BEAR NECESSITIES: CAL'S TOP STORYLINES, STREAKS & TRENDS

Cal held Stanford to just 34.6 percent shooting on Tuesday, but fell 53-46. Just three days later, the Golden Bears (11-11, 2-9 Pac-12) will get another crack at the Cardinal (18-5, 8-3 Pac-12) in the Battle of the Bay finale. The second game in the series tips off at 7 p.m. on Friday from Haas Pavilion and airs live on the Pac-12 Network. Mary Murphy and Krista Blunk have the call on Pac-12 Network.

Friday's promotions include a Chinese New Year Celebration. Cal freshman and Beijing, China product Chen Yue, who is pursuing a degree in marketing and business, helped plan the promotions to help celebrate her country's special holiday. The first 1,000 fans will receive a lucky gold envelope (modeled after China's lucky red envelopes) filled with a surprise. Promotions also include a halftime lion dance act, and in-game videoboard features related to the Chinese New Year.

A LOOK AT THE CARDINAL

Series Record: Stanford leads, 66-19

Last Meeting: Stanford won, 53-46, on Tuesday, Feb. 2, 2016

Cal stifled the Cardinal on defense, holding Stanford to 53 points on 34.6 percent (18-52) shooting, but suffered its own offensive woes to shoot 28.6 percent (16-56). Kristine Anigwe led Cal with 17 points and seven rebounds, and Courtney Range chipped in 15 points of her own. Cal held Stanford to only eight points in the first quarter, its second-fewest of the season, but turned in two nine-point quarters on offense.

Need to Know:

- Stanford's only losses in conference have come to the top three teams in the conference -- Arizona State, Oregon State and UCLA
- The Cardinal has been held under 40 points in two Pac-12 games -- at Arizona State (49-31) and at UCLA (56-36).
- Lili Thompson tallied 57 points last weekend to earn this week's Pac-12 and ESPNW Player of the Week nod. Thompson scored 11 points against the Bears Tuesday.
- Karlie Samuelson led Stanford with 15 points in this season's first Battle of the Bay meeting. She shot 3-4 from beyond the arc.
- Erica McCall had a double-double against the Bears Tuesday with 11 points and 13 rebounds.
- Kaylee Johnson added another 15 boards against Cal.

FRESHMAN PHENOMS

Kristine Anigwe is making her case as the best freshman in the country as one of the nation's standouts in several categories. Heading into this week's Battle of the Bay series, Anigwe:

- Leads the Pac-12 and is 11th in the nation for field goal percentage (58.1 percent)
- Most double-doubles of any freshman in the nation with 10 this season, ranking 23rd nationally.
- Third-highest scoring freshman in the country, averaging 20.1 points per game. She is No. 26 overall and second in the Pac-12.
- Top freshman in the nation in free throws made with 136, good for 24th nationally.
- Third-most points scored by any freshman in the country with 423 total points.
- Her 43-point performance and 18 field goals against Sacramento State are the third-highest single-game totals in the NCAA this season
- 7 Pac-12 Freshman of the Week Honors
- US Basketball Writer's Association (USBWA) National Freshman of the Week on Dec. 15

Asha Thomas is also enjoying a successful debut season as Cal's new ball handler:

- Second-most assists by any freshman in the nation, good for 32nd nationally, and 3rd in the Pac-12 in assists
- 3rd in the Pac-12 for assists per game, third-highest apg average of any freshman in the country
- 7th in the Pac-12 for assist-turnover ratio
- Fourth in the Pac-12 in minutes played

WIDE-RANGING

After an injury in 2014-15 limited her minutes as a sophomore, Courtney Range is having a breakout season. Heading into the Battle of the Bay, the versatile junior:

- Is 12th in the Pac-12 for field goals percentage
- One of 50 players on the Naismith Trophy Women's Watch List.

NEXT UP

Cal wraps up a five-game Bay Area homestand with Play4Kay weekend against the Arizona schools. The Bears host Arizona State on Friday, Feb. 12 at 7 p.m., and Arizona on Sunday, Feb. 14 at noon. Sunday's game against Arizona will be televised live on the Pac-12 Network.

CALIFORNIA RISING

With two sophomores and two freshmen in the starting lineup, the Golden Bears boast one of the youngest rosters in the country. Cal's starting five are the third-youngest among all Power 5 programs, behind Clemson and Pitt, who both boast lineups completely made up of underclassmen. Courtney Range is the lone upperclassman in Cal's lineup.

LEADING THE PAC

Kristine Anigwe is quickly emerging as a force to be reckoned with in the Pac-12, as the California newcomer has claimed Pac-12 Freshman of the Week honors seven of a possible 10 weeks. Her seven awards have tied the Pac-12 record, shared by Washington's Kelsey Plum. Anigwe is the only Golden Bear to earn more than two FOTW awards, and one of only three players to earn the weekly nod six or more times since the award was introduced in 2012-13.

SECOND-BEST NONCONFERENCE CAMPAIGN

California wrapped up its nonconference campaign with a 9-2 record (.818), the second-best record under head coach Lindsay Gottlieb during her five years at the helm for the Golden Bears.

- The Bears posted two wins over top 25 opponents - No. 8 Louisville (75-71), No. 19 UCLA (108-104, 20T)
- Cal scored 100+ points in three games - Sacramento State (117-99), UCLA (108-104, 20T) and CSUN (106-44)
- Losses came from No. 10 Texas A&M (75-58) and Saint Mary's (64-63)
- Cal went 6-1 at home
- The Bears have posted three nine-win nonconference campaigns under Gottlieb
- Gottlieb is now 44-12 in nonconference action while at Cal, and 29-3 at home
- Cal's best nonconference campaign under Gottlieb came in 2012-13 when the Bears went 10-1 (.909)

DROPS IN THE BUCKET

Following a 64-63 loss to Saint Mary's on Dec. 5, the Bears offense ignited with four consecutive 80+ point games, and three 100-point games in

four outings. Cal is 21-0 all-time when scoring 100 or more points, and this is the first season in Cal's history in which the Bears have logged three 100-point results.

FOR THE RECORD

Cal's win against Sacramento State shattered numerous program records. Among the highlights:

- Cal's 117 points is a new all-time record for the Golden Bears.

The program's previous high was 115, scored

against USC in March 1989.

- The Bears shot a program-record 69.3 percent (previous best was 68.7 (44-64) vs. Weber State in December 1979.
- Cal's 52 field goals made (52-75) is also a program record, besting the record against Biola (49 made of 87) in January 1980.
- Cal's 37 assists were a new single-game record. The previous best was 34 vs. San Jose State on Nov. 28, 2014.
- With 43 points, Kristine Anigwe was the first player to score 40 or more points since Reshanda Gray's 43 against Washington State on Feb. 27, 2014. She was also the first Cal player to score 30 or more since Gray did it against USC in Feb. 2015.

BEARS SWEEP PAC-12 WEEKLY HONORS IN FIRST WEEK

Golden Bear players swept the first of the weekly Pac-12 women's basketball honors as junior Courtney Range was voted Player of the Week and rookie Kristine Anigwe earned a Freshman of the Week nod. Range averaged a near double-double in the opening weekend of play with 21 points and 9 rebounds per game, including a team-high 19 points in Cal's upset of No. 8 Louisville. Anigwe racked up 19 points of her own against the Cardinals on top of eight rebounds, added to 11 points and another eight boards against Austin Peay State. Against Louisville, Anigwe was nearly unstoppable, shooting at a near-perfect 8-10 clip from the floor.

FOURTH-PLACE FINISHERS

The Golden Bears are predicted to finish fourth in the Pac-12 this season, according to both the preseason Pac-12 Coaches Poll and the Preseason Media Poll. Both the media and coaches expect Oregon State to defend its regular-season title, garnering 23 first-place votes in the media poll and 11 from coaches.

BACK FOR THE BEARS

The Bears return two starters in sophomores Gabby Green and Mikayla Cowling, with Green averaging 6.7 points in 33.2 minutes per game while making all 34 starts last season. Cowling is the leading scorer among all five returners, averaging 10.0 points per game with a .493 shooting percentage in 2014-15. Also returning

for the Bears is junior Courtney Range, whose sophomore campaign was hampered due to injury. Range averaged 8.7 points per game in 27 appearances. Veteran Penina Davidson, a sophomore who also saw time in all 34 games as a rookie, and junior KC Waters, who made 16 appearances last season, round out the returning class.

THE NEWCOMERS

Cal's 2015 class, ranked eighth in the country by ESPN.com, featured five newcomers to the Golden Bear program. The player with the chance to make the most immediate impact is Arizona's Kristine Anigwe, a two-time gold medalist with USA Basketball and McDonald's All-American, ranked No. 8 overall in her class by ESPN HoopGurlz and the No. 1 post player. Anigwe is joined by 6-7 center Chen Yue, No. 51 in the rankings, plus guard Asha Thomas (No. 57, Prospects Nation), wing MaAne' Mosley (No. 81, Prospects Nation) and guard Breanna Cavanaugh (No. 81, ESPN HoopGurlz). Cavanaugh announced her transfer to Rutgers in December.

CAVANAUGH ANNOUNCES TRANSFER

After sitting out indefinitely due to a concussion during the preseason, freshman Breanna Cavanaugh announced her transfer to Rutgers in early December.

SUCCESS UNDER GOTTLIEB

The Golden Bears have enjoyed unprecedented success in head coach Lindsay Gottlieb's time at the helm. In her second season, Gottlieb helped Cal to its first Pac-12 Regular-Season Championship (2012-13) and the program's first-ever Elite Eight and Final Four appearances. Under Gottlieb, the Bears have not finished lower than third in the Pac-12 any season of her head coaching tenure. She posted the most wins in a four-year period of any Golden Bear women's basketball coach, and is one of only three coaches in the Pac-12 (Tara VanDerveer, Charli Turner Thorne) to reach 100 wins at their respective institutions. Additionally, Gottlieb has coached four Cal players to six All-America seasons: Brittany Boyd (2015, 2014); Reshanda Gray (2015); Layshia Clarendon (2013, 2012); Gennifer Brandon (2013), with four WNBA Draft selections since 2012-13.

BLUE & GOLD GO RED, WHITE & BLUE

Cal has three players on its current roster who have competed internationally for USA Basketball: Kristine Anigwe, Gabby Green and Courtney Range. Anigwe claimed back-to-back gold medals at the 2014 FIBA U17 and 2015 FIBA U19 world championships, on top of a silver medal from the 2015 FIBA 3x3 U18 World Championship. Green competed at both the 2013 FIBA U18 3x3 and FIBA U19 world championships, claiming gold at both events. Range is also a gold medalist for Team USA in six appearances for the 2015 World University Games squad.

Former Cal players Reshanda Gray, Justine Hartman, Alexis Gray-Lawson, Devanei Hampton, Trisha Stafford, Cynthia Cooke and Karen Smith all represented the U.S. Current head coach Lindsay Gottlieb is a member of the USA Junior National Team Committee, which selects teams for various international competitions.

HOME SWEET HAAS

Thanks to a generous \$10 million gift from the Evelyn and Walter A. Haas Jr. Fund, Cal's home arena Haas Pavilion received a slew of improvements prior to the start of the 2015-16 season. The arena's latest upgrades include a new center-hung scoreboard with additional LED display boards throughout the arena, an enhanced sound system, an enlarged, modernized video control room and state-of-the-art dynamic lighting system for the arena.

NO. 1 IN THE CLASSROOM

Generally considered the top-ranked public university in the world, Cal has held the No. 1 spot among the U.S. News & World Report rankings of public national universities for 17 consecutive years. In its Best Global Universities ratings, U.S. News places Cal third overall behind only Harvard and MIT.

EYE ON THE NLI'S

Cal's 2016-17 squad is in solid shape with the addition of two four-star prepsters who inked NLI's at the start of the early signing period. Cal Sparks teammates Jaelyn Brown and Celeste Joi 'CJ' West will join the Bears next season. Brown (Murrieta, Calif.) is the nation's 10th-ranked wing and No. 54 overall according to ESPN HoopGurlz, averaging a career 16 ppg, 10.5 rpg, 3.4 spg, 2.7 apg and 1.2 bpg entering her senior season at Vista Murrieta High School. The No. 15 post player in the 2016 class, West (Bakersfield, Calif.) has turned in more than 1,500 points and 1,500 rebounds in three seasons at Garces Memorial High School. As a junior, West put up 18.8 points, 14.3 rebounds, 2.1 blocks, 1.8 steals and 1.1 assists per game.

HEAD COACH LINDSAY GOTTLIEB

Many coaches struggle to find the right balance between success on the court and success in the classroom while empowering student-athletes to enjoy their experiences and letting their individual personalities shine. In four short years as the head coach at California, Lindsay Gottlieb has shown the ability to find the perfect balance in Berkeley by taking the program to unprecedented heights since being hired on April 25, 2011.

Since Gottlieb earned her first head coaching job in 2008-09, only nine coaches have taken their team to an NCAA Final Four appearance, with Gottlieb becoming the eighth coach on that list after leading her 2012-13 California squad to a 32-4 record that included the program's first Pac-12 regular season championship as well as the first Elite Eight and Final Four bids in 40 years of California women's basketball. Doing so in her second season in Berkeley, Gottlieb became just the seventh coach in the country since 1990 to coach her team to the Final Four in her first two seasons at the helm of a program. The Bears have followed the success of the historical 2012-13 season with an NCAA Tournament bid each year since.

Gottlieb's most recent season saw the Bears log another 20-win campaign after finishing at 24-10 overall and 13-5 in Pac-12 play. Cal tied for third in the Pac-12, reached the championship game of the conference tournament and earned a second-round berth in the NCAA Tournament. The season also saw Gottlieb notch her 100th Cal win, becoming the quickest coach in program history to reach the 100-win mark. She joined Tara VanDerveer and Charli Turner Thorne as the only head coaches in the Pac-12 with at least 100 wins at their respective institutions.

Following Cal's 2014-15 NCAA Tournament run, seniors Brittany Boyd and Reshanda Gray became the first Golden Bear duo to be selected in the same year of the WNBA Draft, with Boyd going No. 9 to the New York Liberty and Gray selected by the Minnesota Lynx at No. 16. California has now had at least one player drafted in each of the last three seasons, the only Pac-12 program to hold that distinction.

In her third season in Berkeley, 2013-14, Gottlieb guided Cal to a 22-10 record and third consecutive NCAA Tournament berth after finishing as the conference runner-up. With another 20-win season under her belt, Gottlieb became the winningest Cal women's basketball coach over a three-year period, notching a 79-24 record.

The 2012-13 season was a record-breaking season for the Golden Bears that culminated in Gottlieb being named a finalist for the prestigious Naismith National Coach of the Year award in addition to the media selecting Gottlieb as the Pac-12 Coach of the Year after she led her team to a 17-1 conference record.

Earning praise for her ability to gameplan and make in-game adjustments, 2012-13 also marked the year that Gottlieb became just the fifth coach to win a Pac-12 title in her first two seasons as a head coach in the conference. She is the only active coach in the conference to lead her team to a road victory at Stanford's Maples Pavilion, a feat she accomplished with a 67-55 victory on January 13, 2013 that ended the Cardinal's 81-game conference winning streak and announced California's ascension into the conference and national championship discussions.

Gottlieb's Bears reeled off a program-record 15 consecutive wins to end the regular season and earn a No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament. In a run that surpassed the combined NCAA Tournament win total of all previous California head coaches, Gottlieb led her team to victories over Fresno State, South Florida, LSU and Georgia to reach the 2013 Final Four. She holds a career NCAA Tournament record of 7-5 in five appearances – once as the head coach at UC Santa Barbara and four times at California.

Leading teams to success in the postseason isn't her only specialty though. In her four seasons at California, Gottlieb has amassed a 103-34 record – more California-bests by setting new marks for most wins in a two-year, three-year, and four-year period in Berkeley. Already the first coach to win 20 games in her first season with the Bears, her program-record 32 wins in the 2012-13 marked just the 12th time in conference history that a team surpassed the 30-win barrier, going down as the seventh-best single-season win total in Pac-12 history.

Utilizing an up-tempo, attractive brand of basketball, Gottlieb's approach has helped revitalize West Coast women's basketball with guard Layshia Clarendon thriving under Gottlieb's system en route to being selected No. 9 by the Indiana Fever in the 2013 WNBA Draft as the first player based on the West Coast to be selected. Clarendon twice earned All-America honors in two years playing under Gottlieb and was selected as the Pac-12 Scholar Athlete of the Year. In total at California, Gottlieb has coached players to six All-America seasons in four years with Clarendon earning honors in 2012 and 2013, Gennifer Brandon in 2013, Boyd in 2014 and 2015 and Gray in 2015.

In her first season at the helm in Berkeley in 2011-12, Gottlieb took Cal back to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2009 with her Bears advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

Gottlieb also led the Bears to a second place Pac-12 finish in her inaugural season, just the third time since joining the Pac-10 in its inaugural season (1985-86) that the Bears finished in second place and it was only the second time that Cal has finished with sole possession of second.

Getting A Start At UCSB

Before returning to Cal where she spent three years as an assistant to Joanne Boyle, Gottlieb spent three seasons as the head coach at the University of California at Santa Barbara from 2008-11. In her three seasons with UCSB, Gottlieb led the Gauchos to two postseason berths and a pair of Big West Conference championships, amassing a 56-39 (.589) record. Previously, she spent two seasons as a Cal assistant coach before being promoted to associate head coach in 2007-08.

In 2010-11, Gottlieb guided the Gauchos to their second Big West title in her three seasons at the helm, amassing a 19-12 record (12-4 in the Big West) before falling in the first round of the WNIT to USC. Gottlieb's first team in 2008-09 amassed a 22-10 overall record and a 15-1 mark in the Big West, claiming the conference's regular-season and tournament crowns to earn an NCAA Tournament appearance. As a result, she was named the 2009 Big West Coach of the Year. Gottlieb was the first-ever coach at UCSB to win 20 games in her first season and became one of only seven active coaches nationwide to win 20 games in her first year and also be named Coach of the Year.

Other accolades for Gottlieb include becoming the first coach in UCSB history to win her first 11 conference games and the first coach in school annals to finish her inaugural season with a winning record.

In 2010-11, Gottlieb led the Gauchos to their 18th consecutive winning season and the team won at least 20 games for the 12th time in the past 14 years. The Gauchos led the Big West in both field goal percentage (43.2 percent) and field goal percentage defense (35.4 percent) as well as being tops in the conference in rebounding (40.2 per game).

Under her tutelage, UCSB ranked in the nation's top 10 in field goal percentage defense and the top 20 in points allowed per game while setting a school record in free throw percentage in the 2008-09 season.

Following her time at UCSB, Gottlieb became the ninth head coach for the California Golden Bears women's basketball program by replacing Boyle, who resigned her position to take over the head coaching duties at the University of Virginia.

First Run In Berkeley

Gottlieb initially joined the Cal staff as an assistant coach in 2005-06, a position she held for two seasons before being elevated to associate head coach in 2007-08. During her time in Berkeley, she worked with all aspects of the program, including recruiting and scouting, and served as the team's academic liaison.

Gottlieb was integral to the development of Cal's post players, including Devanei Hampton, the 2006-07 Pac-10 Player of the Year and a two-time All-Pac-10 selection, and Ashley Walker, an All-American and Cal's first player to be selected in the first round of the WNBA draft.

In Gottlieb's inaugural year as an assistant in Berkeley, Cal posted its first winning record (18-12) in 13 years and received its first NCAA Tournament berth since 1993. In 2006-07, Gottlieb helped Cal



register a 23-9 mark - one win shy of equaling the school's win record at the time - and earn another bid to the NCAA Tournament. Cal's 2007-08 squad made the program's first-ever appearance in the Pac-10 Tournament championship game and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

East Coast Beginnings

Gottlieb spent three seasons as an assistant coach at Richmond under Boyle before the two came to Cal. The Spiders posted 20-plus wins each year and advanced to the postseason three times. In 2004-05, Richmond finished with a 23-8 record and earned the program's first NCAA Tournament berth in 14 years. The Spiders were invited to the 2003 and 2004 WNIT.

Prior to Gottlieb's stint at Richmond, she served as an assistant coach at New Hampshire in 2001-02 under head coach Sue Johnson.

Before joining the New Hampshire staff, Gottlieb was an assistant coach for two years at Syracuse with Marianna Freeman at the helm. In addition to her coaching duties for the Big East program, Gottlieb was the assistant director of the school's girls' basketball camp. While at Syracuse, she earned her Master's degree in Philosophy of Education.

Gottlieb obtained additional coaching expertise with the Westchester Basketball Association AAU program and Kutsher's Sports Academy.

The Scarsdale, N.Y., native graduated from Brown in 1999 with a Bachelor's of Arts degree in Political Science and was a member of the women's basketball team. Gottlieb was a student assistant coach during the 1998-99 campaign and received the Team Heart and Soul Award in 1999.

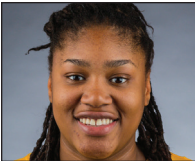
