## Dick Gould

### Men's Tennis

#### Head Coach

Throughout the years, Dick Gould, the John L. Hinds Director of Men's Tennis, has proven himself to be one of the top collegiate tennis coaches in the nation. Gould was honored by Wilson Sporting Goods and the ITA as "Coach of the Decade" in men's collegiate tennis for both the 1980s and 1990's. The award is fitting as Gould's Stanford teams captured six NCAA team titles in both the 80's and 90's. Gould has won a total of 17 NCAA team titles during his 34-plus years as the Cardinal mentor.

Gould also reached another prestigious milestone this season when he became the Division I men's tennis all-time career victory leader. Gould's 711 (.846, 711-129) victories surpassed Georgia's Dan Magill, who retired with a career mark of 706-183.

Under the tutelage of Gould, some of the world's finest tennis players have developed their games at Stanford. A list of former players reads somewhat like a Who's Who in Professional Tennis. In total, 15 different Stanford players have reached at least the finals of the NCAA Singles Championships while playing for Gould. Forty-five of his players have earned All-America honors. The Cardinal men's team has finished in the NCAA top five in 27 out of the last 31 years. In NCAA team competition, Stanford has won 79 of 86 matches (.919) during the 23 years in which they have been invited to participate.

On three occasions, Stanford has captured back-to-back NCAA titles-1973-74, 1977-78 and 1980-81. The Cardinal won three consecutive team titles from 1988-90 and four in a row from 1995-98.

## John Whitlinger

### Men's Tennis Associate Head Coach

#### 1974 NCAA Singles & Doubles Champion

John Whitlinger, a two-time All-American at Stanford, who has established himself as one of the nation's top collegiate coaches, is now in his 15th season as the associate to Dick Gould. During his tenure, the Cardinal has posted a 351-45 (.886) record and won nine NCAA team titles. One of the nation's top teaching professionals, Whitlinger is co-director of the famous Stanford Tennis School. He was awarded the inaugural National ITA Assistant Coach of the Year in 1997 and was inducted into the ITA Collegiate Hall of Fame in 1999.

"John has been instrumental in helping Stanford continue its national success," Stanford head coach Dick Gould said. "We are blessed to have a coach of John's caliber associated with Stanford. He is without question one of the top coaches in the world."

As an athlete, Whitlinger helped lead Stanford to its first two NCAA Championships in men's tennis in 1973 and 1974. In 1974, he won the NCAA Singles Championship, teamed with Jim Delaney to win the NCAA Doubles Championship, and helped lead Stanford to the NCAA Team Championship. Whitlinger, a member of Stanford's Athletic Hall of Fame, earned All-America honors in both 1974 and 1975.

After his collegiate career, Whitlinger was an international touring professional for six years and was ranked among the world's top 50 in singles and top 40 in doubles. He also played for the Indiana Loves of the World Team Tennis League. He now plays in National Father-Son Tournaments with his 17-year-old son J.J., and the duo is ranked 19<sup>th</sup> in the National Father-Son Rankings.

As the seventh seed, Ansari won four straight matches to reach the semifinals, including a three-set upset of third-seeded Matt Hanlin of Washington in the quarters (2-6, 7-6, 6-4) ... He then lost to teammate K.J. Hippensteel (6-3, 6-3) in straight sets in the semis.

**Doubles:** Has teamed with Scott to compile a 27-8 record ... The pair is 13-2 in duals, 14-5 against Pac-10 opponents and 3-3 against nationally-ranked opponents ...
