WHAT TO WATCH

- South Dakota State advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament with a 74-71 upset of fifth-seeded and 19th-ranked Miami Friday. The Jackrabbits, the No. 12 seed for the first time, meets No. 4 seed and 13th-ranked Stanford at 8 p.m. CT Monday.
- A win over Stanford advances the Jackrabbits to Lexington, Ky., for the regionals for the first time in school history.
- SDSU advanced past the NCAA first round in 2009, beating TCU, 90-55, March 22, 2009. It lost to Baylor, 60-58, in the second round, March 24.
- Senior Gabby Boever is 1-4 and classmate Chloe Cornemann is 1-3 in the NCAA Championship, having advanced to the first round in 2013, 2012, 2011 and 2014.
- South Dakota State broke or tied 10 SDSU NCAA records Friday. Freshman Madison Guebert tied SDSU NCAA records with 19 points, five 3-pointers and a 71.4 3-point shooting percentage vs. Miami.
- The Jacks had five players earn Summit League postseason honors. Sophomores Macy Miller and Ellie Thompson were named to the first and second teams, respectively, while junior Kerri Young earned honorable mention. Junior Clarissa Ober was named Defensive Player of the Year and rookie Madison Guebert was tabbed the Freshman of the Year and named to the Summit League All-Newcomer Team.
- SDSU has a five-game winning streak and has won 16 of its last 20 outings.
- South Dakota State's starting lineup of Miller, Guebert, Young, Thompson & Ober is the highest-scoring lineup in The Summit League with four players averaging double digits.

MARCH MADNESS

In its journeys to multiple tournaments since 1976-77, SDSU has posted an 80-35 (.695) record in March. It is 31-8 at home, 9-14 on the road and 40-13 in neutral site games. In Division I-only games, the Jackrabbits are 39-10 (.795) with records of 12-2 in Frost Arena, 4-5 on the road and 23-3 at neutral sites.

ALL-TOURNAMENT HONORS

Point guard Macy Miller was named The Summit League Championship MVP after averaging 18.3 points and 7.0 rebounds per game. She shot an amazing 63.3 percent (19-30) from the field, including 63.6 percent (7-11) from 3-point range.

Freshman Madison Guebert earned all-tournament honors after averaging 14.3 points and 4.0 3-pointers per game. She shot 50 percent from the field (14-28) and 63.2 percent (12-19) from long range.

Miller is a two-time all-tournament pick while Guebert is the third consecutive freshman named to the all-tournament team (Miller & Ellie Thompson, 2015).

FABULOUS FRESHMAN

Madison Guebert finished the regular season as one of the top freshmen in The Summit League. She ranked 15th in scoring (11.8), third in 3-point field goal percentage (.407) and first in 3-pointers made (2.8) in 16 league games.

The guard's 83 3-pointers this season are the second-most treys recorded by a SDSU freshman and are third on the single season list. Guebert also has the third-highest single-season freshman 3-point field goal percentage mark for the Jackrabbits (.409).

BALANCED SCORING

Four starters for SDSU—Macy Miller (15.4), Madison Guebert (10.7), Kerri Young (10.5) and Ellie Thompson (10.3)—all have scored 20-or-more points in a game.

The lineup have scored 78.1 percent (1,812 of 2,318) of the Jacks' points while shooting 52.9 percent from the field (708 of 1,338).

The starters have combined to lead the Jackrabbits in scoring in 32 of 33 games, have 97 double-digit scoring games, 12 20-plus point outings and 11 double-doubles.

JACKS STRONG IN THE PAINT

SDSU has outrebounded 24 of its 33 opponents this season and has a rebounding margin (4.3).

South Dakota State holds a +198 advantage in points in the paint (984-786). The Jackrabbits are averaging 29.8 points per game in the paint.

SDSU has scored 30-or-more points in the paint 15 times this season. The Jacks

scored a season-high 46 points in the lane Feb. 6 against North Dakota State—the most since scoring 54 points against Denver and vs. North Dakota State last season.

South Dakota State's post players have a combined field goal percentage of 46.4 (260 of 560) this season.

JACKS FROM THE STRIPE

South Dakota State's team free-throw percentage (.698) is fifth in The Summit League.

Kerri Young lead the Jacks with a .837 free-throw percentage while Macy Miller is third (.813), but is SDSU's career leader.

FROM THREE

As a team, SDSU averages 7.8 3-pointers per game and shoots 34.6 percent (260 of 752). It ranks second in percentage in Summit League games and 17th nationally in 3-pointers and 19th in 3-pointers per game.

South Dakota State broke a seven-year-old school record Nov. 28 when it sank 17 3-pointers in a win over Old Dominion in the Paradise Jam Nov. 28, 2015.

TIP-INS

The Jackrabbits have an RPI rank of 50, the highest in The Summit League.

Since 2004-05, South Dakota State is 165-16 (.911) when scoring 70-or-more points in a game. This season, the Jackrabbits are 14-1.

Over 70 percent of SDSU's scoring is from its guards.

Senior Gabby Boever's 253 steals rank 15th on the NCAA's active players list for career steals. Additionally, she is 15th in career games played (135), the most played by a Jackrabbit in school history.

South Dakota State is celebrating 50 years of women's basketball. The Jackrabbits won their first game Feb. 2, 1966, at Sioux Falls.

907 AND COUNTING

SDSU's victory over Oral Roberts Feb. 11, was the 900th in the women's basketball program's history. Since starting women's basketball at South Dakota State in 1966-67 with a 6-0 mark, the Jacks have compiled an overall record of 907-389 (.699 winning percentage).

AGAINST RANKED OPPONENTS

South Dakota State is 6-18 vs. ranked foes since 2004-05, but 2-2 in Frost Arena. The Jacks beat then-No. 16 DePaul Dec. 15 and No. 19 Miami Mar. 19, but lost to then-No. 3 Notre Dame Nov. 21 and to then-No. 6 Maryland Nov. 27 this year.

The Fighting Irish were the highest-ranked team the Jackrabbits have played.

Postseason History

- The Jackrabbit are making its seventh NCAA Tournament appearance and 10th-straight postseason appearance overall. SDSU qualified for the Women's NIT in 2007 and 2008 while completing its transition to Division I.
- SDSU is 8-9 in Division I postseason games, including 2-6 in the NCAA Tournament.

- SDSU also had a rich tradition of in NCAA Division II, making nine postseason appearances, including three consecutive Elite Eight appearances (2002, 2003, 2004) to close its run at that level. The Jackrabbits won the 2003 NCAA Division II national championship, defeating Northern Kentucky, 65-50, in St. Joseph, Mo.

Every team has advantages and disadvantages on the stat sheet. Here's what you won't find there:

Well Rested

The Jackrabbits have 11 days in between their last game and tip-off of the NCAA First round matchup vs. 19th-ranked Miami.

West Coast Bound

The Jackrabbits will play on the West Coast for the first time this since 2008-09 when they beat Gonzaga, 78-64, Dec. 12.

SDSU has played in eight different states and the U.S. Virgin Islands this season.

Both Teams in NCAA Tournament

Both of the South Dakota State basketball teams are in the NCAA Tournament for the second time since 2011-12.

The Jackrabbits are one of 23 schools with their men's and women's basketball teams vying for the national title.

Fans Support

South Dakota State is no stranger to fan support. The Jackrabbits averaged 2,300 fans at Frost Arena.

At The Summit League Tournament in Sioux Falls, SDSU has played in front of over 8,000 fans in each of its three games.

A Clean Slate

South Dakota State's overall record means nothing to them in March. In 2010, the Jackrabbits had the most losses by a Jacks' team appearing in the NCAA Division I Tournament. As a No. 15 seed, they entered the tournament with 10 losses and finished 22-11 that year.

The Jackrabbits have history with five potential opponents from the Lexington Region:

- SDSU and Notre Dame have met twice, including Nov. 21 when the then-No. 3 Irish won 75-64 in Frost Arena. Jackrabbits were within eight points with just over three minutes left in the game.

- The Jackrabbits have defeated Indiana twice win the 2007 and 2014 WNIT.

- State lost to Oklahoma in the 2010 NCAA Tournament.

- Kentucky was the first Division I opponent that the Jacks defeated Nov. 26, 2005, at the Paradise Jam Tournament in the U.S. Virgin Islands.

- South Dakota State played then-No. 6 Maryland tight at the Paradise Jam Tournament in the U.S. Virgin Islands this year. The Jacks trailed 56-55 with 1:02 remaining.
