Tournament Talk ...

No. 1-seeded Stanford will face 16th-seeded TCU on Thursday at 6 p.m. on the Taube Stadium courts. Entering the match against the Horned Frogs, the Cardinal has won 14-consecutive NCAA postseason duals and 31 of the last 32 NCAA matches.

Hosts and Hostesses ...

Stanford will play host to the top-16 teams for both the men's and women's NCAA Championship, May 18-29. This is the first time in the of the NCAA Tennis Championship that the men's and women's tournament will be played at the same site. The round of 16 will begin on Thursday, May 18 at 9 a.m. for the women and Saturday, May 20 at 9 a.m. for men.

Live Coverage...

Live video and scoring will be available throughout the NCAA Tournament at Stanford on GoStanford.com. Live scoring will be available for every men's and women's match in the team, singles and doubles championships. Live video will be streamed for every match played at the Taube Stadium Courts (please refer to the brackets to see which matches will be played at the stadium).

Postseason Potpourri ...

Stanford has competed in postseason action for the past 32 years and has earned a berth into the NCAA Tournament in every year of the tournament's 25-year existence. Stanford has advanced to the final match in 19 of its last 24 NCAA Championship appearances.

NCAA Tournament ...

The Cardinal has claimed 14 NCAA titles and 15 total collegiate titles. Stanford has won the NCAA Championship in four of the last-five seasons, including the last two. Stanford boasts a 96-11 (.897) all-time Tournament record. Stanford also won six-straight NCAA titles from 1986-91.

Ranking Report ...

Stanford remains the top team in the nation with an unblemished 26-0 overall record. Stanford has been ranked No. 1 by the ITA for the entire 2006 season and was ranked No. 1 for the entire 2005 season and the final 12 weeks of the 2004 season.

Individual Items ...

Six Stanford players were offered bids to the 2006 NCAA Singles Championship (No. 7 seed Alice Barnes, Whitney Deason, Celia Durkin, No. 8 seed Amber Liu, No. 9-16 seed Theresa Logar and No. 9-16 seed Anne Yelsey), and two pairings will also compete in the 2005 NCAA Doubles Championship (top-seeded Barnes/Yelsey and Durkin/Liu). The women's individual tournament kicks off on Tuesday, May 23, after the team championship concludes on May 22.

Big Numbers ...

- * Stanford is playing in its 25th NCAA Tournament
- * The Cardinal will continue its quest for its 15th NCAA Team Championship
- * Lele Forood is 31-1 in postseason play with 4 titles and one runner-up finish
- * Forood owns a 164-3 record as head coach at Stanford
- * Stanford is on an 82-match winning streak, dating back to the first match of the 2004 campaign
- * Stanford also owns a 103-match win streak on its home court at the Taube Tennis Center, with the Cardinal's last home loss on Feb. 27, 1999
- * Stanford qualified six singles players for the NCAA Tournament and has seven singles players ranked in the top-75 and four are ranked in the top-11
- * Two Cardinal pairs will compete for the NCAA Doubles Championship, three of the four players were NCAA Doubles finalists in Athens last season
- * If the Cardinal defeats TCU, it will be the 25th time that Stanford has advanced to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Tournament (Stanford has advanced to the semifinals all but one year and has advanced to the championship match 18 times)

Picture Perfect ...

Stanford posted back-to-back perfect seasons in 2004 and 2005. In '04, the Cardinal finished with a 29-0 record and won its 13th NCAA Team Title. Last year, the Cardinal went 27-0 and won its 14th NCAA Team Title. It was the third perfect season in head coach Lele Forood's tenure: she finished her first year with a 30-0 mark in 2001. Stanford has posted nine unblemished seasons in its history.

Pac-10 Pride ...

No. 1 Stanford claimed its 19th-straight Pacific-10 Conference title after tallying a perfect 8-0 league record (there are just nine Pac-10 teams in women's tennis). Alice Barnes and Anne Yelsey captured the conference doubles title in Ojai for the second-straight year, and Barnes was also a singles semifinalist.

Conference Honors ...

Alice Barnes and Anne Yelsey were named the Pac-10 Doubles Team of the Year after winning their second conference crown together in April. Barnes, Amber Liu, Theresa Logar and Yelsey were all named to the All-Pac-10 First-Team.

Regional Recognition...

Lele Forood, Alice Barnes, Amber Liu and Theresa Logar were all honored by the Intercollegiate Tennis Association as Regional Award Winners, announced last week by the ITA. National honors will be announced on May 22 during the NCAA Tournament at Stanford. Forood was named the 2006 Northwest Wilson/ITA Coach of the Year. For the second year in a row, Barnes has been named the Northwest Regional winner of the ITA/Arthur Ashe Award for Leadership & Sportsmanship, given to a player who has exhibited outstanding sportsmanship and leadership as well as scholastic, extracurricular and tennis achievements. Liu was named the Northwest winner of the ITA/Cissie Leary Award for Sportsmanship, which goes to a women's player who displays inspiring dedication and commitment to her team, which has enhanced her team's performance and exemplified the spirit of college tennis. Logar was selected as the Northwest Region ITA Player to Watch, which is given to a player who has had an outstanding season and is expected to perform at a high level the rest of her career. This award's criteria also includes a player's sportsmanship and character.

Winning Ways...

The Cardinal has tallied 17 shutouts this year and another six wins with only one point given up. Stanford owns an 82-match win streak and has won its last 103 home matches. The Cardinal has won 194-of-198 matches over the past seven seasons.

Coaching Corner ...

Head coach Lele Forood has led Stanford to four national titles and one runner-up finish during her first five years with the Cardinal. Now in her sixth season, she owns a 164-3 (.982) all-time record in six seasons. Assistant coach Frankie Brennan has helped the Cardinal to 300 wins and six NCAA titles over the past 11 years.

Player Points ...

Stanford players have tallied 12 singles and five doubles NCAA titles. Senior Amber Liu captured a pair of NCAA singles titles* in her first two seasons and advanced to the NCAA Doubles final last year with Anne Yelsey. Senior Alice Barnes won the NCAA Doubles Championship last year with Erin Burdette, but will be playing with Yelsey this season, while Liu will take on the doubles field with Celia Durkin.

Streak Stats ...

Stanford has won 103-straight duals at home, but the Cardinal has also built its overall win streak to 82-consecutive duals. Stanford's last loss was in the NCAA Championship match against Florida in 2003. Since then, the Cardinal posted a perfect 29-0 season in 2004, a perfect a 27-0 record in 2005 and has amassed a 26-0 record this season.

Home Court Habits ...

Stanford has not been very friendly to its foes at the Taube Tennis Center. The Cardinal has won 103-straight matches on its home court, dating back to 1999. Heading into the tournament, Stanford has won all 13 of its duals at home this season.

Head women's tennis coach Lele Forood, the 2006 Northwest Region Wilson/ITA Coach of the Year, is in her sixth year at Stanford. Last season, she won her fourth NCAA team title in five years and the 14th NCAA Championship in school history. The Cardinal also posted one runner-up finish during her tenure. After serving as an assistant and associate head coach at Stanford for 13 years, Forood has made the most of her time with the Cardinal women's tennis team, guiding them to a 164-3 record. The Cardinal has won 194 of its last 198 matches over the past seven seasons and owns an 82-match win streak heading into the NCAA Round of 16.

Forood has led the Cardinal to an 80-match winning streak, with back-to-back undefeated seasons in 2004 (29-0) and 2005 (27-0), with a chance for a three-peat with a 26-0 record heading into the 2006 NCAA Championship on May 18. Last season, Forood's squad won the school's 14th NCAA Team Championship in the 24-year history of the tournament. The Cardinal posted a 4-0 victory over Texas in the title match, capping the third perfect season in Forood's tenure. Alice Barnes and Erin Burdette, the ITA Doubles Team of the Year, captured the 2005 NCAA Doubles Championship, besting teammates Amber Liu and Anne Yelsey in the finals.

This season, the Cardinal won its 19th Pac-10 team title, while Barnes and Yelsey were crowned the conference doubles champions for the second-straight year.

In 2004, Forood helped Liu win the 2004 NCAA Singles Championship, while doubles pair Lauren Barnikow and Burdette were named the ITA and Pac-10 Doubles Team of the Year. In 2003, Liu won her second NCAA Singles Championship and Forood was honored as the Wilson/ITA National Coach of the Year.

Forood became the first female head coach to win the NCAA team title in 2001. The championship was the first for Forood, who was an assistant coach for five national title runs from 1989-1991 and in 1997 and 1999. She guided the Cardinal to a stellar 30-0 mark in her first complete season at the helm, as well as the 2000 Pac-10 Championship and a final No. 1 ranking. That year marked the seventh perfect season and first in over 10 years.

Forood replaced one of Stanford's all-time great coaches in Frank Brennan, who retired in June 2000 after 21 years and 10 national championships. She was an assistant coach for 10 years before being promoted to associate head coach in March of 2000. In 1997, Forood's efforts in helping lead the Cardinal to the NCAA title were recognized as she was named the Division I National Assistant Coach of the Year by the Intercollegiate Tennis Association.

An All-American at Stanford 1976, the first year they started the All-American accolades, Forood was a National Collegiate singles finalist as a freshman and a semifinalist during her sophomore campaign. Competing internationally, she captured the gold medal in both singles and doubles at the 1975 Pan American Games. She was also the 1975 national amateur singles and doubles champion. Forood was ranked as high as 30th on the women's professional tour, and she had an impressive victory over Wimbledon Champion and second-seed Virginia Wade at the 1977 U.S. Open. At the 1976 U.S. Open, Forood teamed with Rachel Giscafere to reach the doubles semifinals.

Forood was a member of the Board of Women's Tennis Associates from 1979-1987 and served as its secretary-treasurer from 1983-87. She has been extremely active in promoting WTA events, and was the recipient of the prestigious WTA Player Service Award in 1983. After the tour and before coming back to Stanford, she promoted the first professional women's tour event in France from 1986-1988 at Strasbourg.

A native of Fort Lauderdale, Fla., Forood was a member of Stanford's class of 1978, graduating with a degree in sociology.

Frankie Brennan, the 2005 Northwest Region ITA Assistant Coach of the Year and son of legendary former head coach Frank Brennan, is now in his 10th year as an assistant coach on The Farm. In the last 10 years, Brennan has tutored 17 student-athletes to 41 All-America awards, has helped the Cardinal to a 300-12 record, as well as, 11-straight Pac-10 titles, six national championships and three runner-up finishes in the NCAA Tournament. In 2003, he was honored as the ITA National Assistant Coach of the Year.

Brennan was a two-time All-Conference player for the University of Redlands, where he helped the team to a Final Four appearance in 1993 and a fifth-place national finish in 1994. He was also a two-time All-Conference player down the road at Foothill Junior College, where he helped lead the team to a semifinal appearance in the state championships in 1991 and a runner-up finish in 1992.

In 1991, Brennan was voted as The Times Tribune Athlete of the week twice, named MVP of the tennis team and nominated as The Times Tribune Athlete of the Year. He was also nominated for the Foothill College Male Athlete of the Year.

Brennan was head coach of the women's tennis team at the University of Redlands in 1995 before coming to work for his father in 1996. He has also worked for the United States Tennis Association, assisting in the Area Training Center and serving as a USTA zonal coach. Brennan has also been a hitting partner for Venus Williams and other top professionals over the last four years at the Bank of the West Classic. Brennan also played a few years on the satellite circuit.

Brennan prepped at St. Francis and Los Altos High schools, where he was a four-year letterwinner in both tennis and football. He finished his senior year on the East Coast at Mt. St. Joseph High School in Vermont where he was a standout running back on their State Championship football team.

A third generation coach, Brennan and his family have been involved with coaching tennis for years. His grandfather was Billie Jean King's coach for 18 years as well as the personal instructor to former president Jimmy Carter and his family while he was in the White House. In May of 2002, Inside Tennis named the "Brennan Clan," Frank Sr., Jr. and III, to their top-10 list of "Guys Who Have Lent A Hand" to women's tennis.

Brennan resides in Mountain View, Calif., with wife, Shauna, a speech pathologist in the Hillsborough School District, and daughters, Madeline and Francesca.
