STANFORD-ARIZONA STATE SERIES HISTORY

All-Time Series: Arizona State 81-80

2005 Results: Series – Arizona State 3-0 (at Arizona State, April 15-17) Arizona State 9-2, Arizona State 6-5, Arizona State 10-9

Last Meeting at Stanford: Series – Stanford 2-1 (May 28-30, 2004) Stanford 5-0, Stanford 10-3, Arizona State 15-5

Series Notes: Arizona State has won the last four meetings between the teams, including a sweep in Tempe last season, after the Cardinal had been victorious in its four previous contests versus the Sun Devils • Stanford had also won four consecutive series between the teams from 2001-04 prior to being swept by the Sun Devils last season

The Matchup: Arizona State is tied for third-place in the Pac-10 and will be looking to stay in the Pac-10 race during the Stanford series after the Sun Devils dropped to two full games behind league-leader Oregon State by losing two-of-three at UCLA last Friday-Sunday, while the Beavers swept a series at California • The Sun Devils bring a strong offensive game to the table with an offensive that ranks second in the Pac-10 with a .417 batting average but have struggled with a pitching staff (4.79 ERA) and defense (.962) that both rank eighth in the Pac-10 • Stanford is looking to get out of the conference cellar after losing each of its four Pac-10 series in the first half of league play • The Cardinal has put up decent pitching numbers (4.60 ERA) to rank fifth in the league but is seventh in fielding (.964) and eighth in hitting (.262)

STANFORD SNAPSHOT

• **THREE-GAME LOSING STREAK** – After winning the first game of its series at Arizona last Friday, Stanford has dropped three in a row by losing the final two contests in the Arizona series and a non-conference game to Santa Clara on Tuesday • Stanford has lost four in a row on two separate occasions this year

• **FIVE-SERIES LOSING STREAK** – Stanford's current five-series losing streak (at USC, Washington State, USC, at Oregon State, at Arizona) is its longest since the Cardinal dropped seven in a row in its final six series of 1993 (at UCLA, Arizona, at Arizona State, at California, UNLV, UCLA), as well as its first series in 1994 (Cal State Fullerton)

• **A QUICK LOOK AT THE PAC** – Stanford is in an unfamiliar spot in the Pac-10 race in last place with its 3-9 conference mark after falling in six of its last seven league games • Oregon State (9-3) is in sole possession of first-place, followed by USC (9-6), Arizona State (7-5), UCLA (7-5), Washington (6-6), Washington State (5-7), Arizona (5-7), California (6-9) and Stanford (3-9)

• **BUSY SECOND HALF** – Rescheduled games caused by earlier weather-related postponed contests and a normally more compacted second half of the schedule have combined to contribute to Stanford having its final 28 games scheduled over the last 42 days of its regular season after playing its first 28 contests in the first 72 days

• **MARQUESS ONE WIN FROM 13TH ON ALL-TIME LIST** – Mark Marquess has moved to within one win of 13th on the all-time win list with his all-time record of 1241-608-5 (.671) in his 30th season as Stanford's head coach

• **TV GAMES ON THE HORIZON** – Stanford has three games on three different television entities, beginning with its 2006 television debut on CSTV in the opener of a three-game home series versus Arizona State this Friday, April 28 (6 pm, PT) • The Cardinal is also scheduled to be televised on Comcast Sports Net and FOX Sports Net in back-to-back contests against California at Sunken Diamond the following Friday and Saturday, May 5 and 6 (6 pm, PT; 4 pm, PT) • All three games will be broadcast live with the Fox Sports Net contest being shown live locally on FOX Sports Network Bay Area

- **SOGGY SEASON** – Stanford has made 11 changes to its schedule this season due to soggy weather but is still on track to get 55 regular season contests in with a possible makeup date at Santa Clara to get to the maximum number of 56 games in a season
- **COMEBACK KIDS** – Stanford has come from behind in 11 of its 17 wins, including each of its last five victories
- **OUT OF THE POLLS** – Stanford has not been ranked in any of the five major polls (*Baseball America*, *Collegiate Baseball*, *NCBWA*, *Rosenblatt Report*, *USA Today*) for the last six weeks
- **HOT HITTERS** – Chris Minaker has a current five-game hit streak (.455, 10-22, 4 2B, 5 RBI) with four multiple-hit contests during the stretch • Ryan Seawell and Jason Castro both had career-high five-game hit streaks before they were snapped versus Santa Clara on April 25 • Seawell hit .455 (10-22) with two doubles, three RBI and two stolen bases during his streak, while Castro batted .471 (8-17) with a double, stolen base and four RBI • Michael Taylor had also hit safely in nine of his last 10 contests before going hitless against Santa Clara
- **DEFENSIVE WOES** – Stanford is fielding at a clip of just .964 after posting a .971 or better mark in each of the past six years to account for six of the top eight fielding percentages in school history • The Cardinal has made at least one error in seven straight games and 12 of the last 13
- **SPREADING OUT THE WINS** – A total of 10 different Stanford pitchers have combined for the team's 17 wins with Greg Reynolds (3-3) the only one recording more than two
- **STURDY SENIORS** – Stanford's four seniors have started all but one game possible between them this season • Position players Chris Lewis and Chris Minaker have each started all 35 games with Minaker playing every inning at shortstop, while John Hester has started 34 of 35 behind the plate • Pitcher Matt Manship has made all 11 of his scheduled starts on the mound
- **ROOKIE CLASS** – Stanford has also received significant contributions from its freshman class this season • Cord Phelps (23), Joey August (22) and Jason Castro (19) have all started more than half of the team's games, while Brent Milleville (14), Austin Yount (9), J.J. Jelmini (2) and Sean Ratliff (1) have also made starts as position players • Jeremy Bleich has a team-high seven saves and had been the team's closer for most of the season before being inserted into the starting rotation each of the last two weeks at Oregon State (4/14) and Arizona (4/21) • Max Fearnow, Ratliff and Yount have also seen action on the hill
- **LEAGUE RANKINGS** – Stanford ranks fifth in the Pac-10 in pitching (4.60 ERA), seventh in fielding (.964) and eighth in hitting (.262)
- **IT'S SIMPLE ... HIT THE LONG BALL AND WIN** – Stanford is 6-0 in games in which the Cardinal has two or more home runs
- **STANFORD BASEBALL HISTORY** – Stanford has captured two College World Series titles (1987, 1988) and advanced to the CWS 15 times, including 13 appearances in Omaha in the past 24 seasons and a school record five in a row from 1999-2003 when the Cardinal finished as runners-up three times (2000, 2001, 2003) • The Cardinal has also won five NCAA Super Regionals, 13 NCAA Regionals and 20 Pac-10 titles • Stanford Baseball is in its 113th year of existence with an all-time record of 2474-1541-32 (.615)
- **STANFORD BASEBALL IN THE BIGS** – Stanford has sent 74 players on to play Major League Baseball, including six (Joe Borchard – Seattle Mariners • Eric Bruntlett – Houston Astros • Mike Gosling, Cincinnati Reds • Jeremy Guthrie – Cleveland Indians • Rick Helling – Milwaukee Brewers • Mike Mussina – New York Yankees) that have played in The Show in 2006

STANFORD HEAD COACH MARK MARQUESS

One of the nation's premier collegiate coaches and the winningest coach in Stanford Baseball history, Mark Marquess is in his 30th season at the helm of the Cardinal and his 38th associated with the program in 2006. Marquess has won more games than any coach in any sport ever at Stanford with the amazing numbers he has posted during his tenure on The Farm. Marquess has a 1241-607-5 (.671) all-time record in 1853 career games, as well as equally impressive marks in postseason (109-50, .686) and Pac-10 (493-323, .604) action. He is currently ranked seventh among all active NCAA Division I coaches in victories and 14th on the all-time among Division I coaches list, moving into the spot earlier this season with Stanford's win over Nevada on February 21, 2006. He is now just one victory shy of the No. 13 position held by Richard Jones, who was the head coach at Illinois for 38 seasons before retiring after the 2005 campaign. Marquess became the 23rd coach in the history of NCAA Division I baseball to reach the 1000-win mark with a victory over Florida State on February 9, 2001. Just over two years later, he picked up win No. 1100 versus Nevada on February 17, 2003. He became only the 16th NCAA Division I head baseball coach to win 1200 collegiate games just over another two years after that when the Cardinal defeated California at Sunken Diamond on March 5, 2005. He also won his 100th career postseason game in Stanford's NCAA Super Regional clinching victory over Long Beach State (June 7, 2003). The 1969 Stanford graduate has led the Cardinal to two CWS titles and three runner-up showings in five CWS championship appearances, as well as 13 College World Series trips, five NCAA Super Regional titles, 13 NCAA Regional championships and 12 Pac-10 crowns (includes Southern Division and shared titles). Stanford's two CWS crowns under Marquess came in back-to-back fashion in 1987 and 1988 as the Cardinal is just one of four teams to have ever won back-to-back Division I College World Series titles. The three runner-up showings have all come this decade with the Cardinal taking second in Omaha in 2000, '01, and '03. Maybe even more amazing, all 13 teams that Marquess has taken to the College World Series have won at least one game. Stanford has qualified for the NCAA Championships 23

times in the first 29 years under Marquess with a current school record run of 12 straight appearances in postseason play. He has been named NCAA Coach of the Year three times and has received Pac-10 or Pac-10 Southern Division Coach of the Year honors on nine occasions, most recently with his Pac-10 selection in 2003. The Cardinal has had 28 winning campaigns in the first 29 seasons under his leadership, while finishing either first or second in the prestigious Pacific-10 (formerly Pac-10 Southern Division) 22 times in the last 25 years. Stanford has had 127 players drafted by professional baseball in the past 21 seasons, including 17 in the last 19 years that were drafted either in the first round or as a Compensation A pick. A member of the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame, Marquess was the head coach of the 1988 United States Olympic baseball team that captured the gold medal. He was also an accomplished football and baseball standout on The Farm, and is a member of the Stanford Athletic Hall of Fame. He is one of only nine people to have ever both played and coached in the College World Series. Marquess was the starting first baseman and a First Team All-American on Stanford's 1967 CWS squad and played four seasons of minor league baseball with the Chicago White Sox organization.
