





2013 SEASON IN REVIEW

SEASON IN REVIEW: Stanford finished the 2013 season with a 39-21 overall record, marking the 17th straight winning season under head coach John Rittman. The Cardinal finished fourth in the Pac-12 with a 13-11 mark, and was 26-10 against non-conference opponents. Furthermore, Stanford was 20-6 at Smith Family Stadium and 12-5 in neutral site games. The Cardinal notched one of its most successful offensive seasons in program history and ended the year ranked No. 21/22.

POSTSEASON CHATTER: The Cardinal participated in the NCAA Tournament for the 16th consecutive season, dating back to 1998 when the team made its first postseason appearance in head coach John Rittman's second season. Stanford has won seven regional titles and made appearances in the Women's College World Series in 2001 and 2004. Stanford has reached a super regional five of the last nine years

LINCOLN REGIONAL: Stanford went 2-2 in the NCAA Lincoln Regional, reaching the finals against host and eventual Women's College World Series participant Nebraska. The Cardinal is now 41-36 (.532) all-time in postseason play.

STANFORD VS. THE FIELD: The Cardinal was 18-16 against the 2013 tournament field with a 5-3 record in neutral site games. In addition to the seven fellow Pac-12 teams that qualified, Stanford faced these NCAA tournament teams - Florida State, Georgia, Kentucky, Minnesota, Nebraska, Northern Iowa, Oklahoma, Portland State, San Jose State, Tulsa and Wisconsin.

ALL-WEST REGION: Three Cardinal players were selected to the NFCA All-West Region Second Team. Sophomores Leah White and Hanna Winter received the honor for the second straight season, while freshman Kayla Bonstrom was also recognized.

ROOKIE OF THE YEAR: Kayla Bonstrom was tabbed the Pac-12 Freshman of the Year, joining Jessica Mendoza (1999) and Ashley Hansen (2009) as the only Cardinal recipients of the honor. The rookie tallied the eighth-best batting average (.404) in a single season at Stanford, and tied for the fourth-most RBI (55).

ALL-CONFERENCE: Eight Stanford players earned Pac-12 All-Conference honors this season. Senior Jenna Rich and freshman Kayla Bonstrom were first team picks, while sophomore Hanna Winter nabbed second team honors. Seniors Teagan Gerhart and Sarah Hassman, sophomores Cassandra Roulund and Leah White, and freshman Jessica Plaza picked up honorable mention accolades.

ALL-FRESHMAN TEAM: All four Cardinal rookies garnered All-Freshman Team honors from the Pac-12. Kayla Bonstrom, Jessica Plaza and Kelsey Stevens were members of the 14-player team, while Kaitlin Schaberg was an honorable mention honoree.

CONFERENCE HONORS: Freshman Kelsey Stevens was the first Cardinal player to be honored by the Pac-12 in 2013, picking up Pitcher of the Week honors on Feb. 19. Senior shortstop Jenna Rich became the second Cardinal to win a weekly honor, snagging her first career Pac-12 Player of the Week honors on May 6. She led the team offensively to a sweep over California, the first in school history, and became the Cardinal's career RBI leader. Freshman Kayla Bonstrom nabbed her first weekly honor on May 13 to round out Stanford's honorees.

RBI QUEEN: Senior shortstop Jenna Rich became Stanford's career RBI leader on May 3, hitting a three-run homer in a win at Cal. Rich ended her time on The Farm with 214 career RBI. She joins Sarah Beeson ('02) as the only two Cardinal players to reach the 200 career RBI plateau.

CARDINAL ACE: Senior Teagan Gerhart led the team with a 21-13 record, a 2.58 ERA and five saves in 217.1 innings pitched. She ends her career on The Farm ranked in the top-10 all-time in wins (101, 3rd), strikeouts (782, 3rd), innings pitched (927.0, 3rd), shutouts (29, 4th), ERA (2.24, 10th) and stolen bases (28, 10th).

PAC-12 PLAY: Kayla Bonstrom, the Pac-12 Freshman of the Year, embraced the challenges of the Pac-12 Conference season. In conference games, the rookie led the league with 29 RBI and finished second overall in batting average (.457), slugging percentage (.857), on-base percentage (.557), runs scored (22) and hits (32). She was also fourth in home runs with seven.

THREE'S COMPANY: Stanford hit 19 triples, one off of the school record set last season. Sophomore outfielder Cassandra Roulund led the team with six, tying for the second-most in a single season at Stanford with Catalina Morris (2004). Roulund's six triples also tied for the Pac-12 best and ranked 12th nationally.

RECORD SETTER: Senior Sarah Hassman's stolen base against Oklahoma State on Feb. 22 was the 87th of her career, passing Olympian Jessica Mendoza for the most stolen bases in program history. She finished her career with 99 after going 17-for-20 on the year. She also holds the single season record of 35 set in 2011.

MILESTONE FOR RITTMAN: Cardinal head coach John Rittman captured his 700th career win on March 8 in a 2-1 victory over Florida Gulf Coast at the Stanford Louisville Slugger Classic. All of his 700-plus career wins have come during his time on The Farm. He is among the top 20 in the nation of the active winningest head coaches (.683).



STANFORD ALL-AMERICANS

Stanford has a history of consistently producing All-American softball players, with at least one athlete recognized in 15 of the past 16 seasons. In six of those years, the Cardinal has had a school-record three players honored. Since 1998, 15 players have combined for 30 All-America awards, including 11 first-team selections.

In 1998, just a season after head coach John Rittman took the reins of the program, a trio of juniors - pitcher Marcy Crouch, pitcher Becky Blevins and designated player Michele Acosta - led Stanford to its first NCAA Tournament and were later recognized as the school's first All-Americans. The next season, Jessica Mendoza arrived on The Farm, and earned the school's inaugural first-team All-America award after hitting .415 with 57 RBI as a rookie. The Stanford left fielder went on to earn three more first-team honors, and became the school's first four-time first-team All-American.

In 2009, Ashley Hansen became the sixth freshman All-American in school history, following in the footsteps of Mendoza (1999), Sorensen (2000), Morris (2003), Michelle Smith (2005) and Alissa Haber (2007).

In 2010, Haber joined Mendoza as Stanford's only four-time All-Americans. Pitcher Dana Sorensen, first baseman Sarah Beeson and outfielder Catalina Morris were three-time All-Americans for the Cardinal. In 2011, Hansen joined Olympian Lauren Lappin and Missy Penna as two-time honorees.

Jenna Rich became the Cardinal's most recent All-American, claiming honors in 2012.



Stanford softball has a tradition of producing players who go on to compete internationally with the USA Softball program. Over the years, Cardinal players have represented Team USA at such events as the Olympic Games, the U.S. Cup, the ISF World Championships, the Pan Am Games, the World Cup of Softball, the Junior Pan Am Championships, the Junior World Championships, the World University Games, the Japan Cup and the Canada Cup.


Highlighting Stanford's success are its two Olympians, Jessica Mendoza '02 and Lauren Lappin '06. Mendoza, a veteran outfielder for the USA Team, was a key member of the gold medal-winning team in Athens in 2004 and the silver medal-winning team in Beijing in 2008. Mendoza started every game in left field and hit .333 with two doubles, four home runs and nine RBI over the course of the '08 Games. Lappin, an Olympic alternate as a rising junior at Stanford in 2004, was a key utility player for Team USA in Beijing.

Stanford head coach John Rittman was a member of the USA Team coaching staff from 2001-2008, which included coaching in two Olympic Games. Rittman was an assistant coach for the team that captured gold in Athens in 2004, as well as the team that went 8-1 and took home silver in Beijing in 2008.

Former Stanford players Rosey Neill '10, Alissa Haber '10 and Ashley Hansen '12 competed on the USA Junior Team that won gold at the 2007 ISF Junior World Championships in Enschede, Netherlands and the 2006 Junior Pan Am Championships in Puerto Rico. Hansen was the only high school player invited to the U.S. Women's National Team selection camp in September 2007.

During the summer of 2010, Haber, Lappin and Mendoza helped the U.S. Women's National Team capture the gold medal at the KFC World Cup of Softball in Oklahoma City. The trio, along with current Cardinal star Hansen, also led the U.S. to the ISF World Championship crown in Caracas, Venezuela. There, Haber set a new record for most RBI in the World Tournament with 18, breaking Mendoza's previous record of 16.

A number of other Stanford players have competed on USA Elite Teams over the years. Kellie Wiginton '00 was a member of the 1995 USA Junior World Team, while Sarah Beeson '02 was a member of numerous USA National Team pools. Catalina Morris '06 was a member of the 2004 and 2005 USA Elite Teams, with teammate Dana Sorensen '04 joining her on the latter squad. Jackie Rinehart '07 competed on the Elite Team in 2004, and won a gold medal at the World University Games in Taiwan in 2006. Nyree White competed for the U.S. Junior National Team during the summer of 2011. Jessica Plaza '16 claimed a silver medal with the U.S. Junior National Team at the 2013 International Softball Federation Junior Women's World Championship.



BOYD AND JILL SMITH FAMILY STADIUM



The Stanford softball team plays its home games at Boyd and Jill Smith Family Stadium, located just south of Sunken Diamond. The first phase of construction was completed prior to the 1997 season, while the second phase, completed in the spring of 2001, included permanent seating, restroom facilities, a new batting cage and a press box. In 2009, the stadium was upgraded with a new outfield wall.

The stadium has a fixed seating capacity of 820 and a total capacity of 1,500, scalable to 3,500. The stadium has fixed, theater-style seating with individual seats. Wheelchair seating is located throughout the facility. The field surface is a bermuda rye blend, mowed to one inch.

Stanford has enjoyed much success at its home park over the years. Since the stadium was built, the Cardinal has gone 361-124-1 (.744) at home, including 20 wins there in 2013. The record for home wins in a season is 31 set during the 2009 campaign. The team annually hosts a number of preseason tournaments, welcoming teams from around the country to compete in its home facility.

Over the last 12 seasons, the stadium has played host to six NCAA Regionals (2001, 2004, 2007, 2009, 2010 and 2011) and two NCAA Super Regionals (2005, 2009). At home, the Cardinal has won 18 postseason contests and captured four regional titles.


