was honored as an All-American for the second time in his career.

In his first season on the Farm, Ray led his squad its first NCAA Championship appearance since 2001. Under Ray's leadership, Stanford tied for 18th overall while freshman Rob Grube tied for fifth individually, becoming the first Stanford golfer to record a top-five finish since 1998.

Ray is a 1997 graduate of Stanford University where he earned a Bachelor's Degree in Public Policy. A three-year letterwinner for the Cardinal golf team, Ray was a member of the 1994 NCAA Championship squad and a teammate of Tiger Woods, Casey Martin and Notah Begay. He captained the team in 1997 and was an All-Pac-10 and Pac-10 All-Academic selection that season as well. As a senior, he posted six top-10 finishes and nine under-par rounds. Ray's 73.95 stroke average was second-best on the squad.

Ray was tapped to play in the U.S. Open at Pinehurst in June 2005. He has played on the Nationwide Tour and other world tours since 1998 and achieved 12 top-10 finishes in that span. He has worked extensively with numerous golf instructors throughout the country and has organized and administered various pro-am and fund-raising golf tournaments, including the Karl Potach Memorial Tournament for children's cancer research and the Bart McCormick Classic. Ray has been a member of the Golf Coaches Association National Advisory Board since July 2006.

Ray is married to the former Jennifer Woods and has a one-year-old daughter, Ella Katherine Ray.
