Up Next

Stanford (14-5, 5-1 MPSF) will host an NCAA play-in game this Saturday, May 8, at 1 p.m. The Cardinal will take on Massachusetts (10-9, 5-2 A-10) at Laird Q. Cagan Stadium with the winner advancing to the NCAA field consisting of 16 teams. The Cardinal qualified for the play-in game by winning the MPSF tournament, while UMass qualified by winning the Atlantic-10 tournament.

Stanford and UMass

This will be the first-ever matchup between Stanford and UMass in women's lacrosse. The Cardinal enters the game Saturday ranked No. 15 in the nation, while UMass is unranked. The Cardinal has an RPI of 14, while the Minutewomen has an RPI is 34.

In the NCAA Tourney

Stanford has not participated in the NCAA tournament since 2006, when it lost a first-round matchup to Northwestern. This will be the first NCAA event that Stanford lacrosse has ever hosted. UMass is playing in its fifth NCAA tournament and was the NCAA women's lacrosse champion in 1982.

Stanford Offense

Dana Lindsay leads the Cardinal in goals with 39, while Sarah Flynn has 38. Schmidt leads Stanford in points with 53. She has scored 33 goals and contributed 20 assists. Last weekend at the MPSF tournament, Schmidt was named conference player of the year for the second consecutive season. Leading Stanford in assists is Claire Hubbard with 39. Hubbard now has the Stanford record with 86.

Stanford Defense and Goaltending

In the goal, Annie Read has started 18 games, compiling a 14-4 record. She has made 176 saves and is averaging just 9.25 goals per game this year. She is helped out defensively by Eleanor Foote, who leads the team with 36 ground balls and Paige Farmakis who is second on Stanford with 25 caused turnovers.

In the Record Books

Stanford has rewritten the record books this season led by Claire Hubbard's 39 assists, a single-season school record. She also assumed the career lead with 86 helpers on the season. Dana Lindsay (115) and Sarah Flynn (93) have moved into 6th and 10th place on the career goals list. Julie Christy has moved up to third on the all-time draw control list with 109.

Six Straight

The Cardinal is coming off an eventful MPSF tournament where it won three games in four days. Stanford opened with a 16-1 win over Fresno State, before struggling to a 9-7 win over California. Stanford had 43 shots against the Golden Bears, but managed just the nine goals. In the final, the Cardinal went to overtime against Denver and fell behind by a goal. However, Stanford battled back with a Lauren Schmidt goal to force sudden death. Karen Nesbitt won it in the sudden death overtime with just five seconds remaining despite the Cardinal being down two players.



Stanford Dominates All-MPSF Picks

Stanford redshirt junior Lauren Schmidt has been named MPSF Player of the Year for the second consecutive season. In addition, Amy Bokker has been named the MPSF Coach of the Year. Bokker is also a repeat winner. Stanford placed five players on the All-MPSF first team and three on the second team.

In addition to Schmidt, Sarah Flynn, Leslie Foard, Claire Hubbard and Annie Read were named to the all-MPSF first team. Also earning recognition were Julie Christy, Paige Farmakis and Leigh Lucas who were named to the All-MPSF second team

Amy Bokker is in her second season at Stanford and leads a team that has achieved regional success and is on the verge of making national headlines.

This season she led the Cardinal to a 14-5 record and reached the program's highest ever national ranking of No. 8. She also led the Cardinal to a second MPSF conference tournament title in as many years.

In 2009, Bokker led Stanford to its fifth consecutive Mountain Pacific Sports Federation title and a school-record tying 14-4 record that was thought to be enough to earn an NCAA bid. When Stanford completed its season with a win over No. 3 Penn, the Cardinal believed it had earned its second NCAA tournament berth in school history, but did not receive an at-large invitation. Instead, that return bid to the NCAA's is at the top of its list of goals in 2010. A year after rewriting the Stanford record book, Stanford hopes to break the East Coast domination and make an impact at the NCAA Tournament.

In her first season, Bokker coached three IWLCA All-Region honorees, including Maris Perlman and Lauren Schmidt who were named to the first team.

In addition to her role as the Stanford head coach, Bokker served as the assistant coach for the Canadian National Team in the 2009 FIL World Cup held in Prague, Czech Republic. The team captured the bronze medal, the first medal the country has won in 28 years. Recently Bokker was named an assistant coach for the United States Elite National Team. She joins head coach Ricky Fried and assistant coaches Jessica Wilk Strosberg and Liz Robertshaw to lead the American national squad in the 2013 FIL World Cup.
