### Career Highs

**Points** – 23 vs. W. Michigan (12/18/99)  
**Rebounds** – 13 vs. Washington (2/18/99)  
**Assists** – 3, 8x, last vs. Washington (2/24/01)

**Career:** Finished with career averages of 8.5 points and 4.5 rebounds (111 games - 83 starts) ... Ranks among the Stanford greats in three statistical categories - rebounds (20th, 497), points scored (23rd, 944) and points per game (24th, 8.5) ... Also finished her career 10th on the Pac-10's all-time blocked shot list with 110 ... Earned pre-season or post-season recognition from the Pac-10 in each of her last three seasons.

**2000-2001 Season:** Played in all 30 games, including 24 starts at center ... Started each of the last 23 contests ... Named to the 2000-01 Preseason All-Pac-10 First Team ... Honorable Mention Pac-10 All-Academic ... In 2000-01, averaged 5.1 points and 3.7 rebounds in 16.5 minutes (30 games - 24 starts) ... Ranked eighth in the Pac-10 in blocked shots (1.00 pg) ... Made 10 of her last 18 shots from the field (55.6 percent) ... Had back-to-back 10-point efforts vs. Washington (1/25) and Washington State (1/27) ... Grabbed season-high seven rebounds vs. Oregon (2/8) ... In her final regular season home game at Maples Pavilion, scored season-high 13 points vs. UCLA (3/3).

**1999-2000 Season:** Honorable Mention All-Pac-10 ... Honorable Mention Pac-10 All-Academic ... Named Pac-10 Player of the Week for the period of Dec. 20-Jan. 2, making her the only Cardinal player to win conference POW honors in 1999-2000 ... In 30 games, including 29 starts, averaged team-highs of 12.4 points and 5.5 rebounds in an average of 26.1 minutes ... Ranked in the top 15 in the Pac-10 in three statistical categories – steals (9th, 1.90 pg), points (10th, 12.4 pg) and rebounds (13th, 5.5 pg) ... Cardinal center was also fourth on the team in 3-pointers with 15, and shot 40.5 (15-of-37) percent from behind the arc ... Scored in

double figures 21 times and had 10 or more rebounds on four occasions ... Earned the first Pac-10 Player of the Week honor after averaging 16.3 points and 5.8 rebounds in four victories (Pacific, Saint Mary's, Utah, Colorado).

**1998-99 Season:** Only player to have started in all 30 Stanford games ... Led team in rebounding (6.7 pg) and blocked shots (46) ... Received All-Pac-10 Honorable Mention honors ... Posted six double-doubles, including three in the final eight games ... Finished the year third in the Pac-10 in blocks (1.5 pg), seventh in rebounds and ninth in scoring (12.9 pg) ... Scored in double figures in 23 of 30 games, and recorded 10 rebounds or more on six occasions.

**1997-98 Season:** Played in 21 of Stanford's 26 games ... Posted a career high six points on two occasions (at Purdue, vs. Washington State) ... Had seven blocks on the season, including two against San Francisco.

**In High School:** Graduated from the Blake School in 1997 ... Earned a total of nine letters in track, cross country, volleyball and basketball ... One of six finalists for the Boost/Naismith National Player of the Year Award in 1997 ... Over four years, totaled 2,040 points and 1,360 rebounds ... Member of the USA Basketball Junior National Team that earned a silver medal at the 1996 Confederation of Pan American Basketball Associations Junior World Championship Qualification Tournament.
