### Storylines

- ◆ Notre Dame has advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 for the seventh consecutive season and the eighth time in nine years.
- ◆ The Fighting Irish will face a current Pac-12 Conference school in the NCAA Championship for the fifth time in six years.

Following a pair of energetic wins before its home crowd at Purcell Pavilion, No. 2/3 (and top-seeded) Notre Dame continues its NCAA postseason journey at 9 p.m. (ET) Friday when it faces No. 13/16 (and fourth-seeded) Stanford in a Lexington Regional semifinal at Rupp Arena in Lexington, Kentucky. The game, a rematch of last year's NCAA Sweet 16 contest in Oklahoma City, will air live on ESPN and WatchESPN, while radio coverage is available on South Bend's Pulse FM (96.9/92.1).

The Fighting Irish (33-1) moved on in this year's NCAA tournament with an 87-70 victory over in-state rival Indiana on Monday night. Notre Dame used a 24-6 run midway through the second half to take command and secure its 26th consecutive win.

Junior guard/captain Lindsay Allen scored 18 of her game-high 22 points in the first half, while sophomore forward Brianna Turner posted her fourth double-double of the year with 18 points and 10 rebounds to pace the Irish effort.

### Setting The Standard

Under the guidance of veteran head coach Muffet McGraw, Notre Dame has evolved into one of the nation's elite women's basketball powers. The Fighting Irish have appeared in 23 NCAA Championships (including a current streak of 21 in a row) and advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 14 times in the past 20 years. Notre Dame also has reached the NCAA Women's Final Four seven times, winning college basketball's ultimate prize with the 2001 national championship.

In its history, Notre Dame has developed 18 All-Americans, 16 WNBA players (including 13 draft picks in the past 15 years) and 19 international basketball veterans (32 medals won). Now in their 39th season in 2015-16, the Fighting Irish own an all-time record of **896-321 (.736)**.

### Quick Hitters

- Notre Dame has advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 for the seventh consecutive season, the eighth time in nine years and the 14th time in 20 seasons. The Fighting Irish are one of five schools to make the Sweet 16 each of the past seven seasons (2010-16).
- Notre Dame's current 26-game winning streak is the third-longest in program history. In the previous four seasons, the Fighting Irish fashioned a winning streak of 20 games or more, including a school-record 37-game success string in 2013-14.
- Notre Dame is one of two schools to have both its men's and women's basketball teams reach this year's NCAA Sweet 16, joining fellow ACC school Syracuse in that elite company.
- This marks the second consecutive season and the third time in school history (also 2003) that both Fighting Irish basketball programs have qualified for the NCAA Sweet 16 in the same season.
- Notre Dame is the only school in the nation to have both of its basketball teams reach the NCAA Sweet 16 and also see its football team win 10 games and compete in a New Year's Six bowl game (Fiesta Bowl) this year.
- Notre Dame is believed to be the first NCAA Division I school ever to have both basketball teams reach the Sweet 16, its hockey program qualify for the NCAA Championship (a 16-team field) and its football program compete in a New Year's Day bowl game, all in the same season.

- Notre Dame swept the ACC regular-season and tournament titles for the third consecutive season, becoming the second conference school ever to pull off that feat and the first since Duke from 2002-04.
- The Fighting Irish earned their fifth consecutive outright conference regular-season championship (including their final two years in the BIG EAST), the longest string of consecutive conference crowns in program history (previous was three from 1989-91 in the Midwestern Collegiate Conference/Horizon League).
- Notre Dame is the third ACC school to win three consecutive outright regular-season championships, joining Virginia (1991-96) and Duke (2001-04).
- The Fighting Irish tied a school record with their fourth consecutive conference tournament title, beginning with the 2013 BIG EAST championship and continuing the past three years in the ACC. Previously, the Fighting Irish won four consecutive league tournament crowns from 1989-92 in the MCC/Horizon League.
- Notre Dame is the fourth ACC school to win three consecutive conference tournament crowns (first since North Carolina from 2006-08).
- The Fighting Irish are off to a 33-1 start or better for the third time in program history, all within the past four seasons (also 2012-13 and 2013-14).
- Notre Dame has registered its sixth consecutive 30-win season and the eighth in program history (all within the past 20 seasons).
- The Fighting Irish are 10-1 against ranked opponents this season, and also registered a win over UCLA on Nov. 28 in the Bahamas, two days before the Bruins entered the Associated Press poll (UCLA is 10th in the final AP poll and 12th in the latest WBCA/USA Today coaches' poll).
- Despite losing two starters from the lineup that opened last April's NCAA championship game in Tampa (and missing a third - sophomore forward **Brianna Turner** - with an injury for six games), Notre Dame has scarcely missed a beat this season, led in large measure by two first-time starters in graduate student guard **Madison Cable** (scoring up from 6.2 to 13.8 ppg.) and sophomore forward **Kathryn Westbeld** (6.7 to 8.0 ppg.), as well as the reliable production off the bench from freshman guards **Arike Ogunbowale** (11.5 ppg.) and **Marina Mabrey** (10.8 ppg.).
- The Fighting Irish feature a very balanced attack with four players currently posting double-figure scoring averages (and two others at 8.0 ppg. or better). Of those six, two are freshmen (**Marina Mabrey** and **Ogunbowale**), and two are sophomores (**Turner** and **Westbeld**).
- Notre Dame's bench play has been sharp this season, with the Fighting Irish reserves averaging 29.7 points per game, compared to 14.7 ppg. for their opponent's bench.
- Notre Dame ranks among the top 25 in six NCAA statistical categories (as of Tuesday),

All Notre Dame player/coach interview requests must be made through **Chris Masters** and 24 hours' notice is appreciated. Be aware that student-athletes' academic obligations always take priority before any interview requests.

Media members also may speak to Fighting Irish team personnel before or after practice sessions. While most practices are open to the media, some may be closed at the coaching staff's discretion — contact **Chris Masters** for the latest practice schedule and availability.

On game days, no interviews will be granted with any Notre Dame player or coach prior to competition.

#### Credentials / Parking

Season credentials will be issued to all media covering the Fighting Irish on a regular basis. Please note — all Notre Dame basketball season credentials offer access to both Fighting Irish women's and men's basketball games.

For single-game credentials, contact **Chris Masters** no later than 24 hours before tipoff. Credential requests may be submitted via phone, fax or e-mail. Passes will be left at the media will call entrance (Gate 8) of Purcell Pavilion, which opens 90 minutes prior to tipoff.

Parking is free for all Fighting Irish women's basketball games in the large lot south of Purcell Pavilion. Media members may park in the Gold Lot (exit off Leahy Drive, adjacent to the baseball/soccer stadium southeast of the arena). Broadcast media may temporarily stop at the Gate 6 (loading dock) arena entrance to unload/load their equipment, but then must park in the designated media lot.

**Credentials remain the property of the University of Notre Dame and may be revoked at any time.**

## Around the ACC

- including five top-10 rankings — three-point field-goal percentage (3rd - .408), field-goal percentage (3rd - .496), scoring margin (4th - +19.5 ppg.), assists (7th - 18.1 apg.) and scoring offense (8th - 79.9 ppg.). The Fighting Irish also rank 19th in assist/turnover ratio (1.22), while standing third in the non-statistical measure of win-loss percentage (.971).
- Including a No. 2 ranking in the final balloting (the fifth year in a row it has ended up second in the media voting), Notre Dame has appeared in the Associated Press poll for 174 consecutive weeks (the past 104 weeks in the AP Top 10), extending a program record that dates back to the 2007-08 preseason poll, and ranking fourth in the nation among active AP poll appearances.
- Notre Dame has been ranked in the top 10 of the Associated Press poll for 116 of 127 weeks this decade (since 2010-11), ranking second in the nation in that category behind only Connecticut (127).
- Every current Fighting Irish player has competed for a top-10 Notre Dame squad during her career, with the vast majority of that time (72 of 78 weeks) spent in the top five of the Associated Press poll.
- Notre Dame is ranked No. 3 in the latest Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA)/USA Today poll, making its 141st consecutive appearance in that survey. It's also the eighth consecutive season and 14 of the past 18 years the Fighting Irish have appeared in the top 10 of the coaches' poll.
- Notre Dame has a remarkable tradition of success at home inside Purcell Pavilion, with the Fighting Irish owning a 435-91 (.827) all-time record in 39 seasons at the facility, including a 112-6 (.949) record since the arena was renovated prior to the 2009-10 season and an active 30-game home winning streak.
- Including regular season and postseason play, the Fighting Irish have won 97 of their last 101 games against conference opponents (and a school-record 34 in a row at home), dating back to their membership in the BIG EAST.
- Since joining the ACC prior to the 2013-14 season, Notre Dame is 57-1 against conference foes (47-1 regular season, 10-0 postseason). Notre Dame is just the second ACC school to lose only once in regular-season conference play during a three-year span (Duke also went 47-1 from 2002-04).
- Guards **Madison Cable**, **Hannah Huffman** and **Michaela Mabrey** have helped Notre Dame to a 141-7 (.953) record in their careers, putting them on pace to challenge last year's senior class of **Whitney Holloway** and **Markisha Wright** as the most successful in Fighting Irish history. Holloway and Wright helped Notre Dame to a 143-10 (.935) record in their four-year careers, with those 143 wins tying for the second-most victories by any four-year class in NCAA Division I history (the Connecticut class of 2011 amassed 150 wins, while the Louisiana Tech class of 1982 also had 143 victories).

- Since they first suited up at Notre Dame in 2012-13, **Cable**, **Huffman** and **Mabrey** have paced Notre Dame to two NCAA national championship games and three NCAA Women's Final Fours (plus four conference regular season titles and four league tournament crowns), as well as a 49-6 (.891) record against ranked teams (25-6 against top-10 opponents).
- With 732 victories in her 29 seasons at Notre Dame, head coach **Muffet McGraw** ranks second on the Fighting Irish athletics all-time coaching wins list (across all sports), trailing only men's/women's fencing coach **Michael DeCicco** (799-90 from 1962-95).
- With 820 career wins, McGraw ranks 10th in NCAA Division I coaching history (seventh among active coaches). She also is one of two ACC coaches in the top 10, along with current North Carolina head coach **Sylvia Hatchell** (third all-time/second among active coaches with 975 wins).

## Other Notre Dame Notables

- Notre Dame is among the nation's winningest programs during the past seven seasons (2009-10 to present), ranking second with 236 victories.
- Notre Dame has ranked among the top 20 in the nation in average attendance annually since 2000-01 (including top-five rankings the past six years). The Fighting



Irish currently rank sixth in the nation this season, averaging 8,437 fans per game at home (92.2 percent of Purcell Pavilion's capacity of 9,149), and have drawn at least 5,000 fans to

243 of their last 245 home games, logging 48 sellouts, including 42 since the 2009-10 campaign (and three this year).

- The Fighting Irish have become a regular fixture at the WNBA Draft lately, as 13 Notre Dame players have been selected in the past 15 seasons. **Jewell Loyd** was the most recent Fighting Irish player to be chosen, going No. 1 overall to the Seattle Storm (the first Notre Dame student-athlete selected No. 1 in any American professional sports league draft since 1972 - Walt Patulski by the NFL's Buffalo Bills). It marked the fourth consecutive year Notre Dame had a player selected among the top three picks in the WNBA Draft (**Devereaux Peters** went third to Minnesota in 2012, **Skylar Diggins** was chosen in that same spot by Tulsa [now Dallas] in 2013, and **Kayla McBride** followed in 2014, selected third overall by San Antonio), making the Fighting Irish the first and only program to produce WNBA Draft lottery choices in four consecutive seasons.

- Loyd** was named the 2015 WNBA Rookie of the Year (the first Notre Dame player chosen for the honor) and joined **Natalie Achonwa** (drafted in 2014, but didn't suit up for the Indiana Fever until this year due to a knee injury) on the 2015 WNBA All-Rookie Team, giving the Fighting Irish four alumnae on the league's all-rookie squad in the past three seasons (**Diggins** was picked in 2013 and **McBride** earned the award in 2014).

- Diggins**, who was a first-team all-WNBA selection in 2014, was one of the WNBA's top players and a prime candidate for league MVP honors during the first half of the 2015 season before suffering a knee injury in late June. Nevertheless, she received her second consecutive starting nod for the WNBA All-Star Game as the top vote-getter in the Western Conference (and second overall). Meanwhile, **McBride** was chosen as a reserve for the Western Conference in this past summer's WNBA All-Star Game and scored 18 points in her all-star debut.

- Peters** became the second Fighting Irish player to earn two WNBA Championship rings, claiming her second in three seasons with the Lynx (and sixth by a Notre Dame alumna), who defeated **Achonwa** and the Indiana Fever in a memorable five-game 2015 WNBA Finals series. **Ruth Riley** was the first Notre Dame grad to be a two-time WNBA champion, winning a pair of crowns with the Detroit Shock (2003 Finals MVP, 2006), while **Coquese Washington** toiled for the 2000 Houston Comets and **Jacqueline Batteast** was Riley's teammate on the 2006 title-winning squad in Detroit.

- In a unique twist, **Peters** and **Achonwa** will play for the same Indiana Fever squad in 2016, after the restricted free-agent Peters was acquired by the Fever on Feb. 1 in a sign-and-trade deal with the Lynx.

### The Notre Dame-Stanford Series

Notre Dame and Stanford will meet for only the fourth time in their series history on Friday night, with the Cardinal holding a 2-1 lead all-time against the Fighting Irish. Last year's matchup in Oklahoma City was the first time Notre Dame and Stanford had played in more than 23 years.

### The Last Time Notre Dame and Stanford Met

**Lindsay Allen** normally focuses on setting others up.

This time, the Notre Dame point guard turned into a scorer, dropping in a career-high 28 points to help the top-seeded Fighting Irish defeat Stanford 81-60 in the NCAA Sweet 16 on March 27, 2015, in Oklahoma City.

Allen entered the night averaging just under 10 points per game, but she matched her career high with 24 points in the first half alone.

**Jewell Loyd** scored 17 of her 21 points in the second half for the Fighting Irish.

**Bonnie Samuelson** scored 17 points and **Erica McCall** and **Amber Orange** each added 12 for No. 4 seed Stanford.

It was the first postseason meeting for veteran coaches **Muffet McGraw** of Notre Dame and **Tara VanDerveer** of Stanford, and just the third-ever meeting between the schools. Stanford won the previous meetings in 1990 and 1991. This one turned into a blowout in the second half.

Allen scored nine quick points to help the Fighting Irish take a 20-11 lead. The Cardinal trimmed it to 34-29 with about three minutes left in the first half before Allen drained two three-pointers to help the Fighting Irish close the half on an 8-2 run and take a 42-31 lead into the break.

Stanford cut its deficit to 48-44 early in the second half before Loyd got going. Her three-point play with just over 10 minutes remaining put Notre Dame up 59-47. The Fighting Irish shot 52 percent in the second half to pull away.

**Other Notre Dame-Stanford Series Tidbits**

- Notre Dame has had seven California natives suit up during the program's 39-year history, including current senior guard (and Diablo resident) **Hannah Huffman**, who was a 2012 graduate of Carondelet High School in nearby Concord.
- During her prep career (2008-12), Huffman challenged (and in many cases, topped) Carondelet's records for career points, rebounds, assists and steals, many of which were held by former Stanford center **Jayne Appel** (now a member of the WNBA's San Antonio Stars, where she is a teammate of former Notre Dame All-America guard **Kayla McBride**).
- Huffman also was a product of the high-powered East Bay Xplosion AAU program that produced numerous Division I players including Appel and a trio of former Oklahoma players in **Courtney** and **Ashley Paris** and **Danielle Robinson** (who also is now a WNBA teammate of Appel and McBride in San Antonio).
- Notre Dame head men's soccer coach **Bobby Clark** (who recently completed his 15th season under the Golden Dome) spent five years (1996-2000) as Director of Soccer at Stanford, overseeing both the men's and women's programs while specifically coaching the Cardinal men's team. During his tenure at the helm of the Cardinal men, Clark compiled a 71-21-12 (.740) record and guided Stanford to the NCAA Championship each of his last four years (1997-2000), and his 1998 squad was the national runner-up. His final season with the Cardinal in 2000 ranked as one of the most successful in Stanford history. The 18-3-1 record matched the school standard for wins in a season (tying the mark set in 1998), while his team also spent two weeks ranked No. 1 in the country, the first time Stanford had ever been atop a collegiate poll in men's soccer. Clark led Notre Dame to its first NCAA national championship in 2013 and most recently, a berth in last year's NCAA round of 16.
- Third-year Notre Dame head women's soccer

coach **Theresa (Wagner) Romagnolo** spent three seasons (2008-10) as an assistant coach at Stanford, helping the Cardinal to a 70-4-3 record, three NCAA Women's College Cup berths and two trips to the NCAA national championship match (2009 and 2010, falling to Notre Dame in the latter contest), as well as two Pac-10 Conference (now Pac-12) titles. In her first two seasons at Notre Dame in 2014 and 2015 (following three seasons as the head coach at Dartmouth), Romagnolo led the Fighting Irish to a combined 28-11-3 record and two NCAA tournament appearances, including a berth in the NCAA round of 16 in 2014.

- Fourth-year Stanford athletics director **Bernard Muir** served on the Notre Dame athletics administration staff from 2000-05, first as an associate and senior associate athletics director for student welfare & development, and later as deputy athletics director for administration and facilities.
- Stanford director for athletics communications **Alan George** served in a similar role with the Notre Dame athletics communications staff from 2007-12, working with the Fighting Irish volleyball and softball teams, while also spending time as a secondary contact with the women's basketball program.

**Golden Dome vs. the Golden State**

- Notre Dame is 29-15 (.659) all-time against teams from the state of California, with a 18-11 (.621) record away from home (road/neutral sites combined) and a 27-7 (.794) record in the **Muffet McGraw** era (1987-88 to present).
- Back on Nov. 28, the Fighting Irish earned a 92-84 overtime win over UCLA in the Junkanoo Jam Freeport Division title game in Freeport, Bahamas.
- This is the seventh consecutive season Notre Dame has played at least one California school, with the Fighting Irish going 9-1 against the Golden State since 2009-10, including an active eight-game winning streak.
- Notre Dame is 6-1 all-time against California schools in the NCAA Championship, most recently defeating Stanford, 81-60 in last year's Oklahoma City Regional semifinals (Sweet 16).

at UCLA in the first round of the 1992 NCAA Championship (in the first-ever NCAA tournament game for the Fighting Irish).

- Notre Dame has won its last 10 games against Pac-12 opponents since an 86-83 double-overtime loss to No. 15 UCLA on Nov. 18, 2010, at Purcell Pavilion.
- This marks the second time in three seasons Notre Dame has played three Pac-12 teams in the same year. In 2013-14, the Fighting Irish won regular-season contests against UCLA (home) and Oregon State (road) before defeating Arizona State in the second round of the NCAA Championship in Toledo, Ohio.

### One Sweet (16) Friday

- In a remarkable confluence of athletics success, three Notre Dame programs will compete in the round of 16 in their respective NCAA tournaments within a four-hour window on Friday.
- The Fighting Irish hockey team leads things off at 5:30 p.m. (ET), taking on Michigan in the NCAA Midwest Regional semifinals at U.S. Bank Arena in Cincinnati. That game will be televised live on ESPN.
- At 7:27 p.m. (ET), the Notre Dame men's basketball team tips off its NCAA East Regional semifinal game against Wisconsin at Wells Fargo Arena in Philadelphia. The game will air live on TBS.
- The Fighting Irish women's basketball team will provide the nightcap to this tripleheader with its 9 p.m. (ET) contest against Stanford in the NCAA Lexington Regional semifinal at Rupp Arena, with ESPN offering the live broadcast.
- Notre Dame is believed to be the first NCAA Division I school to have its men's and women's basketball programs and hockey program all reach the round of 16 in their respective NCAA tournaments, while the same school's football program posted a 10-win season and competed in a New Year's Day bowl game (the Fighting Irish faced Ohio State in this year's Fiesta Bowl).

### Irish In The NCAA Championship

- Notre Dame is in the midst of its 23rd appearance in the NCAA Championship (and 21st in a row). The Fighting Irish have a .716 winning percentage (53-21) in NCAA Championship play, ranking sixth all-time in that category (minimum of 20 games played).
- Notre Dame's current streak of 21 consecutive NCAA Championship appearances ranks fourth in the record books (and fifth-longest at any time in tournament history).
- Notre Dame is one of four schools in tournament history to make five appearances in the NCAA national championship game (along

with Tennessee-13, Connecticut-10 and Louisiana Tech-6). The Fighting Irish are 1-4 all-time in the NCAA final, defeating Purdue (68-66) in 2001 in St. Louis, before falling to Texas A&M (76-70) in 2011 in Indianapolis, Baylor (80-61) in 2012 in Denver and Connecticut in both 2014 (79-58 in Nashville) and 2015 (63-53 in Tampa).

- Notre Dame is one of three schools ever to make four trips to the NCAA title game in a five-year span, along with Tennessee (1995-98) and Connecticut (2000, 2002-04).
- Notre Dame is one of five schools to advance to the NCAA Women's Final Four seven times.
- Notre Dame's **Muffet McGraw** is the one of four Division I coaches to lead his/her team to five NCAA championship game appearances — the other three coaches to pull off this feat are members of the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Massachusetts (Tennessee's **Pat Summitt**, Connecticut's **Geno Auremma** and Louisiana Tech's **Leon Barmore**).
- Notre Dame is the fourth school to reach the NCAA Women's Final Four in five consecutive seasons (2011-15), joining Connecticut (2000-04 and 2008-present), LSU (2004-08) and Stanford (2008-12) in that elite club.
- Notre Dame is one of five schools to make seven trips to the NCAA Women's

- Final Four and come away with at least one national championship, going to the semifinals in 1997 and 2013, the title game in 2011, 2012, 2014 and 2015, and winning it all in 2001.
- The Fighting Irish have a 6-5 (.545) record at the NCAA Women's Final Four, the seventh-best winning percentage (minimum of three games played).
- Notre Dame is the only Atlantic Coast Conference school to reach the NCAA national championship game in consecutive seasons.
- Notre Dame is one of two schools in the country (along with Connecticut) to reach the NCAA Elite Eight the past five seasons.

- Notre Dame is one of five schools in the land to advance to the NCAA Sweet 16 14 times in the past 20 years (1997-2016), as well as each of the past seven years.
- With its 95-61 win over North Carolina A&T on March 19, the Fighting Irish now have won their NCAA

- Each of Notre Dame's 23 NCAA tournament appearances have come during McGraw's 29-year tenure (1987-88 to present).

## Sowing The Seeds

- For the fifth consecutive year (and sixth time in program history), Notre Dame has earned a No. 1 seed for the NCAA Championship.
- The Fighting Irish are 27-4 (.871) all-time as a top seed in the tournament, winning six in a row to claim the 2001 national championship, going 5-1 in 2012 on the way to an NCAA national runner-up finish, posting a 4-1 record en route to the Final Four in 2013, piling up a 5-1 record, finishing as the NCAA national runner-up the past two seasons and beginning this year's tourney with two wins.
- Notre Dame has been awarded a top-eight seed for the 17th time in its 23 NCAA Championship visits (and a top-four seed for the 10th time). The Fighting Irish are 38-5 (.884) all-time as the higher seed in NCAA tournament play.

## It Hinges On Defense

- Notre Dame's success in the NCAA Championship can be directly traced to its performance at the defensive end of the floor.
- In its 23 NCAA tournament trips (73 games), the Fighting Irish are 25-2 (.926) when holding their opponent to 60 points or fewer, including a current 11-game winning streak since the 2010 tournament.
- Notre Dame's two losses to teams scoring 60 points or fewer came at the hands of top-seeded clubs — Penn State (55-49) in the 2004 East Regional semifinals, and North Carolina (60-51) in the second round of the 2007 Dallas Region.

## Stoking The Offensive Fires

- Notre Dame has reached the 80-point mark 24 times in NCAA Championship play, going 24-0 in those games.
- The Fighting Irish have scored at least 70 points in 30 of their last 36 NCAA tournament games, going 27-3 (.900) in those contests.
- The 2014 tournament marked the first time Notre Dame scored at least 80 points five times in a single NCAA Championship — the Fighting Irish had three 80-point games in 1997, 2001 and 2013.

## Bonus Basketball

- Notre Dame is 3-1 all-time when going to overtime in the NCAA tournament, most recently going to OT to win its 2012 Women's Final Four national semifinal over Connecticut (83-75 in Denver).
- The Fighting Irish had previously split two overtime games with Oklahoma in the NCAA tournament (79-75 in a 2008 second-round game at West Lafayette, Indiana; 77-72 loss in 2010 regional semifinal in Kansas City), and also defeated Southwest Missouri State (now Missouri State), 69-65, in extra time in their 2004 NCAA opener at Purcell Pavilion.

## Don't Mess With Tradition

The Notre Dame women's basketball program has developed some traditions that should be quite evident during this weekend's NCAA regional games in Lexington.

- Green nails** — each of the Fighting Irish players and coaches wear green nail polish throughout the NCAA Championship. This tradition started during the 1997 tourney, when the Fighting Irish (whose roster at the time included current associate coaches **Beth (Morgan) Cunningham** and **Niele Ivey**) added the green polish to their fingers prior to their second-round St. Patrick's Day game at Texas, which Notre Dame won 86-83. The Fighting Irish ended up going to their first NCAA Women's Final Four that season and the green nail polish was here to stay. As a show of solidarity, the male members of the travel party usually paint one of their pinkies green as well.
- Green uniforms** — though not limited exclusively to NCAA tournament play, Notre Dame's distinctive kelly green road uniforms have become a staple of the postseason in keeping with the St. Patrick's Day holiday, which often falls during the early rounds of

the tournament. The Fighting Irish most recently wore the alternate green road threads in the NCAA Championship for their 2012 national championship game against Baylor (an 80-61 loss in Denver) — Notre Dame is 8-9 (.471) all-time in the NCAA tournament when featuring the “wearing o’ the green.” The Fighting Irish also have broken out their alternate home whites with green trim (either lime or kelly green or both) in recent seasons, posting a 17-2 (.895) record in those uniforms (the first time they have been worn in NCAA tournament play).

- **Irish jig** — this unique pre-game ritual has become one of the widely-recognized traditions of Notre Dame women's basketball. Just prior to the introduction of the starting lineups, the Fighting Irish players will circle up in the lane with a basketball at their feet. As the Notre Dame pep band plays “Rakes of Mallow”, the team will perform the Irish Jig (a popular step with Notre Dame fans, especially the student body) with the ball bouncing around in the midst of their dance. This tradition is believed to have started during the 1999-2000 season, but picked up steam during Notre Dame's 2000-01 national championship run and has been part of the Fighting Irish pre-game ritual ever since.

### And Don't Forget The Lime Green Shirts

The ever-present lime green t-shirts you might see many Notre Dame fans wearing around Lexington this weekend are given out annually to Fighting Irish women's basketball season ticket holders, a group affectionately known as the “Spirit Patrol”. Created by former coordinator of basketball operations **Stephanie Menio** (now the associate athletics director/senior woman administrator at Army West Point) the shirts are based on one of head coach **Muffet McGraw's** favorite colors, which she sported on the sidelines during the 2001 national championship game win over Purdue.

### Thirty Deeds

- Thanks to a 78-67 win over No. 21 Miami in the ACC Tournament semifinals on March 5 in Greensboro, North Carolina, Notre Dame picked up its 30th victory of the season, the sixth consecutive year and eighth time in program history the Fighting Irish have reached the 30-win mark. Notre Dame also logged that milestone in 1996-97 (31-7), 2000-01 (34-2), 2010-11 (31-8), 2011-12 (35-4), 2012-13 (35-2), 2013-14 (37-1) and 2014-15 (36-3).
- Not only does this represent the first time the Fighting Irish have posted six consecutive 30-win seasons, but it also is the fifth year in a row they registered their 30th win prior to the start of the NCAA Championship.
- This season's 31 victories are the second-most for Notre Dame heading into NCAA postseason play, topped only by the 32 wins in 2014, and matching the 31 victories prior to the 2013 and 2015 tournaments.

### Ranking File

- Notre Dame is 10-1 against ranked opponents (3-1 against top-10 teams).

- In the past five seasons (2011-12 to present), the Fighting Irish are 64-9 (.877) against ranked opponents, with more than two-thirds of those Top 25 wins (44 of 64) by double digits.

### Helping Hands

- Notre Dame has been known for its ability to share the basketball like few teams in the sport, a trend that continues this year with the Fighting Irish recording assists on 61.5 percent of their made baskets (617 of 1,003).
- Never was this trend more apparent than in this year's NCAA Championship opener against North Carolina A&T, when Notre Dame recorded assists on 20 of its first 21 baskets and finished with a staggering .853 assist percentage for the game (29 of 34).
- This trend should come as no surprise, for in the past six seasons (2009-10 through 2014-15), Notre Dame finished the campaign with assists on more than 60 percent of its baskets five times — and in the sixth (2014-15), the Fighting Irish had assists on 59.5 percent of their field goals.

### Spreading The Wealth

- Notre Dame has had at least four players score in double figures in 22 games this year, going 21-1 in those contests.
- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, the Fighting Irish are 139-6 (.959) when they have four or more players reach double digits in the scoring column, including wins in 109 of their last 111 such outings.
- In the past seven seasons, Notre Dame's only losses when it has fielded at least four double-figure scorers both came against Connecticut - 83-65 in the 2013 NCAA Women's Final Four national semifinal at New Orleans Arena (now known as the Smoothie King Center), and 91-81 earlier this season on Dec. 5 in the Jimmy V Classic at Gampel Pavilion in Storrs, Connecticut.
- For the season, Notre Dame currently has four players registering double-figure scoring averages (and two others at better than 8.0 ppg.), four of whom are ranked among the top 30 in the Atlantic Coast Conference (as of Tuesday) — sophomore forward **Brianna Turner** (11th - 14.5 ppg.), graduate student guard **Madison Cable** (17th - 13.8 ppg.), freshman guard **Arike Ogunbowale** (26th - 11.5 ppg.; fifth among ACC rookies) and freshman guard Marina Mabrey (30th at 10.8 ppg.; seventh among ACC rookies).

### Three For The Money

- Notre Dame has heated up from the three-point line in a big way, canning a school-record 203 treys this season (5.97 per game).
- Notre Dame's 203 three-pointers this year not only topped the previous program record of 190 set in 2013-14, but it marks the sixth time in seven years (all but 2010-11) the Fighting Irish have knocked down at least 160 treys in one season.
- At their current pace, the Fighting Irish also would top the single-season program record for three-pointers per game (5.74 in 1998-99). In fact, only once in the past 13 seasons

has Notre Dame averaged five treys per game (2013-14, when it made exactly five per contest and 190 total).

- The Fighting Irish tied a school record with 13 three-pointers on Dec. 5 at top-ranked Connecticut. The 13 triples (which Notre Dame last registered on Jan. 2, 2002, at Miami) also matched two UConn opponent records for three-pointers in a single game (overall and Gampel Pavilion).
- That performance was the first of five times this year the Fighting Irish have made at least 10 three-pointers in a game, with four of those coming against ranked opponents (Dec. 9 vs. #18/17 DePaul; Dec. 30 vs. Georgia Tech; Jan. 21 vs. #RV/24 Syracuse and Feb. 22 at #12/9 Florida State).
- Notre Dame's .650 three-point percentage (13-of-20) at UConn was the highest against the Huskies since March 26, 2007, when LSU made 7-of-10 three-pointers (.700) against UConn in the NCAA Fresno Regional final (Elite Eight) in Fresno, California.
- The Fighting Irish rank third in country in three-point percentage (as of Tuesday), connecting at a .408 clip from beyond the arc, while graduate student guard **Madison Cable** (.471) leads the ACC and ranks as the nation's No. 4 individual three-point shooter.
- This marks the second time in program history that Notre Dame has had two players make at least 60 three-pointers in the same season (Cable-72; **Michaela Mabrey**-63). In 1999-2000, **Alicia Ratay** (73) and current Fighting Irish associate coach/recruiting coordinator **Niele Ivey** (61) both topped that total from beyond the arc.

**The Second Platoon**

- Another reason for Notre Dame's success this season has been the performance of its reserves, who are averaging nearly 30 points per game and have outscored the opponent's bench by more than a 2-to-1 margin (29.7 ppg. to 14.7 ppg.).
- The Notre Dame reserves have combined to score at least 30 points in 16 games this year, including nine 40-point outings.
- The Fighting Irish second unit has outscored the opponent's bench in 31 games this season (and tied in another), including a season-high 64 points on Nov. 23 at Valparaiso, outscoring the entire Crusader roster by 10 points (not to mention the Notre Dame starters by 18).
- The Fighting Irish reserves also outscored the full Virginia Tech roster on Jan. 24, edging the Hokies, 42-41 (and outscoring the Notre Dame starters by four).
- In addition to the Valparaiso and Virginia Tech games, the Fighting Irish bench came close to outscoring the entire opposing team on two other occasions — Nov. 18 vs. Toledo (UT 39, ND reserves 32) and Nov. 27 vs. Denver at the Junkanoo Jam in the Bahamas (DU 52, ND reserves 48).
- A pair of ACC All-Freshman Team guards — **Arike Ogunbowale** (11.5 ppg.) and **Marina Mabrey** (10.8 ppg.) head up the Fighting Irish bench contingent, which has seen at least one reserve score in double figures in 28

games this year (46 double-figure outings).

**A Culture of Success**

- Since the start of the 2012-13 season, Notre Dame has posted a 141-7 (.953) record (138-2 against teams other than Connecticut).
- In that four-year span, six of the seven Fighting Irish losses have come against top-three teams, including the past five against Connecticut — No. 3 Baylor (73-61 on Dec. 5, 2012, at Purcell Pavilion), No. 3 Connecticut (83-65 on April 7, 2013, in the NCAA Women's Final Four national semifinals at New Orleans Arena - now known as the Smoothie King Center - in New Orleans, Louisiana), No. 1 Connecticut (79-58 on April 8, 2014, in the NCAA Women's Final Four national championship game at Bridgestone Arena in Nashville, Tennessee), No. 3 Connecticut (76-58 on Dec. 6, 2014, in the Jimmy V Classic at Purcell Pavilion), No. 1 Connecticut (63-53 on April 7, 2015, in the NCAA Women's Final Four national championship game at Amalie Arena in Tampa, Florida) and No. 1 Connecticut (91-81 on Dec. 5, 2015, in the Jimmy V Classic in Storrs, Connecticut).
- The other loss came on Jan. 8, 2015, with a 78-63 setback at Miami. That defeat ended Notre Dame's 61-game winning streak against unranked opponents in the Associated Press poll, the second-longest active run in the nation (research for this note provided by STATS via the AP).

**Streak Stats**

- Notre Dame's current 26-game winning streak is the third-longest success string in program history, and it's the fifth consecutive season the Fighting Irish have posted a winning streak of 20 games or longer, including a record-setting 37-game run in 2013-14.

That 37-game streak two seasons ago is the longest winning streak by any team in the modern era (post-World War II) of Notre Dame athletics. In fact, the women's basketball program holds four of the eight longest winning streaks in Fighting Irish athletics history during the past seven decades.

- It should be mentioned that the Fighting Irish fencing teams have had a pair of longer streaks in this time, but less than 50 schools across all three NCAA divisions currently offer the sport (some for just one gender)

and some of Notre Dame's wins in their respective streaks came against Division II and Division III teams.

- Notre Dame also has strung together 16 double-digit winning streaks in the program's 39-year history, with 14 of those coming during the tenure of Hall of Fame head coach **Muffet McGraw** (1987-88 to present).

### Conference Conquests

- Including postseason tournament results (league and NCAA), Notre Dame has won 97 of its last 101 games against conference opponents, dating back to the start of the 2011 BIG EAST Conference Tournament.
- Since joining the Atlantic Coast Conference prior to the 2013-14 season, the Fighting Irish are 57-1 against league opponents, going 47-1 in the regular season and 10-0 in the postseason (including a win over then-ACC member Maryland in the 2014 NCAA Women's Final Four national semifinals).
- Notre Dame is just the second ACC program to go three seasons with only one combined regular-season loss. From 2002-04, Duke also posted a 47-1 record.
- Notre Dame's only loss to an ACC opponent since joining the conference came on Jan. 8, 2015 — a 78-63 defeat at Miami that ended a school-record streak of 38 consecutive wins in regular season conference games that began in the program's BIG EAST era.
- Since the loss at Miami, Notre Dame has won its last 35 games against ACC opponents (29 in the regular season, plus six more in the ACC Tournament), the second-longest active winning streak in the nation against conference opponents (Connecticut-78).
- The Fighting Irish have won a school-record 34 consecutive home games against conference opponents, a streak that began on Feb. 14, 2012, with a 66-47 win over Providence. The previous school record for consecutive home conference wins (31) was set from Dec. 12, 1998-Feb. 19, 2002 during the program's BIG EAST membership.

### That Championship Feeling

- With its 70-58 victory over Boston College on Feb. 27, Notre Dame secured its fifth consecutive outright conference regular-season title, and third in as many years as a member of the Atlantic Coast Conference.
- Notre Dame has won five consecutive outright league regular season championships (2012-13 in BIG EAST; 2014-16 in ACC) for the first time in its 39-year history, after winning three in a row just once before.
- In their first three seasons (1988-89 to 1990-91) in the Midwestern Collegiate Conference (Horizon League), the Fighting Irish won the regular season title each time, although they shared the MCC crown in their inaugural league season with Loyola-Chicago.
- Notre Dame is the third program to earn three consecutive outright ACC regular-season crowns and first since Duke won four in a row from 2001-04.
- Notre Dame is the second program from outside the Raleigh-Durham-Chapel Hill triangle to collect three consecutive outright ACC

regular-season championships and the first since Virginia won six in a row from 1991-96.

### A Clean (ACC) Sweep

- For the third consecutive season, Notre Dame completed a sweep of the ACC crowns by winning the ACC Tournament on March 6 with a 68-57 victory over No. 17 Syracuse in the title game in Greensboro, North Carolina.
- Graduate student guard **Madison Cable** was named the tournament's Most Valuable Player, while junior guard/captain **Lindsay Allen** and sophomore forward **Brianna Turner** joined Cable on the All-ACC Tournament First Team. For Turner and Cable, it was the second conference all-tournament accolade of their careers (Turner was on the first team last year, Cable on the second team), while Allen was chosen for the award for the first time.
- The Fighting Irish won their fourth consecutive conference tournament title and ninth overall, adding the last three ACC crowns with the 2013 BIG EAST championship and five prior titles in the MCC/Horizon League (1989-92, 1994).
- The 1989-92 MCC run was the only other time Notre Dame won four consecutive conference postseason tournaments.
- Notre Dame is the second ACC school to sweep the conference's regular-season and tournament titles in three consecutive seasons and the first since Duke in 2001-02, 2002-03 and 2003-04.

### Poise Under Pressure

- Notre Dame has won its last 27 games decided by single digits and/or in overtime, including eight times this season.
- The Fighting Irish last dropped a single-digit decision on March 6, 2012, falling 63-54 at No. 4 Connecticut in the BIG EAST Conference Tournament championship game at the XL Center in Hartford, Connecticut.
- Notre Dame has been sharp when pushed to overtime, winning six in a row and eight of its last 11 when going to an extra session.

### Nearly In A Class By Themselves

- For the fifth consecutive season, a Notre Dame senior class is threatening to set the bar in terms of career wins by one group. The current class of tri-captain **Michaela Mabrey**, plus **Madison Cable** and **Hannah Huffman**, is second all-time with 141 wins (141-7, .953), trailing only the Class of 2015.
- Last year, the Fighting Irish two-player senior class of **Whitney Holloway** and **Markisha Wright** posted the best four-year record (143-10, .935) in program history and tied for the second-most wins by one senior class in NCAA Division I history (Connecticut's 2011 class had 150 victories, while the 1982 Louisiana Tech seniors also had 143 wins).

**Erin Boley**, a 6-2 forward from Hodgenville, Kentucky (Elizabethtown High School) and **Jackie Young**, a 6-0 guard from Princeton, Indiana (Princeton Community High School) both made their official commitments to Notre Dame during the early signing period, head coach **Muffet McGraw** announced Nov. 16.

Both student-athletes are rated among the top 10 players in the country by various national recruiting services. As a group, this duo currently is ranked No. 3 by Prospects Nation, No. 5 by espnW Hoopgurlz, and is a top-five class by most major services for the fifth year in a row. It also gives Notre Dame a Top 25 class for the 20th consecutive year, a streak only two other schools in the country (Connecticut and Tennessee) can match.

#### ERIN BOLEY, 6-2, F (Hodgenville, Ky./Elizabethtown)

**Statistics/Records:** Entering her final year at Elizabethtown High School in Elizabethtown, Kentucky (combined record of 113-22, .837, since she became a starter in eighth grade) ... career per-game statistical averages of 19.4 points and 9.0 rebounds with .546 field-goal percentage, .427 three-point percentage and .829 free-throw percentage ... already holds Elizabethtown school records for career points (2,472) and rebounds (1,070).

#### JACKIE YOUNG, 6-0, G (Princeton, Ind./Princeton Community)

**Statistics/Records:** Entering her final year at Princeton Community High School in Princeton, Indiana (combined record of 70-8, .897) ... career per-game statistical averages of 29.4 points, 10.6 rebounds, 5.7 assists and 3.4 steals with .574 field-goal percentage, .357 three-point percentage and .857 free-throw percentage ... enters her final prep season with 2,290 career points, needing 796 points to pass Shanna Zolman (3,085 at Wawasee High School from 1998-2002) as the all-time scoring leader in Indiana girls basketball history (records date back to 1977-78) ... set Indiana girls' basketball single-season scoring record with 1,003 points in 2014-15, the fifth player of either gender (first female) in state history to score 1,000 points in a season, scoring most points in one season by an Indiana basketball player since 1982-83, when Indiana University and NBA sharpshooter Steve Alford scored 1,078 points for New Castle High School).

#### Notre Dame Incoming Class of 2016

The Notre Dame women's basketball program made history on March 23, becoming the first school ever to have two different incoming freshmen selected as the national high school player of the year, when forward **Erin Boley** (Hodgenville, Ky./Elizabethtown) was presented with the 2015-16 Gatorade National High School Player of the Year award in a surprise ceremony at Elizabethtown High School.

Boley is the third Notre Dame incoming freshman in eight years to earn the Gatorade National High School Player of the Year trophy, following in the footsteps of **Skylar Diggins** (2009) and current Fighting Irish sophomore forward **Brianna Turner** (2014).

Boley will be invited to attend the 2016 ESPY Awards on July 13 at the Microsoft Theater in Los Angeles, where Gatorade will present its National High School Female Athlete of the Year honor (a prize Diggins earned in 2009).

Boley's national award on March 23 came almost exactly two weeks after her fellow Fighting Irish Class of 2016 signee, guard **Jackie Young** (Princeton, Ind./Princeton Community) was chosen as the Naismith Awards High School Player of the Year. Young is the third Notre Dame incoming freshman to garner the Naismith trophy, and the first since Diggins in 2009.

The Gatorade and Naismith honors debuted in 1986 and 1987, respectively, and they are considered two of the biggest individual prizes presented annually to high school basketball players, along with the Morgan Wootten Award, which is given by McDonald's as part of the McDonald's High School All-America Game (Young was a finalist for this year's Morgan Wootten Award).

In the three decades that the Gatorade and Naismith honors both have been presented, there have been no fewer than 16 instances where the same player received both awards, including Diggins in 2009. However, not once did the same university have two different signees sweep the top two national high school player-of-the-year honors — until Notre Dame pulled off that feat in 2016.

- Holloway and Wright's feat topped the Notre Dame's Class of 2014 (**Natalie Achonwa**, **Ariel Braker** and **Kayla McBride**), which previously had the best four-year record (138-15, .902) in school history, topping the win total (130) compiled by the prior year's seniors (**Skylar Diggins** and **Kaila Turner**).
- Prior to the 2011-12 season, the highest four-year win total by a senior class was 109, set by the Class of 2001 that capped their careers with the program's first NCAA national championship and included (among others) consensus national player of the year and 13-year WNBA veteran **Ruth Riley**, as well as current Fighting Irish associate coach/recruiting coordinator **Niele Ivey**.

### Turner of Fortune

- Sophomore forward **Brianna Turner** has had a significant effect on Notre Dame's fortunes throughout her young career, having twice earned first-team all-ACC honors as well as being named the 2016 ACC Player and Defensive Player of the Year. As a prime example of her value, when she was sidelined for six games earlier this season with a shoulder injury, the Fighting Irish saw a noticeable change in their productivity, mainly at the defensive end of the court without their 6-foot-3 rim protector.
- Through 28 games with Turner in the lineup, Notre Dame has allowed just 56.9 points per game, while holding opponents to a .353 field-goal percentage and .287 three-point percentage. In fact, just one opponent has scored more than 70 points against the Fighting Irish with Turner in uniform this season (Georgia Tech in an 85-76 Notre Dame win on Dec. 30), and 16 of those 27 foes did not top 60 points (five others scored 61-62 points).
- Conversely, when Turner was sidelined from Nov. 27-Dec. 12, the Fighting Irish allowed 76.8 points per game, while opponents shot .458 from the field and .339 from the three-point line.

### Irish Subscribe To High Speed Cable

- Graduate student guard, first-team all-ACC selection and ACC Tournament Most Valuable Player **Madison Cable** has taken her game to new heights this season, averaging 13.8 points per game (17th in the ACC). Entering this year, Cable was averaging 5.3 ppg. in her career, including a personal-best 6.2 ppg. last season.
- Cable also is making a run at the shooter's Holy Grail — the 50-40-90 club (referring to one's shooting percentages from the field, three-point line and free-throw line). Cable ranks fourth in the nation and leads the ACC in three-point percentage (.471), while ranking eighth in three-pointers per game (2.1) and 15th in field-goal percentage (.506),

not to mention 10th in steals (1.8 spg.). She would rank third in the ACC in free-throw percentage (.846), but she is two made free throws short of the minimum needed to qualify.

- Cable is shooting .892 (66-of-74) from the foul line outside of an 0-of-4 blemish at the stripe on Dec. 9 against No. 18/17 DePaul, with all four attempts coming after Cable suffered a sprained ankle and jammed knee in the third quarter, both injuries the gritty veteran played through.

- Cable has a .456 career three-point percentage and stands as the active NCAA Division I leader in that category, more than two points clear of **Kelsey Minato** of Army West Point. In fact, Cable is a close second among all active three-point shooters across all NCAA divisions, barely edged out by **Annie Armstrong** of Division II Drury University (.457).
- Prior to this season, Cable had started nine games in her first three years combined, registering 18 double-digit scoring games, two 20-point outings and one double-double.
- In 34 games this season, Cable has started each time out, scoring in double figures a team-high 27 times (the first time she posted a string of more than three consecutive double-digit games) and has a team-best six 20-point games, including a career-high 25 points twice at Purcell Pavilion (on Dec. 2 against No. 10/12 Ohio State in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge, and on Feb. 4 against North Carolina State).
- Cable also has three double-doubles this year, all against ranked opponents, including the Feb. 7 win at Louisville when she grabbed a team-high (and season-best) 12 rebounds.
- "She's as good a shooter as there is in college basketball, and she played great tonight." — Ohio State head coach **Kevin McGuff** after Cable had 25 points, 11 rebounds and made two clutch plays (three-pointer with 56.2 seconds left; two foul shots with 7.5 seconds left) in Notre Dame's 75-72 win over the No. 10/12 Buckeyes on Dec. 2 in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge.
- Cable was chosen the Junkanoo Jam Freeport Division MVP, after she averaged 17.5 points, 6.0 rebounds and 4.0 assists per game with a .688 field-goal percentage, .667 three-point percentage and .875 free-throw percentage during Notre Dame's two games in the Bahamas.
- Cable was a two-time ACC Player of the Week, the first honors of her career, having claimed the award on Dec. 14 and Feb. 8.
- Cable was named the ACC Tournament MVP on March 6 after averaging 14.3 ppg. with a .611 three-point percentage (11-of-18) during Notre Dame's three-game run to the





title, including a career-high 6-of-9 effort from beyond the arc in the championship game against No. 17 Syracuse.

- Cable continues her penchant for sacrificing her body for team success, leading the Fighting Irish by drawing 11 charges this season to raise her career count to 48 drawn charges. That includes Cable's alert play in overtime of the win over UCLA, when she took a charge from Bruins' all-Pac-12 guard (and Canadian National Team member) **Nirra Fields** with 30.1 seconds left, resulting in the fifth foul on Fields and giving Notre Dame possession with a six-point lead.

### Cable is Clutch

- Graduate student guard **Madison Cable** has shown a knack for hitting big shots in big situations — four times this season, she has knocked down a shot in the final four minutes of regulation or in overtime to put Notre Dame in front to stay.
- On Nov. 28 against UCLA in the Junkanoo Jam title game in the Bahamas, Cable sank a three-pointer 31 seconds into overtime, giving Notre Dame the lead for good.
- Four days later against No. 10/12 Ohio State, she was at it again, putting the Fighting Irish in front to stay on a three-pointer with 56.2 seconds left, then helping to ice the win by making two free throws with 7.5 seconds remaining.
- On Feb. 1 at Duke, it was Cable's go-ahead three-pointer with 3:59 left (and steal less than a minute later, right after a Blue Devil timeout) that sealed Notre Dame's win.
- Six days later at No. 13 Louisville, Cable hit two go-ahead foul shots with 3:07 to go and a three-pointer with 2:00 left that punctuated Notre Dame's victory.

### Allen Is The Iron Woman

- Notre Dame head coach **Muffet McGraw** has often noted that she seeks the kind of point guard to whom she can roll the ball out as a freshman and then take it back when that player graduates four years later. As it turns out, junior guard/captain and first-team all-ACC performer **Lindsay Allen** is following that notion to the letter.
- Allen has started all 111 games of her Fighting Irish career, setting the program record for the longest streak of consecutive games started in Notre Dame history, surpassing **Jacqueline Batteast**, who started 97 in a row from Jan. 26, 2002-March 21, 2005.
- When Allen took the reins for Notre Dame's 2013-14 season opener against UNC Wilmington on Nov. 9, 2013 (a 99-50 win at Purcell

Pavilion), she became the first true freshman to start at point guard for Notre Dame in a season opener since Nov. 26, 1994, when **Mollie Peirick** led the Fighting Irish offense in a 65-60 overtime loss at No. 25 Seton Hall.

- Allen's current run of consecutive starts is longer than a pair of recent All-America guards who were poised to challenge the school record in **Skylar Diggins** (86 from 2011-13) and **Jewell Loyd** (86 from 2013-15). Diggins twice gave up her starting spot for graduating seniors to start on Senior Day, while Loyd started nearly every game of her three seasons at Notre Dame before forgoing her final year of eligibility in 2015-16 to enter the WNBA Draft.
- With Allen at the helm, the Fighting Irish have amassed a stellar 106-5 (.955) record — and when you factor in her final prep season at St. John's College High School in Washington, D.C., Allen's teams are a combined 133-6 (.957) in the past four years when she's been in the starting lineup.

### Mabrey's Historic Triple-Double

- ACC All-Freshman Team guard **Marina Mabrey** posted the fifth triple-double in school history (first by a freshman) with 18 points, a school-record 12 steals (the most by any player in the country this year) and a career-high 10 assists on Nov. 23 at Valparaiso.
- Mabrey became just the second Fighting Irish player to record a triple-double using steals. **Mary Gavin** (17 points, 14 assists and 10 steals — the previous school record for steals before Mabrey's effort) was the only other player to do so on Jan. 31, 1987, against Marquette.
- Mabrey's triple-double in her fourth career game tied for the second-quickest to start a career in NCAA Division I history — only **Schaquilla Nunn** of Winthrop did so faster (third career game on Nov. 20, 2012, vs. Mississippi State at the Hardwood for Hope Tournament in Puerto Vallarta, Mexico).
- Mabrey's triple-double was the 25th in ACC history, and the first in ACC history to feature steals.
- Mabrey was the second ACC freshman ever to record a triple-double, joining Duke's **Elizabeth Williams** (18 points, 16 rebounds and 12 blocks at Wake Forest on Jan. 6, 2012) in that elite company.
- Mabrey's 12 steals also are second on the ACC single-game steals list, and the most since Georgia Tech's **Jill Ingram** had 14 thefts (tying the NCAA Division I record) against Virginia Tech on Feb. 29, 2008.
- Mabrey's 12 steals tied for the second-most by a player in completing a triple-double, exceeded only by Old Dominion's **Ticha Penicheiro** (22 points, 15 assists, 14 steals) vs. Saint Francis (Pa.) in the first round of the NCAA Championship on March 13, 1998.
- Mabrey was the first Fighting Irish player with double-digit assists in a game since Feb. 24, 2013, when **Skylar Diggins** had 10 assists at DePaul as part of her second career triple-double (the most recent one by a Notre Dame player before Mabrey).

Both Notre Dame women's basketball incoming freshmen — forward **Erin Boley** (Hodgenville, Ky./Elizabethtown) and **Jackie Young** (Princeton, Ind./Princeton Community) have been selected to participate in the 2016 McDonald's High School All-America Game.

Boley will play for the East Team and Young will suit up for the West Team in this year's McDonald's High School All-America Game, which will be played at 6:30 p.m. (ET) March 30 and will be televised live nationally on ESPNU from Chicago's United Center.

This marks the fifth consecutive year that multiple Notre Dame signees will be competing in the same McDonald's game.

With the selections of Boley and Young, Notre Dame has had 16 players chosen for the McDonald's game since its inception in 2002, including eight who will appear on next year's roster — **Marina Mabrey** (2015), **Arike Ogunbowale** (2015), **Ali Patberg** (2015), **Brianna Turner** (2014), **Kathryn Westbeld** (2014) and **Lindsay Allen** (2013).

Previous McDonald's High School All-Americans who have played at Notre Dame include: **Courtney LaVere** (2002), **Crystal Erwin** (2003), **Lindsay Schrader** (2005), **Devereaux Peters** (2007), **Skylar Diggins** (2009), **Jewell Loyd** (2012), **Michaela Mabrey** (2012) and **Taya Reimer** (2013).

Notre Dame has had three future players earn the McDonald's High School All-America Game Most Valuable Player award — Diggins (2009), Turner (2014) and Marina Mabrey (2015) — second only to Tennessee's five MVPs. What's more, Notre Dame is the only program to produce McDonald's game MVPs in consecutive years, with Turner and Mabrey coping the honor the last two years.

During the Powerade Jam Fest and auxiliary events surrounding the McDonald's game, Diggins won the 3-Point Shootout in 2009 and Michaela Mabrey finished second in the same event in 2012, while LaVere teamed up with Notre Dame men's signee **Torin Francis** to win the 2002 skills competition.

Young also was a finalist for Morgan Wootten National Player of the Year award (presented by McDonald's).

The newest Notre Dame additions, who each scored more than 3,000 points at the high school level, are likely to be chosen as both Miss Basketball and the Gatorade High School Player of the Year in their states (Boley already earned both awards, while Young has garnered the Gatorade honor and the Miss Basketball vote is pending).

If she earns Indiana Miss Basketball accolades, Young will be the fourth such honoree to enroll at Notre Dame, and the second in as many years (along with Patberg in 2015, Diggins in 2009 and **Trena Keys** in 1982). Young capped her career by becoming Indiana's all-time high school scoring leader in either boys' or girls' basketball with 3,268 points, surpassing future Indiana University and NBA standout **Damon Bailey** (3,134 points), as well as eventual Tennessee and WNBA guard **Shanna Zolman** (3,085 points).



Notre Dame could have a distinct influence on the makeup of the 2016 U.S. Olympic Women's Basketball Team, as three former Fighting Irish All-America guards and current WNBA standouts are among 25 finalists for the official 12-player roster that will represent the United States at the Summer Olympics later this year in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil.

**Skylar Diggins** ('13), **Kayla McBride** ('14) and **Jewell Loyd** (-16) all remain in contention to become the first Notre Dame players to wear the Stars & Stripes at the Olympics since **Ruth Riley** ('01) struck gold with Team USA at the 2004 Athens Games.

Notre Dame is one of just two schools in the country to have three alums among the 25 U.S. Olympic Team finalists, who were chosen by the USA Basketball Women's National Team Player Selection Committee.

The USA Basketball Women's National Team held a training camp Feb. 21-23 at the University of Connecticut. **Loyd** and **McBride** were among the 16 athletes who took part in the minicamp, which was expected to be the final training camp before the 2016 U.S. Olympic Women's Basketball Team is selected (**Diggins** is completing rehabilitation from knee surgery last summer).

**Diggins** (Dallas Wings) and **McBride** (San Antonio Stars) are members of the 2014-16 USA Basketball Women's National Team player pool, having qualified for the group following their performances at a USA Basketball mini-camp Oct. 4-6, 2013, in Las Vegas. The pair competed in multiple USA Basketball training camps during the 2014 calendar year and were among the final players cut from the U.S. squad that competed (and ultimately won the gold medal) at the 2014 FIBA World Championship in Turkey.

Meanwhile, **Loyd** (Seattle Storm) made her initial appearance with the USA Women's National Team at another Las Vegas mini-camp in 2015. Her performance at that camp, and a sensational first year in Seattle that culminated with her selection as WNBA Rookie of the Year, led USA Basketball to add her to the Women's National Team player pool and emerge as an Olympic Team finalist.

The Notre Dame women's basketball program already is assured of at least one alumna competing in the 2016 Rio Olympics — **Natalie Achonwa** ('14) and Team Canada clinched an Olympic berth by winning the 2015 FIBA Americas Championship last September in Edmonton, Alberta. It will be Achonwa's second Olympic appearance — she was the second-youngest player in the women's basketball field at the 2012 London Games, helping Canada reach the quarterfinals for the first time since the 1984 Los Angeles Olympics.

## Mabrey Sisters Set Guinness World Record

- On Feb. 9 at Purcell Pavilion, Notre Dame sister tandem of senior guard **Michaela Mabrey** and freshman guard **Marina Mabrey** set a Guinness World Record for most free throws made by a female pair in one minute with two basketballs, sinking 21 charity shots in 60 seconds.
- The Mabreys topped the previous world record of 14 made free throws in one minute by the Norwegian duo of **Nanna Sand** and **Ingvild Skorpen**, who set their mark on Nov. 17, 2010.
- The Mabreys' world record challenge was devised by **Aaron Horvath**, the digital platform manager at Fighting Irish Media, and meticulously coordinated and documented by **Katie Mattie**, the social media manager for Fighting Irish Media.

## McGraw Named Finalist For Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame

- Notre Dame head coach (and 2016 ACC Coach of the Year) **Muffet McGraw** is among 14 finalists (and four women's basketball choices) for the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame Class of 2016, with the finalists announced Feb. 12 during NBA All-Star Weekend in Toronto. The Hall of Fame Class of 2016 unveiled April 4 during the NCAA Men's Final Four in Houston. McGraw previously was enshrined in the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame in June 2011 in Knoxville, Tennessee.
- With her team's 65-55 win on Jan. 3 at Pittsburgh, **McGraw** became the 10th N C A A Division I coach to register 800 career victories. McGraw has a 34-year record of 820-263 (.757), including a 732-222 (.767) record in 29 seasons with the Fighting Irish.
- McGraw is just the fifth NCAA Division I coach in either men's or women's basketball history to amass 800 wins, seven NCAA Final Four berths and five NCAA championship game appearances in his/her career. The other four — all of whom are enshrined in the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame — are Connecticut's **Geno Auriemma**, former Tennessee coach **Pat Summitt** and two men's coaches — Duke's current skipper **Mike Krzyzewski** and the late North Carolina coach **Dean Smith**.
- McGraw became the sixth-fastest Division I coach to reach the 800-win milestone, doing so in 1,063 career games to hit the mark quicker than several other notable coaches

including Rutgers' **C. Vivian Stringer** (1,064 games), recently-retired Georgia head coach **Andy Landers** (1,068 games)

- and North Carolina's **Sylvia Hatchell** (1,074 games), and nearly in lockstep with former Texas head coach **Jody Conradt** (1,062 games).
- Four of the five Division I coaches who reached 800 wins faster than McGraw are enshrined in the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame — **Auriemma** (928 games), **Summitt** (958 games), Stanford's **Tara VanDerveer** (997 games) and **Conradt**. The lone exception is Montana's **Robin Selvig** (1,055 games).

## Polling Station

- Notre Dame was ranked No. 2 in the final 2015-16 Associated Press poll, its 104th consecutive week in the top 10 of the media balloting (98 of those in the top five), dating back to the middle of the 2010-11 season and marking 174 consecutive weeks in the AP poll.
- The Fighting Irish continue to extend the program record for consecutive poll appearances that started with the AP preseason poll in 2007-08 (the old record was 59 consecutive weeks from 1998-2001), while Notre Dame is one of four teams in the nation with an active streak of at least 170 consecutive AP poll appearances.
- Every current Notre Dame player has competed for a top-10 Fighting Irish squad throughout her career (78 consecutive weeks for the current senior class), spending the vast majority (72) of those appearances in the AP Top 5 (and never lower than seventh).
- This represented the fifth consecutive year the Fighting Irish were ranked No. 2 in the final AP poll.
- Notre Dame has been ranked in the

- AP poll for 313 weeks during the program's 39-year history, with every one of those appearances coming in the **Muffet McGraw** era (since 1987-88). McGraw is seventh among active NCAA Division I head coaches for weeks in the AP poll, and 14th all-time.
- The Fighting Irish are No. 3 in the latest WBCA/USA Today coaches' poll after appearing in the preseason coaches' balloting for the seventh consecutive year.
  - Notre Dame has been ranked in the coaches' poll for 177 of the past 178 weeks (and 141 in a row), falling just outside the Top 25 in the final poll of the 2008-09 season. Nevertheless, the Fighting Irish have appeared in the coaches' poll for a total of 309 weeks during their history (all coming in McGraw's tenure).
  - This marks the eighth consecutive season Notre Dame has been ranked in the top 10 of the WBCA/USA Today poll, as well as 14 of the past 18 campaigns (1998-99 to present).

## The Benefits Of Leadership

Notre Dame is in the unique position of essentially having three head coaches on its bench, with Fighting Irish skipper **Muffet McGraw** enjoying the expertise of two former head coaches on her staff — associate head coach **Carol Owens**

(who guided her alma mater Northern Illinois from 2005-10) and associate coach **Beth Cunningham** (who piloted VCU from 2003-12).

Collectively, the Notre Dame staff has 48 seasons of head coaching experience, ranking third among Division I schools behind only Villanova (53) and Rutgers (49).

hold their opponents below 60 points in a game, including an active 122-game winning streak in such games.

- The last time the Fighting Irish lost when allowing fewer than 60 points in a game was March 8, 2010, when they dropped a 59-44 decision at No. 1 Connecticut in the BIG EAST Conference tournament semifinals at the XL Center in Hartford, Connecticut.

## ...But Sometimes You Have To Score If You Want To Win

- During the past 21 seasons (since 1995-96), the Fighting Irish are 249-7 (.973) when they score at least 80 points in a game.
- In that time, the only blemishes on that record are three overtime losses to Texas A&M (88-84) and Michigan State (87-83) in 1995 and UCLA (86-83 in double OT) in 2010, as well as a 106-81 loss to Connecticut in 1998, an 81-80 loss to DePaul in 2008, a 94-81 setback at Baylor in 2011 and a 91-81 defeat at Connecticut in 2015.
- In the past seven years (2009-10 to present), Notre Dame is 125-3 (.977) when topping the 80-point mark, including wins in 92 of its last 93 such games (the lone setback came earlier this season, a 91-81 loss at top-ranked UConn on Dec. 5, 2015, in the Jimmy V Classic).

## Next Game: NCAA Regional Final

With a victory over Stanford, Notre Dame would advance to a regional final in the NCAA Championship, where it would meet either third-seeded (and No. 12/13) Kentucky or seventh-seeded Washington at 1 p.m. (ET) Sunday at Rupp Arena in Oklahoma City. The game will be televised on ESPN and WatchESPN.

Notre Dame is 1-1 all-time against Kentucky, most recently defeating the Wildcats, 92-83 on Dec. 18, 2011, at Purcell Pavilion.

The Fighting Irish are 2-1 all-time against Washington, following a 72-58 win over the Huskies on Dec. 11, 2004, at Purcell Pavilion.

Earlier this year, the Notre Dame women's basketball program helped spearhead a grassroots effort entitled "Fighting For Flint" to help the citizens of Flint, Michigan, and Genessee County, who currently are enduring a water shortage crisis due to contamination in the water supply.

Prior to Notre Dame's Jan. 24 game against Virginia Tech at Purcell Pavilion, Fighting Irish head coach **Muffet McGraw** and Notre Dame senior associate athletics director/women's basketball administrator **Jill Bodensteiner** presented Virginia Tech head coach **Dennis Wolff** with a \$2,000 donation for the Flint Water Project, an effort spearheaded by a volunteer group of Virginia Tech engineering faculty and students, who are teaming up to help find a solution to the Flint water crisis.

Notre Dame fans also participated in "Fighting For Flint," either by making their own monetary donations at the Jan. 24 game against Virginia Tech or by bringing donations of money or bottled water to the Notre Dame women's basketball office during the ensuing three weeks (Jan. 24-Feb. 16).

Area schools, as well as Team Notre Dame corporate partner Coca-Cola and Notre Dame Student Government, added to the Fighting For Flint initiative, which ultimately raised \$5,165.20 in monetary contributions, as well as approximately 300 cases of water.

All donations (financial and water) were delivered to Catholic Charities of Shiawasee and Genessee Counties, as well as the Food Bank of Eastern Michigan, which helped distribute these donations to the citizens of Flint and the surrounding area.

## Half And Half

- During the past 16 seasons, Notre Dame has been nearly unbeatable when it has the lead at halftime.
- The Fighting Irish are 377-19 (.952) since the start of the 2000-01 campaign when they go into the dressing room with the lead, including wins in 305 of their last 318 such contests (.959) and an active 139-game winning streak.
- In the past seven seasons (2009-10 to present), Notre Dame is 214-2 (.991) when leading at the half.
- The only losses in that time came on April 5, 2011, in the NCAA national championship game at Consco (now Bankers Life) Fieldhouse in Indianapolis (Notre Dame led Texas A&M, 35-33 at intermission before falling 76-70), and Feb. 12, 2012, against West Virginia (Fighting Irish led 33-30 at the break before the visiting Mountaineers rallied to win in the closing seconds, 65-63).

## The Best Offense Is A Good Defense...

Mabrey's 12 steals tied for the second-most by a player in completing a triple-double, exceeded only by Old Dominion's Ticha Penicheiro vs. Saint Francis (Pa.) in the first round of the NCAA Championship on March 13, 1998 ... Mabrey is the first Fighting Irish player with double-digit assists in a game since Feb. 24, 2013, when Skylar Diggins had 10 assists at DePaul as part of her second career triple-double (the most recent one before Mabrey) ... Notre Dame is 12-4 all-time against Louisville and has won the past nine series games ... the Fighting Irish are 5-1 all-time when playing at Louisville and won their last four road games in the series (the home team has won just five of the 12 on-campus games in the series, four of those by the Fighting Irish at Purcell Pavilion) ... more than half (9) of the 16 series games have been decided by 15 points or fewer, with this marking the closest margin between Notre Dame and Louisville since Feb. 11, 2009, when the Cardinals edged the Fighting Irish, 71-66 at Purcell Pavilion ... Notre Dame has won 29 consecutive games in the month of February and moves to 124-28 (.816) in February games since 1995-96, as well as a 172-43 (.800) record in the 29-year Muffet McGraw era ... Cable logged her third double-double of the season (fourth career) and grabbed a season-high 12 rebounds, one off her career best on Jan. 30, 2014, vs. Virginia Tech at Purcell Pavilion ... Notre Dame has won three of its last four second-round NCAA games by exactly 17 points ... the Fighting Irish are 16-2 (.889) all-time at home in the NCAA Championship ... Notre Dame is 24-0 all-time in the NCAA Championship when it scores at least 80 points in a tournament game ... the Fighting Irish move to 7-4 all-time against Indiana (4-3 at Purcell Pavilion), with this marking not only the largest margin of victory by either team in the series, but just the second double-digit win in the 11-game series (Notre Dame posted a 74-61 victory on Nov. 23, 2005, at Assembly Hall in Bloomington) ... the Fighting Irish have won 22 consecutive games against in-state opponents ... Notre Dame has won 26 of its last 32 games against Big Ten Conference schools and 15 in a row ... the Fighting Irish are 7-0 this season when playing on one day's rest or less ... Notre Dame's 34 made field goals tied for the fourth-most by the Fighting Irish in an NCAA tournament game and most since March 22, 2014, when they made a program-record 38 baskets in an NCAA first-round win over Robert Morris in Toledo, Ohio ... Allen had a season-high 22 points, two more than her total against another Big Ten opponent, No. 10/12 Ohio State on Dec. 2 at Purcell Pavilion ... Allen has scored at least 20 points in three of her last six NCAA postseason games (28 vs. Stanford, 23 vs. Baylor, both at the 2015 Oklahoma City Regional last year) ... Allen's career-high five steals were one more than her previous best set on five occasions (most recently on Jan. 18 against No. 18/15 Tennessee) ... Turner picked up her fourth double-double of the season and ties for fifth on Notre Dame's single-season chart with 85 blocks (Ruth Riley had 85 blocks in 1999-2000) ... Notre Dame is the only NCAA Division I school to send both of its basketball teams to the NCAA Championship Sweet 16, as well as have its football team compete in a New Year's Six bowl game ... Notre Dame also is one of two schools to send both basketball teams to this year's Sweet 16 — the other is a fellow ACC member, Syracuse.

# Muffet McGraw

**Karen and Kevin Keyes Family Head Women's Basketball Coach**  
**29th season at ND (732-222, .767) • 34th season overall (820-263, .757)**

***"If we searched for an entire year, I don't think we would find anyone better suited for our program."***

With those words, former Notre Dame director of athletics **Gene Corrigan** announced the hiring of **Muffet McGraw** as the third head coach of the Fighting Irish women's basketball program on May 18, 1987. Corrigan may not have realized it at the time, but he also ushered in an era of unparalleled success in women's basketball at Notre Dame, brought to life on the shoulders of a 5-foot-6 dynamo who accepts nothing less than the very best from herself, her players and her program.

Ask anyone familiar with women's basketball about Muffet McGraw and her Notre Dame program and inevitably, you'll hear the same two words — consistency and excellence. And it's no wonder, when you consider what McGraw and the Fighting Irish have achieved in the past 29 seasons:

- The 2001 national championship, defeating Purdue in the title game, 68-66. McGraw is one of seven active Division I coaches to guide her team to an NCAA title.
- Five trips to the NCAA Division I national championship game, including four of the past five NCAA title contests (2011, 2012, 2014 and 2015). McGraw is one of just two active Division I coaches (and four all-time) with at least five appearances in the NCAA national championship game — the other three Division I coaches (Tennessee's Pat Summitt, UConn's Geno Auriemma and Louisiana Tech's Leon Barmore) all are enshrined in the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.
- Seven trips to the NCAA Women's Final Four (1997, 2001, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015). McGraw is one of three active Division I coaches (and five all-time) to lead her team to seven Women's Final Four appearances.
- One of five coaches (men's or women's basketball) in NCAA Division I history with 800 wins, seven Final Fours and five NCAA title games — others are Summitt, Auriemma, Duke men's coach Mike Krzyzewski and the late North Carolina men's coach Dean Smith.
- 14 NCAA Sweet 16 trips, all in the past 20 seasons (1997-2016). The Fighting Irish are one of five teams in the nation to make that claim (and five to do so in the past seven years).
- Three-time consensus National Coach of the Year, sweeping the four major coaching honors (Associated Press, WBCA, Naismith Award and USBWA) in 2001, 2013 and 2014. McGraw is the only NCAA Division I coach to sweep the "Big Four" awards three times in her career.
- Seven-time conference Coach of the Year, most recently collecting her second ACC Coach of the Year trophy in 2016. McGraw has earned her seven coaching honors in five different conferences during her career (the past six awards while at Notre Dame), having also garnered accolades in the East Coast (1983 - at Lehigh), North Star (1988), Midwestern Collegiate/Horizon League (1991), BIG EAST (2001, 2013) and Atlantic Coast (2014, 2016) conferences.
- Ranks 10th all-time among NCAA Division I coaches (seventh among active coaches) with 820 career wins (through March 21).
- Ranks 14th all-time among Division I coaches (12th among active coaches) with a .757 career winning percentage (through March 21).
- Ranks eighth all-time among NCAA Division I coaches (tied for fifth among active coaches) with 28 20-win seasons, including 26 of her first 29 seasons at Notre Dame

with 20-or-more victories, as well as 22 in the past 23 years (1993-2016). The Fighting Irish also have posted 13 25-win seasons, eight 30-win campaigns and four 35-win seasons in the past 19 years (1997-2016) under McGraw's tutelage.

- Made 23 NCAA tournament appearances, including a current string of 21 consecutive NCAA tournament berths (the fourth-longest active run of consecutive appearances and seventh-longest streak at any time in NCAA tournament history). During this current streak (1996-2016), Notre Dame has won at least one NCAA postseason game 19 times.
- Won 11 conference regular-season titles, including the past five in a row outright in both the BIG EAST (2012, 2013) and ACC (2014, 2015, 2016). The Fighting Irish also have run the table three times in that span, going 16-0 in both the BIG EAST (2013) and ACC (2014, 2016), the latter being the first 16-0 records by an ACC school since 2002-03. What's more, under McGraw's guidance, Notre Dame has placed among the top four in the final conference standings 26 times in her first 29 seasons at the Fighting Irish helm.
- Earned nine conference tournament championships, including each of the past four seasons as members of the BIG EAST (2013) and ACC (2014, 2015, 2016).
- Collected 135 wins over ranked opponents, including 121 in the past 18 seasons (1998-99 through 2015-16). In addition, 53 of those wins have come against top-10 opponents, including 18 against top-five teams and four against No. 1-ranked squads.
- Made 313 appearances in the Associated Press Top 25 poll, including an active school-record streak of 174 consecutive weeks in the AP poll. McGraw is seventh among active Division I coaches and 14th all-time in AP poll appearances (through the final 2015-16 poll). Notre Dame also has spent 203 weeks all-time ranked among the top 10 teams in the nation, including 116 since 2010-11 (second-most this decade).
- Guided Notre Dame to the No. 1 ranking in the WBCA/USA Today coaches' poll on Nov. 25 and Dec. 2, 2014, the first time the Fighting Irish were in the top spot since the final poll of Notre Dame's 2001 NCAA national championship season. Notre Dame also became the first ACC team to earn the No. 1 ranking since March 12, 2007.
- 20 consecutive top-20 recruiting classes, dating back to the incoming class of 1997 (and including the incoming class of 2016, ranked as high as No. 3 in the nation). Notre Dame is one of just three programs in the nation that owns an active streak of that length.
- Ranks second on the all-time wins list (regardless of sport) in the 129-year history of Fighting Irish athletics, trailing only the late **Michael DeCicco** (799-90 combined record with men's/women's fencing from 1962-95).
- A perfect 100-percent NCAA Graduation Success Rate (GSR) score in seven of the past eight years (2007-15). In that time, Notre Dame is one of four programs in the country to record a perfect GSR and go on to play for the national title later that same season (something the Fighting Irish did in 2010-11, 2011-12, 2013-14 and 2014-15).

Add it all up and you have the framework for a Hall of Fame career. And, on June 11, 2011, that's exactly what McGraw became, as she officially was the first Notre Dame representative to be inducted into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame, an accomplishment immortalized with a banner hanging high above the west stands in Purcell Pavilion.

# Head Coach Muffet McGraw

McGraw could have an even greater career milestone on the horizon, as she is one of 14 finalists for the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame Class of 2016. The members of this year's class will be announced at the NCAA Men's Final Four on April 4 in Houston.

Still, with all of those accomplishments in hand, McGraw has shown no signs of slowing down any time soon. In July 2012, the veteran head coach signed a landmark 10-year contract extension (believed to be among the longest contract agreements in NCAA women's basketball history) that will keep her patrolling the Fighting Irish sidelines through the 2021-22 campaign.

"For more than 25 years, Muffet has led our women's basketball program and represented this University with distinction," said **Rev. John I. Jenkins, C.S.C.**, Notre Dame's president. "Her teams have excelled on the court and in the classroom, and I am absolutely delighted that she will continue to lead the Irish for many more years."

"We are thrilled to be able to enter into a decade-long agreement with Muffet, who is not only the face of Notre Dame women's basketball, but increasingly, the face of women's basketball, given all that she's accomplished," said University vice president and director of athletics **Jack Swarbrick**. "She's taken this program to a place where it's annually in the conversation for the national championship, which is the model all coaches want to follow. She's also playing an important role in the game nationally, and her peers recognize those contributions, as well as the quality of her program here at Notre Dame. Off the court, she has created a program that has a lasting community identification and a special connection between the University and the city of South Bend, which is one of those unique points of intersection that universities have to be careful to build and maintain, and she's done that for us in a really remarkable way."

McGraw's post at Notre Dame was further enhanced on Feb. 16, 2015, when one of her former players, point guard **Karen (Robinson) Keyes** ('91) and her husband, **Kevin**, made a \$5 million gift to their alma mater to endow its head women's basketball coaching position, now known as the Karen and Kevin Keyes Family Head Women's Basketball Coach. It's also believed to be the largest endowment gift of its kind in NCAA women's basketball history, as well as the first endowed coaching position of any sort in Notre Dame athletics history.

"Muffet is one of the most important influences in our lives," Karen Keyes said. "We are proud to honor her, recognize her dedication to the University and continue to admire all of the successful women she has coached and developed over her entire career."

Under McGraw's guidance, the past 21 seasons (1995-96 to the present) have been the most successful in Notre Dame's history, reflecting the program's remarkable BIG EAST Conference era and transition to its current home, the Atlantic Coast Conference. During that time, the Fighting Irish have compiled an impressive 573-142 (.801) record, including a sparkling 279-65 (.811) regular-season mark in conference play, finishing their 18-year BIG EAST tenure with the second-best winning percentage (232-64, .784) in that league's history.

During this 21-year span, Notre Dame has averaged more than 27 victories per year, with four 35-win seasons, eight 30-win campaigns and 13 25-win seasons to its credit. What's more, the Fighting Irish have one NCAA national championship (2001), five NCAA title game appearances (2001, 2011, 2012, 2014, 2015), seven NCAA Women's Final Four berths (1997, 2001, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015) and 14 Sweet 16 showings since the 1995-96 season,

which began the program's current run of 21 consecutive NCAA Championship appearances.

Success for McGraw also has meant coaching great players. During her illustrious career, the Notre Dame skipper has coached 18 All-Americans, including 2001 consensus National Player of the Year **Ruth Riley**, 2015 espnW National Player of the Year **Jewell Loyd** and four-time All-American (and two-time consensus first-team All-America choice) **Skylar Diggins**. McGraw also has worked with 15 players who have been selected for USA or Canada Basketball National Teams, with those players going on to win a total of 32 medals, including 18 golds.

In addition, McGraw has coached 30 players who have earned all-conference recognition a total of 63 times, including 24 first-team picks who have been chosen a total of 40 times, and has helped shape several other national award winners, namely a two-time Nancy Lieberman Award recipient (Diggins), two Frances Pomeroy Naismith award honorees (**Niele Ivey** in 2001, **Megan Duffy** in 2006) and two United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) National Freshman of the Year selections (**Jacqueline Batteast** in 2002 and Loyd in 2013).

Another sign of McGraw's success has been her ability to prepare her players for the next level. No less than 28 Notre Dame cagers have gone on to play professionally (domestically or overseas), including 15 who either have been drafted or signed as free agents with WNBA teams. The past 15 seasons (2001-15) have seen the greatest influx of Fighting Irish talent into the WNBA, with 13 Notre Dame players having been selected in the league's annual draft during that time, including the school's first four WNBA lottery picks (**Deveaux Peters** in 2012 to Minnesota; Diggins in 2013 to Tulsa/now Dallas; **Kayla McBride** in 2014 to San Antonio, all with the No. 3 overall choice, before Loyd became the program's first-ever No. 1 WNBA Draft pick in 2015 by Seattle), making the Fighting Irish the only program in the 19-year history of the WNBA Draft to produce lottery (top-four) selections in four consecutive seasons.

McGraw's pupils also have thrived in the WNBA, with four winning a combined total of six league titles during their professional careers. **Coquese Washington** ('92) was the first to hoist the WNBA hardware with the Houston Comets in 2000, followed three years later by Riley with the Detroit Shock (with the Macy, Indiana, native earning Finals MVP honors). Riley and Batteast teamed up to help Detroit to its second crown in 2006, before Peters became the latest Fighting Irish alum to earn WNBA championship gold, helping Minnesota to the title in 2013 and 2015.

What's more, Diggins, McBride and Riley all have earned WNBA All-Star honors (Diggins twice as a starter, Riley once), with Diggins also garnering first-team all-WNBA recognition in 2014. Diggins, McBride, Loyd and **Natalie Achonwa** also have collected WNBA All-Rookie Team accolades in recent years, highlighted by Loyd's selection as the 2015 WNBA Rookie of the Year.

A native of West Chester, Pennsylvania, McGraw earned her bachelor's degree in sociology from Saint Joseph's University (Pa.) in 1977.

McGraw and her husband, **Matt**, celebrated their 38th wedding anniversary in 2015 and make their home in Granger, Indiana. They are the proud parents of 25-year-old son **Murphy**, a 2012 Indiana University graduate.
