Tournament Talk

A team blessed with excellent team chemistry, quality depth, and overall excellent talent has added up to another winning Stanford basketball team in 2001-02 ... Although Stanford lost four seniors to graduation in 2002, the Cardinal of 2001-02 has emerged as a talented, well-coached team with an overall record of 19-9 ... Stanford's participation in the 2002 NCAA Tournament is the school's eighth straight, and eleventh overall ... The Cardinal earned its first trip to the NCAA's in 1942, and Stanford won the national championship that year with a 53-48 victory over Dartmouth on March 28, 1942 in Kansas City, Mo ... **Howie Dallmar** scored 15 points in the championship game to earn tournament MVP honors ... The game wasn't even broadcast back to the San Francisco Bay Area ... After expenses, Stanford's share of the NCAA pot was \$93.75 ... It would then be 47 years before Stanford's next appearance in the NCAA Tournament in 1989 ... Times have changed since then ... The Cardinal has been to the NCAA Tournament a school record eight straight times, including a Final Four appearance during the 1997-98 season ... Only eleven Stanford players in school history have ever played on four Cardinal NCAA Tournament teams ... The list includes a member of this year's team, senior **Tony Giovacchini (1998-99, 1999-00, 2000-01, 2001-02)** ... The other ten players are **Jarron Collins (1997-98, 1998-99, 1999-00, 2000-01)**, **Arthur Lee (1995-96, 1996-97, 1997-98, 1998-99)**, **Mark Madsen (1996-97, 1997-98, 1998-99, 1999-00)**, **Ryan Mendez (1996-97, 1997-98, 1999-00, 2000-01)**, **David Moseley (1996-97, 1997-98, 1998-99, 1999-00)**, **Peter Sauer (1995-96, 1996-97, 1997-98, 1998-99)**, **Mark Seaton (1995-96, 1996-97, 1997-98, 1998-99)**, **Kamba Tshionyi (1994-95, 1995-96, 1996-97, 1997-98)**, **Kris Weems (1995-96, 1996-97, 1997-98, 1998-99)** and **Tim Young (1994-95, 1996-97, 1997-98, 1998-99)**.

Did You Know ...

*** Stanford is 16-9 in NCAA Tournament play.

*** If Stanford wins its opening round game of the 2002 NCAA Tournament, the Cardinal will have won its opening game for an eighth straight year.

*** All-America candidate **Casey Jacobsen** is averaging 35.3 minutes per game ... That is the highest average since **Adam Keefe** averaged 37.2 mpg during the 1991-92 season ... **Jacobsen** is averaging 38.2 mpg in the last 13 games.

*** With at least one game in the NCAA Tournament, All-America candidate **Casey Jacobsen** could chalk up at least 1,704 career points by year's end, which would put him only ten points short of **Brevin Knight (1993-97)** who chalked up 1,714 career points and is in third place all-time at Stanford ... **Jacobsen** currently has 1,682 points, fourth all-time at Stanford.

*** All-America candidate **Curtis Borchardt** has collected 15 double-doubles this year ... **Adam Keefe's** record-breaking season (15 school records set in 1991-92) included 20 double-doubles.

Stanford Saga

At 19-9, Stanford has chalked up its ninth straight winning season, and is only one win short of its eighth straight 20-win campaign ... Stanford finished in a four-way tie for second place in the Pac-10 with Arizona, California and USC ... The Cardinal has finished no worse than second place in the last five years.

Coaches Corner

Mike Montgomery is in his 16th season at Stanford with a record of 338-155 ... In 15-plus seasons at Stanford, **Montgomery** has directed the Cardinal to 13 post-season appearances (10 NCAA, 4 NIT) ... **Montgomery's** overall record (15+ seasons at Stanford, 8 seasons at Montana) is 492-231 ... **Montgomery** is 13-9 in NCAA Tournament play ... **Montgomery** was just named an assistant coach of USA Basketball's 2002 World Championship Team that will compete in the 2002 FIBA World Basketball Championship for Men (Aug. 29-Sept. 8, 2002) in Indianapolis ... **Montgomery** is one of 20 finalists for Naismith College Basketball Coach of the Year ... The winning coach will be honored on April 5 in Atlanta.

Neutral Notes

Stanford has been strong on a neutral court in recent years ... In the last four-plus seasons, Stanford has chalked up a 26-7 on neutral territory ... This year, the Cardinal is 2-3.

Maples Madness

Since the 1994-95 season, Stanford is 96-14 (.873) (58-13 vs Pac-10 schools, 38-1 vs non-league opponents) ... Stanford won its ten home games this year by an average of 22.5 points per game (+225 points) ... That included Stanford's 105-60 victory over Washington (1/19/02), the largest margin of victory over the Huskies, and fourth best against a conference foe.

Road Review

Stanford, since the 1997-98 season, has chalked up a 47-8 record (55 games, +644 points) on the road ... The Cardinal is 7-3 on the road this year ... Last year, Stanford was the first team to go undefeated on the road in league play (9-0 in 2000-01) since Oregon State turned the feat during the 1980-81 season.

Team Talk

Stanford is on a record pace to break the school record for season blocks ... After 28 games, the Cardinal has averaged 4.36 blocks per game, compared to a season-average of 3.2 last year ... Seventy-eight of those 122 team blocks this year belong to **Curtis Borchardt**, who is averaging 2.9 blocks per game, tops in the Pac-10 ... **Borchardt's** 78 blocks are a single season school record ... **Borchardt** tallied 19 blocks in 20 games played last year ... The school record for average blocks per game is held by **Tim Young** at 1.7 per game (1996-97 season) ... **Borchardt** has had at least three blocks in 14 games this year.

Pac-10 Potpourri

Curtis Borchardt leads the Pac-10 in rebounding at 11.4 rpg ... Since the 1989-90 season, three Stanford players have won the conference rebounding title five times ...

Casey Jacobsen and **Borchardt** are the highest 1-2 scoring punch in the Pac-10 ...

Jacobsen and **Borchardt** have combined to average 39.0 ppg ... **Jacobsen** is #1 in the Pac-10 in scoring (22.0 ppg) ... **Jacobsen** is trying to become Stanford's first conference scoring champion since the 1983-84 season when **Keith Jones** averaged 20.0 ppg ... Since the 1927-28 season, only three Stanford players (**Hank Luisetti** in 1936, 1937, 1938, **Ed Tucker** in 1952 and **Russ Lawler** (1954) have won the conference scoring title ...

Borchardt leads the Pac-10 in blocked shots with 78 ... No Stanford player has ever won the conference title in blocked shots.

Record Review

Three school records have been broken or tied thus far in the 2001-02 season ... All-America candidate **Curtis Borchardt** has recorded 78 blocks, easily breaking the old mark of 50 set by **Tim Young** during the 1996-97 season ... **Borchardt** collected six blocks against Purdue (11/24/01) which tied his record against Cal State Bakersfield during the 1999-00 season ... Stanford attempted 42 three-pointers against UCLA (2/23/02), breaking the old mark of 34 against Oregon State during the 1996-97 season.

Honors Hoopla

Post-season honors are starting to be released, and several Stanford players are again on several all-league, all-regional and All-America teams ... **Casey Jacobsen** earned his third All Pac-10 first team award, joining just 33 other players in Pac-10 history to accomplish that feat ... **Jacobsen** has been named a second team All-America by the United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) ... **Jacobsen** was named to the National Association of Basketball Coaches District-14 first team, and to the USBWA District-9 first team ... **Jacobsen** is a candidate for the John Wooden and Naismith Player of the Year awards ... **Curtis Borchardt**, along with **Jacobsen**, was named to the All Pac-10 first team ... **Borchardt** was also named to the NABC District-14 first team, and is a candidate for the John Wooden All-America team ... **Josh Childress** and **Chris Hernandez** were named honorable mention All Pac-10 freshman ... Stanford head coach **Mike Montgomery** is one of 20 finalists for Naismith Coach of the Year.

Several notable accomplishments for the Cardinal this season ... With 19 wins, Stanford has chalked up nine straight winning seasons ... Stanford, with its 79-75 victory at UCLA, has beaten the Bruins five straight seasons at Pauley Pavilion ... With a 76-71 victory at Arizona (2/28), the Cardinal has won two straight games for the first time ever at McKale Center ... With a 81-76 victory at Arizona State (3/2/02), the Cardinal has won seven straight contests in Tempe ... **The Jacobsen family** has set a national record for three-point field goals ... The national record was 597 by **the McCarthy brothers (Brendan, who scored 300 three-pointers at St. Anselm College in New Hampshire from 1993-96, and Kevin McCarthy, who scored 297 three-pointers at New Hampshire College from 1989-92) ... Casey, Adam and Brock Jacobsen** have combined to make 624 three-pointers ... **Casey** has made 221 three-pointers, while **Adam** made 311 from 1993-98 at Pacific, and **Brock** tallied 92 three-pointers from 1995-99 at USD.

Luisetti Ledger

The Pacific-10 Conference honored ten former coaches and student-athletes with their induction into the Pac-10 Hall of Honor during the 2002 Pac-10 Tournament (Mar. 7-9) ... Those individuals inducted included **Hank Luisetti (Stanford), Sean Elliott (Arizona), Byron Scott (Arizona State), Pete Newell (California), John Dick (Oregon), Gary Payton (Oregon State), John Wooden (UCLA), Bill Sharman (USC), Bob Houbregs (Washington) and Craig Ehlo (Washington State)** ... A three-time All-American and two-time College Player of the Year, **Luisetti** revolutionized the game with his one-handed shot during the 1930's ... **Luisetti** is a member of the Naismith Memorial Hall of Fame and the Citizens Savings Foundation Basketball Hall of Fame ... **Luisetti** is the owner of the oldest school record in Stanford basketball history, as he tossed in a school-best 50 points in a 92-27 victory over Duquesne on Jan. 1, 1938.

Stanford has signed three high school seniors to national letters of intent ... All three players will enroll at Stanford in the Fall of 2002.

Dan Grunfield, 6-6, 200, F, Glendale, Wi

Averaged 17.2 points and six rebounds per game during his junior season at Nicolet High School ... A pre-season honorable mention All-American by *Street & Smith's*.

Jason Haas, 6-2, 175, G, Blairstown, Nj

Last year at Penns Valley High School in Centre Hall, Pa, averaged 24 points and five assists in leading his team to a 24-2 record and the state tournament ... Attending Blair Academy in Blairstown, NJ this year.

Matt Haryasz, 6-10, 205, F, Page, Az

Averaged 15 points, seven rebounds and six blocks per game last year in leading Page High School to a 22-8 and the state tournament.
