**COMING UP:** The Stanford Cardinal will host the first and second rounds of the NCAA Tournament on May 15-16th at the Taube Tennis Center. The No. 9 ranked Cardinal will face the Pacific (CA) Tigers in first round action on the 15th. No. 23 Washington and No. 64 New Mexico square-off in the other first round match. The winners of the two first round matches will compete in the second round on the 16th at 12:00 pm (PT).

**TICKET INFORMATION:** Tickets can be purchased for the upcoming NCAA First and Second Rounds by calling 1-800-STANFORD. Tournament passes will be available as will single day tickets. The Taube Tennis Center ticket booth will open one hour prior to the first match of each day.

**CARDINAL SEASON NOTES:** Legendary Head Coach Dick Gould will lead the Cardinal into the NCAA Tournament one last time before retiring at the conclusion of the season to assume the position of Director of Tennis for the university. During his 38-year run, Gould has amassed an overall record of 773-147 (.840), and an amazing 85-10 dual match record in NCAA Tournament play ... Stanford has won 17 NCAA Team Championships, the most in NCAA history ... Entering the 2003-04 season, every player who has played four years under Gould's tutelage has won an NCAA Championship ring ... The Cardinal are ranked No. 9 in the latest ITA poll ... Stanford has posted a 16-7 overall record this season and a 5-2 mark in Pac-10 play. The 5-2 record in conference play was good for third place in the Pac-10 ... The Cardinal own a 14-7 record versus ranked opponents and an 8-4 mark versus Pac-10 foes this sea-

son ... Junior Sam Warburg, who captured the Pac-10 individual singles title at last month's Pac-10 Championships, was selected as the Pac-10 Player of the Year, and named to the All-Pac-10 First Team. Freshman James Wan was named Co-Newcomer of the Year with Washington's Alex Slovic, while sophomore KC Corkery was selected to the All-Pac-10 Second Team.

**STANFORD IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT:** No team has captured more NCAA team championships than Stanford, who has won 17 titles ... The Cardinal have posted an amazing 85-10 (.895) dual match record during NCAA Championship play ... Since the NCAA adopted its current tournament format in 1977, Stanford has won 15 of a possible 27 championships and has finished as runner-up twice ... Stanford has also been home to 13 NCAA singles champions and 13 NCAA doubles champions. The Cardinal's 13 singles championships ranked second all-time, while their 13 doubles titles rank third all-time ... Stanford last won the NCAA team championship in 2000, the same year that Alex Kim claimed the NCAA singles championship.

**CARDINAL IN THE RANKINGS:** The Cardinal are ranked No. 9 in the latest ITA poll, while three players are ranked among the nation's best. Junior Sam Warburg has reached a career-best No. 8 national ranking after winning the Pac-10 singles championship, while sophomore KC Corkery is ranked No. 65 and freshman James Wan is ranked No. 102. The doubles tandem of Corkery and Warburg are currently ranked No. 8 in the country, while Corkery and sophomore James Pade are ranked No. 32. The team of senior Carter Morris and Warburg are ranked No. 35.

**SCOUTING THE NCAA REGIONAL FIELD:** The No. 64 ranked **New Mexico Lobos**, who enter the weekend with a 17-6 overall record, are in the NCAA Tournament field for the first time since 1999 ... This season's tournament invitation is the ninth in Lobos' history ... UNM claimed both the Mountain West Conference regular season and tournament titles this season, posting a perfect 5-0 record in conference action ... The Lobos are led by senior Divan Coetzee, who is ranked No. 22 in the latest ITA rankings. Coetzee was named the MWC Player of the Year ... The **Pacific Tigers** enter the NCAA Tournament fresh off of winning the Big West Conference tournament ... The Tigers own a 15-9 overall record this season ... Pacific will be making its third trip to the NCAA Tournament ... UOP is led by sophomore Lennart Maack, who was named the Big West Player of the Year, while Head Coach Guido Baumann was named the 2004 Big West Coach of the Year ... The No. 23 ranked **Washington Huskies** head to The Farm with a 14-8 overall record, while finishing fourth in the Pac-10 with a 4-3 mark ... The Huskies are making their 10th consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament ... In 2002, the Huskies traveled to The Farm for the NCAA Regionals and upset the Cardinal in the second round ... Washington is led by junior All-American Alex Vlaski and freshman standout Alex Slovic.

**WARBURG WINS PAC-10 SINGLES TITLE, SHENG/WAN WIN DOUBLES TITLE:** Junior Sam Warburg capped a brilliant Pac-10 Individual Tournament by capturing the men's singles title. Warburg collected five wins in four days en route to winning the title. In the finals of the singles main draw, The Sacramento, CA native collected a 7-6, 6-3 straight sets win over USC's No. 31 ranked Adriano Biaselia to claim the Pac-10 men's singles crown. Warburg is the ninth Stanford men's tennis player to capture the Pac-10 singles title since the tournament began in 1987. In an all-Stanford invitational doubles final, junior Phil Sheng and freshman James Wan edged the freshman duo of Eric McKean and Chris Rasmussen, 8-5 to claim the title.

**WARBURG, WAN AND CORKERY HONORED:** Junior Sam Warburg was selected as the 2004 Pacific-10 Conference Player of the Year, as voted on by the league coaches. Freshman standout James Wan was named as the 2004 Pac-10 Co-Newcomer of the Year, sharing the award with Washington's Alex Slovic. Warburg has enjoyed a dominant junior season, posting a 28-7 overall record and capturing the Pacific-10 Singles Championship. This season, Warburg has recorded a 19-3 dual match record and has registered a 15-2 mark versus Pac-10 opponents. Ranked No. 71 in the ITA preseason poll, Warburg has competed against and defeated some of the best players in the country, earning a career-high No. 8 ranking in the latest ITA poll. Warburg has posted a 19-3 record versus ranked opponents and a perfect 7-0 record versus opponents ranked in the top 25. In addition to winning the conference player of the year award, Warburg was also named to the Pac-10 First Team. Wan has enjoyed a spectacular first season on The Farm. The Woodbury, NY native is currently ranked No. 102 in the latest ITA rankings. Wan has had an immediate impact on the Cardinal lineup, stepping in to post a 27-4 overall record and a near perfect 23-1 dual match record, while playing primarily at the No. 3 and No. 4 singles spots. This season, Wan has posted an 11-2 mark versus Pac-10 opponents. Sophomore KC Corkery, currently ranked No. 65 in the country, garnered Second Team All-Pac-10 honors for the second year in a row. The Manhattan Beach, CA native was slowed by injuries in the beginning of the season, but came on late in the season, posting a 5-1 record in his last six matches. Corkery owns a 13-13 overall record and a 12-10 mark in dual match play.



# Dick Gould

## Men's Tennis Head Coach

**\*\* 2000 NCAA Coach of the Year \*\***

**\*\* ITA Coach of the Decade – 1980's & 1990's \*\***

Few coaches in the history of Division I athletics have obtained the level of success that Stanford men's tennis Head Coach Dick Gould has achieved. After 37 years and 17 national titles, the legendary coach will retire at the end of the 2003-04 season. However, Gould will still be very much involved with Stanford tennis as he will assume the position of Director of Tennis for the university. The men's tennis program will be in good hands as longtime associate head coach, John Whitlinger, who was an NCAA Singles and Doubles Champion on The Farm, will take over the head coaching duties on September 1, 2004.

"Stanford has provided me with an incredible 38-year journey," said Gould. "I will be forever indebted to the wonderful young men with whom I had the great pleasure to work, and who in turn have taught me so much and made my life so rich. As for the future, I am looking forward to the continuing privilege of serving this fantastic university and Stanford Athletics as the Director of Tennis. There is much to be done as we strive to maintain and improve our tradition of excellence, and I am thankful the Department of Athletics has afforded me the opportunity to be an integral part of this."

Throughout the years, Gould, the John L. Hinds Director of Men's Tennis, has proven himself to be one of the top collegiate tennis coaches in the nation. Gould was honored by Wilson Sporting Goods and the ITA as "Coach of the Decade" in men's collegiate tennis during the 1980s and again for the 1990's. The award is fitting as Gould's Stanford teams captured six NCAA team titles in both the 80's and 90's. Gould was also named the 2000 NCAA Coach of the Year.

Under the tutelage of Gould, some of the world's finest tennis players have developed their games during NCAA play at Stanford. A list of former players reads somewhat like a Who's Who in Professional Tennis. In total, 15 different Stanford players have reached the finals, and 12 others have reached the semifinals of the NCAA singles tournament while playing for Gould. Under Gould's watch, 10 players have captured the national championship, while another 10 players have finished as national runner ups in the NCAA doubles tournament. Forty-nine of his players have earned All-America honors. The Cardinal men's team has finished in the NCAA top five in 29 out of the last 34 years. In NCAA team competition, Stanford has won 85 of 95 (.895) matches during the 25 years in which it was invited to participate.

On three occasions, Stanford has captured back-to-back NCAA titles-1973-74, 1977-78 and 1980-81. The Cardinal won three consecutive team titles from 1988-90 and four in a row from 1995-98. Three Gould-coached squads have recorded unblemished records in 1998 (28-0), 1995 (27-0) and 1978 (24-0), and five times his teams have lost only one match.

The 1998 team is regarded by many as one of the best all-time teams, posting a 28-0 record while losing just three points the entire year. For his efforts leading the team, Gould earned ITA/Wilson Intercollegiate Coach of the Year honors and was named the U.S. Olympic Committee Coach of the Year in 1998.

Gould is renowned not only for his coaching and recruiting skill, but also as a pioneer in the collegiate tennis world. The 66-year-old coach initiated major college indoor matches in 1974, opening the doors of Stanford's spacious Maples Pavilion in matches that attracted 7,5000 fans to view collegiate competition in the comfort of an indoor arena.

Gould also spearheaded campaigns to raise \$16 million for the building of the Taube Tennis Center. The Taube Family Tennis Stadium provides permanent loge-type theater seating for 2,500 spectators, locker room facilities for home and visiting teams, an indoor practice range as well as a championship indoor court. The prestigious Orsak Family Heritage Room houses the 30 national championship men's and women's team trophies earned in the past 31 years. It also features a mural of all individual national collegiate champions. The extensive seminar space has been funded by the Koret Foundation and the Rick and Donna Fluegal Family Foundation, and furnished largely by the Bernard Osher Foundation. The Gwen and Victor Riches family has been instrumental in the development of additional tutorial and office space to better serve the renowned East Palo Alto Tennis and Tutoring Program, an inner city out-reach program, based at Taube. The Taube Family Tennis Stadium was the site of the NCAA Women's Tennis Championships in 1991, 1992, 1997 and 2002. Additionally, Gould has been instrumental in bringing world-class tennis events to the Taube Family Tennis Stadium including the WTA's Bank of the West Classic, the 1999 Fed Cup Final, the Siebel Champions and the World Team Tennis National Collegiate Championship.

Gould was also the driving force behind the acquisition of one of the nation's first electronic scoreboards in 1983, which has now been replaced by the Phil and Penny Knight Scoreboard. This unique scoreboard has the capability to control and display scores from 11 different court locations at the same time to all match spectators and convey these results as they happen on the Stanford athletic web site – [www.gostanford.com](http://www.gostanford.com) – to tennis fans and friends of Stanford tennis world-wide. The Russ and Jackie Thompson video center is another unique feature of the facility.

"Courtside With the Stars" was another brainchild of Gould's. John McEnroe, Roscoe Tanner, Sandy Mayer, Nick Saviano, Pat Dupre, Tim Mayotte, Peter Rennert, Gene Mayer, John Whitlinger and Scott Davis are among the tennis alums who have returned to aid Gould in his fundraising effort through the "Courtside With the Stars" exhibition matches.

Gould is also an accomplished author, and the most recent edition (sixth) of his instructional book, *Tennis Anyone?*, remains one

of the most popular guides ever. He has also produced an instructional series for television. He is featured in the instructional video "Better Tennis For Life."

Gould has been recognized for his service both to tennis and to the community. He was awarded the prestigious Kenneth M. Cuthbertson Award for "Exceptional service to Stanford University" in 2002. He was presented with the Volvo "Service to Tennis" Award in 1989 as well as the "Linda Meier Service Award", presented by the Peninsula Center for the Blind. He was presented with the Educational Merit Award in 1983 by the United States Tennis Association. In 1966, the Lifetime Sports Foundation honored Gould as one of 25 master clinicians for teaching tennis seminars.

Gould did his undergraduate and graduate work at Stanford where he was a Dean's list scholar and a Master's degree recipient. He was awarded the Buck Club's leadership award for tennis in 1960.

After graduating from Stanford, Gould taught for two years at Mountain View High School, serving as tennis coach and assistant football coach. In 1962, he moved to Foothill College to become head tennis coach, where his teams won state championships in 1964 and 1965. From 1960 through 1966, he was the tennis professional at the Fremont Hills Country Club in Los Altos Hills. He co-founded the Mid-Peninsula Tennis Patrons Association in 1962 and served as its first president. He has served on the Advisory Committee of the USA Tennis High Performance Coaches' Program and the East Palo Alto Tennis and Tutoring Program. He is a board member of Northern California's Youth Tennis Advantage and U.S. Sports Camps, and has contributed to Sports Education Network.

Gould was named an honorary member of the U.S. Professional Tennis Association in 1981, and in 1967 he served as president of the NorCal Professional Tennis Association. He was inducted into the Ventura County Athletic Hall of Fame in 1990, the Northern California Tennis Hall of Fame in 1992 and the Stanford Athletic Hall of Fame in 1994.

Gould hosted four U.S. Junior Davis training camps at Stanford University in the late 60's and early 70's. He directed the USTA National Junior training camp in 1985, 1986 and 1987. He currently directs Nike Tennis Camps at Stanford. He has conducted tennis clinics in Europe, Mexico, the Caribbean, China, Japan and Central America.

Gould and his wife, Anne, the former Stanford University women's tennis coach from 1976-79 who led the Cardinal to its first women's national team championship in 1978, and currently a senior lecturer in physical education at Stanford, reside in Menlo Park. Their daughter, Kim, will lead the Harvard volleyball team as captain in 2004. She has also been a member of the Crimson high-acclaimed Dance Team. Gould has three other daughters: Susan, a tennis playing graduate of Princeton University; Sheryl, a graduate of Stanford; and Karin, a graduate of the University of Southern California who earned All-America honors as co-captain of the Women of Troy's swim team. Gould's son, Rick, was co-captain of the Stanford swim team, an All-American, and former American record holder in the 200 medley relay.

**2003-04: Singles:** Currently ranked No. 65 in the latest ITA poll ... Selected as a Second Team All-Pac-10 member for the second straight season ... Slowed by injuries in the beginning of the season but is coming on as of late, posting a 5-1 record in his last six matches ... Owns a 13-13 overall record and a 12-10 mark in dual match play ... Has played primarily the No. 2 singles spot this season, posting an 11-6 record at that position ... Has posted a 6-5 record versus ranked opponents this season, but has come on strong of late, winning three of his last four matches against ranked opponents ... Impressive wins include a 6-4, 6-2 straight sets win over then-No. 22 William Barker of Rice (2/14), a 6-3, 2-6, 7-5 win over then-No. 43 Alex Slovic of Washington (3/26), a 6-4, 3-6, 4-1 (ret. inj) win over then-No. 22 Pedro Rico of Pepperdine (4/13) and a 6-1, 6-3 straight sets win over then No. 73 Johan Berg of USC (4/17).

**Doubles:** Has played primarily the No. 1 and No. 2 doubles position ... Teamed with fellow sophomore standout James Pade to advance to the finals of the Pac-10 Individual Tournament main draw. In the Pac-10 Tournament, the tandem defeated then-No. 40 Aaron Spencer and Sven Swinnen of Oregon in the first round, 8-5, before downing then-No. 20 Daniel Chu and Alex Vlaski of Washington in the quarterfinals, 8-5 ...
