Game Reset: Two of the oldest rivals in college football meet on Saturday, December 1 when Stanford (3-8, 2-6 Pac-10) and California (6-5, 3-5 Pac-10) face off in the 110th Big Game beginning at 4:00 pm, PT, at Stanford Stadium ... The game will be televised live nationally on Versus network ... The Cardinal is attempting to end a season-long four-game losing streak while the Bears, once in the thick of the BCS rankings, have lost two straight and five of their last six after beginning the season 5-0 ... Cal had a bye last Saturday while the Cardinal lost a 21-14 decision to Notre Dame at home ... Cal has won the last five Big Games (2002-06), including last year's 26-17 victory, and has not lost to the Cardinal since 2001.

Game Notes: After beating Oregon on September 29, Cal found itself 5-0 and in the conversation for national championship contenders ... But the Bears have lost five of their last six and enter the Big Game having lost consecutive games to USC and Washington ... The Bears need a win over Stanford to assure themselves a post-season bowl berth ... RB Justin Forsett leads the Pac-10 in rushing and is No. 15 nationally, averaging 118.8 yards per game on the ground, to spearhead the Bears' offense ... The Bears also lead the league, and rank No. 3 in the nation,

in fewest sacks allowed (only .82 per game) ... Stanford has lost its last four games while averaging just 11.5 points per game ... The Cardinal is among the national leaders in both tackles for loss (8.36, No. 6) and sacks (3.27, No. 9) per game.

Big Game Tied for 10th Longest in NCAA History: The Big Game is tied for the 10th longest rivalry in NCAA Division I-A college football history ... This year's 110th meeting puts the Big Game tied with Purdue-Indiana for 10th on the all-time list ... The Top 10 list of longest rivalries in college football is listed below:

Big Game Streaks: Stanford holds the Big Game record for consecutive wins at seven (1995-2001) but the Bears have won the last five (2002-06), tying their longest winning streak over Stanford since 1919-23 ... Stanford also had a six-game Big Game winning streak from 1961-66 ... The Bears have never won as many as six straight Big Games.

Close Calls in The Big Game: The Stanford-California rivalry has proven to be one of the most exciting in college football since it began in 1892 ... Of the 109 games, an amazing 50 have been decided by seven points or less, with Stanford holding a 23-16-11 advantage in those games ... Even more impressive, 29 Big Games have been decided by three points or less, with Stanford enjoying a 10-8-11 edge ... The Big Game has also produced an NCAA-best five "cliffhangers," which are games decided on the final play (1972, 1974, 1982, 1990, 2000).

Five Big Games Decided on Game's Final Play: Five Big Games have been decided on the game's final play: 1972 - Vince Ferragamo-Steve Sweeney TD pass for 24-21 Cal win; 1974 - Mike Langford 50-yard field goal for 22-20 Stanford win; 1982 - "The Play" gives Cal 25-20 win; 1990 - John Hopkins' 37-yard field goal for 27-25 Cardinal win; 2000 - Randy Fasani-Casey Moore touchdown pass in overtime gives Stanford 36-30 victory.

Big Game History

• **Close Series:** Only 35 points separates the two teams in their previous 109 games ... Stanford has scored 1,735 points to the Bears' 1,700.

• **The Axe:** To the winner of the Big Game goes "The Axe" ... The Axe made its first appearance at a Stanford-Cal baseball game on April 13, 1899, but it wasn't until 1933 that the two universities decided that The Axe would be a trophy given to the winner of The Big Game.

• **Series History:** The Big Game was interrupted from 1915-18 and again from 1943-45 (World War II) ... When the two schools disagreed over freshman eligibility, athletic relations were severed from 1915-18 ... Stanford's "Big Game" became its annual rugby match with Santa Clara.

• **The First Big Game:** The first Big Game was played on March 10, 1892, at the Haight Street Grounds in San Francisco ... Cal had fielded a team for 10 years, but for upstart Stanford University, which opened on October 1, 1891, this was to be its first intercollegiate football game ... Stanford pulled off the upset, beating the more experienced Bears, 14-10.

• **First Big Game Crowd:** An overflow crowd of 20,000 witnessed the first Big Game ... Stanford's manager was Herbert Hoover, later to become the 31st President of the United States.

• **The Immortal Twenty-One:** A group of Stanford students added to Big Game lore by stealing the Axe at Cal's annual Axe Rally on April 3, 1930. The Axe, which had been in a bank vault for 31 years, was now in possession of the Immortal Twenty-One. When the students returned to campus, the celebration began. Classes were canceled for two days and the University presented each member of the Immortal Twenty-One with a block "S" letter.

Bradford Among All-Time

Receivers: Senior **Mark Bradford**, who has caught 19 passes for 252 yards the last two games, has moved up to No. 5 on Stanford's all-time receptions list and No. 6 on the school's all-time career receiving yards chart ... Bradford caught seven passes for 111 yards last Saturday vs. Notre Dame ... In the previous

**Head Coach
Jim Harbaugh**



A 15-year NFL veteran and owner of an impressive 32-14 (.696) overall mark as a collegiate head coach, Jim Harbaugh is in his first season as the head coach at Stanford in 2007 ... Harbaugh needed just five

games into his Stanford career to make a lasting impression when the Cardinal stunned top-ranked USC, 24-23, in the Los Angeles Coliseum on October 6, 2007 ... His club is 3-8 in 2007, already winning two more games than Stanford won all of last season ... Harbaugh had spent the previous three seasons (2004-06) as the head coach at the University of San Diego, leading the Toreros to a 29-6 overall record and two Division I-AA Mid-Major national titles (2005, '06) when his club was 11-1 both of the last two seasons ... The Toreros also posted a school record 18-game win streak and two Pioneer Football League championships ... Harbaugh starred at Palo Alto High School as one of the top prep quarterbacks in the nation before graduating in 1982, then enjoyed a storied collegiate career at the University of Michigan (1983-86), leading the Wolverines to three bowl games while being named Big Ten Player of the Year in his final season in 1986 ... As a professional, Harbaugh finished his career among the Top 50 all-time in several passing categories and was named AFC Offensive Player of the Year in 1995 ... He played for five teams over 15 seasons (1987-2001) as a quarterback in the National Football League after entering the NFL as a first round draft pick of the Chicago Bears in 1987 ... After seven seasons in Chicago (1987-93), Harbaugh played for the Indianapolis Colts for four years (1994-97) before playing one year with the Baltimore Ravens (1998), two with the San Diego Chargers (1999-2000) and his final campaign with the Carolina Panthers (2001) ... In his brief coaching career, Harbaugh has been a part of one Super Bowl team (Oakland Raiders, 2002) and guided his USD teams to two national championships ... Harbaugh's dad, Jack, was Stanford's defensive coordinator in 1980 and '81.

game at Washington State, he caught a career-high 12 passes for 141 yards ... Bradford, who made national headlines with his game-winning catch against USC earlier this season, is now No. 5 all-time on The Farm with 164 career receptions and No. 6 with 2,347 career receiving yards ... He needs 135 receiving yards in Saturday's Big Game to move all the way up into the No. 3 spot on the all-time receiving yards list and just 21 to move into the Top 5 ... He will finish his Cardinal career with the fifth most catches in school history ... Bradford, who set the school record for receptions by a freshman (37 in 2003), currently leads the team with a career-high 46 catches in 2007 despite playing much of the year at less than 100 percent.

Defensively Speaking: A year ago, the Cardinal had 14 total sacks and averaged a Pac-10 low 1.3 per game ... In 2007, the Cardinal is No. 2

in the conference and No. 9 in the nation with 35 sacks and a per game average of 3.27 ... Stanford has also seen a similar increase in tackles for loss over a year ago ... The Cardinal recorded 4.2 tackles for loss per game in 2006 but that number has increased to 8.36 in 2007 ... Stanford is third in the Pac-10 and No. 6 nationally in tackles for loss ... In defeating No. 1 ranked USC, the Cardinal defense accounted for 4.0 sacks (-29 yards), 6.0 tackles for loss (-34 yards), four interceptions and five turnovers, while recording two pass breakups, a forced fumble, a fumble recovery and a blocked kick ... Stanford also held the Trojans, 10th in the nation averaging 237 yards rushing per game, to just 95 net yards on the ground ... A week later against TCU, the Cardinal defense was credited with 8.0 tackles for loss, 2.0 sacks, two forced fumbles, one fumble recovery, two pass breakups and four quarterback hurries ... In Stanford's 21-20 win at Arizona, Stanford recorded 3.0 sacks, 8.0 tackles for loss, a forced fumble, fumble recovery, interception and two fourth down stops that were key to the Cardinal's win ... Stanford was effective again behind the line of scrimmage in its Oct. 27 game at Oregon State as the Cardinal registered 6.0 sacks and 9.0 tackles for loss ... In Stanford's last game against Notre Dame, the Cardinal recorded a season best 13.0 tackles for loss, to go along with 5.0 sacks, three forced fumbles, three fumble recoveries, one interception, six pass breakups and one blocked kick.

Sack Time: Stanford's 3.27 sacks per game this season puts it among the top sack teams of all-time on the Farm ... Stanford has the highest per game sack average for a Cardinal defense since Stanford's 1999 Pac-10 championship and 2000 Rose Bowl team finished the season with 46 sacks (4.18 per game).

Active Defense: Stanford's defense has been more active than its defense of a year ago - and the numbers bear it out ... The 2007 Cardinal defense has increased its productivity in every defensive statistical category, not only in sacks and tackles for loss - and there is still one game to play ... Here are the comparisons between the 2006 and 2007 Cardinal defense:

Noting The Offense: Stanford's offensive numbers in 2007 are a significant improvement over last year's in every category ... A year ago, the Cardinal averaged 65.1 yards on the ground, 166.8 through the air, 231.9 yards in total offense and 10.6 points per game ... Fast forward to 2007 and those same numbers read: 110.3 rushing yards per game, 212.7 passing, 323.1 in total offense and 19.5 points scored per game ... A year ago, Stanford scored more than 20 points in just one of 12 games ... So far in 2007, the Cardinal has scored more than 20 points in five games, including three over 30 points ... In game two vs. San Jose State, the Cardinal offense accounted for 506 yards, the most on The Farm since getting 563 yards in a 63-26 win over SJSU on September 14, 2002 ... Stanford also going for 276 at Arizona on November 10, 2001 ... In the season opener vs. UCLA, Stanford threw for 346 yards, the most since Nov. 26, 2005, when Stanford passed for 347 yards vs. Notre Dame in the final game of the "old" Stanford Stadium ... The Cardinal's 37 points scored vs. San Jose State in game two was the most by a Cardinal offense in the last 20 games - dating back to Oct. 22, 2005, when Stanford defeated Arizona State, 45-35.

Bob Murphy To Retire After 43 Years In Broadcast Booth

Bob Murphy, a 1953 Stanford graduate and a member of the Stanford radio broadcast team for 43 years, announced that he will step down as the "Voice of the Cardinal" following the 2007 football season. His final game behind the mic at Stanford Stadium will be today's 110th Big Game vs. California.

Murphy was a member of the Stanford baseball team from 1950-53. He was a record-setting pitcher for Stanford's 1953 team that advanced to the College World Series. He was later inducted into the Stanford Athletics Hall of Fame. Murphy was the Sports Information Director at Stanford from 1964-72 and a former Athletic Director at San Jose State.

Murphy began his broadcasting career on The Farm in 1964. Over the past 43 years, he has served, at different times, as Stanford's play-by-play broadcaster and color analyst for both Stanford football and men's basketball games.

Cardinal Honors Bill Walsh

Stanford players and coaches are honoring the late Bill Walsh, who passed away on July 30, 2007, by wearing a "BW" decal on player helmets and a patch on the coaches' shirts.

Walsh was the head football coach at Stanford on two occasions from 1977-78 and 1992-94. His two Stanford head coaching stints sandwiched his 10-year run as the head football coach of the San Francisco 49ers when he led the club to three Super Bowl titles (1982, 1985, 1989) and was twice named NFL Coach of the Year (1981, 1984).

**The Last Meeting: December 2, 2006
California 26, Stanford 17
Berkeley, CA, Memorial Stadium**

BERKELEY, (AP) - The 109th Big Game had all the makings of a classic mismatch. But, the Big Upset didn't quite happen and California went on to win its school record fifth straight Big Game over Stanford, 26-17, in Berkeley.

California led the entire game but could never open up a lead bigger than 10 points and when Evan Moore hauled in a 51-yard touchdown pass from T.C. Ostrander with 6:57 to go in the third quarter, the Cardinal was surprisingly within a field goal by cutting the Golden Bears' lead to 20-17.

Tom Schneider's third and fourth field goals of the game would account for the last six Golden Bear points and the final nine-point margin but his game-clinching kick that put California ahead by more than one score didn't happen until only 58 seconds remained.

Stanford actually had one golden chance to take a late lead in the game when Michael Okwo forced a Marshawn Lynch fumble that Bo McNally recovered at the California 14-yard line with 13:35 remaining in the contest.

But the ensuing Stanford drive netted just two yards on three plays and when Aaron Zagory missed a chip shot 29-yard field goal attempt to get the Cardinal back within three points the opportunity was wasted and the Golden Bears had dodged a serious bullet.

Game 1 - UCLA 45, Stanford 17
September 1, Stanford Stadium

STANFORD, Calif. (AP) -- UCLA quarterback Ben Olson threw five touchdown passes and Kahlil Bell ran for a career-high 195 yards to lead the 14th-ranked Bruins to a 45-17 victory Saturday in Jim Harbaugh's first game as the Cardinal coach.

Coaching across the street from where he went to high school, Harbaugh's imprint on Stanford's offense was evident as the Cardinal moved the ball much better than they did in a 1-11 season a year ago.

After being outscored 165-33 in losing all five games at its remodeled stadium in 2006, Stanford was competitive for a little more than a half this game. The Cardinal trailed 14-7 at halftime and were within 21-10 late in the third quarter.

Senior T.C. Ostrander, beginning the season as the starter for the first time in his career, was 27-for-59 for 331 yards and two touchdowns, including a 70-yarder to Richard Sherman in the fourth quarter.

The Harbaugh era got off to an inauspicious start when Ostrander was stripped on a sack by a blitzing Trey Brown on the third play of the game, giving UCLA the ball at the Cardinal 12 after Bruce Davis' recovery.

Stanford's defense held the Bruins and Kai Forbath missed a 28-yard field goal to keep the game scoreless. But the Cardinal could not shut down the Bruins for long.

An 11-yard punt by Jay Ottovegio gave UCLA the ball on its own 40 midway through the first quarter. Four plays later, Breazell made a leaping 19-yard touchdown grab over Tim Sims to give UCLA the lead.

The Cardinal played with more enthusiasm than last year. Ostrander led the team on an 80-yard drive in the final minutes of the opening half. He went 4-for-6 for 45 yards on the drive, capping it with a 9-yard score to Jim Dray.

Game 2 - Stanford 37, SJSU 0
September 15, Stanford Stadium

STANFORD, Calif. (AP) -- Toby Gerhart ran for 140 yards and a touchdown Saturday night to lead Stanford to its first win in seven tries in its newly renovated stadium, 37-0 over San Jose State in the Cardinal's first shutout in more than a decade.

With a 52-yard field goal by Derek Belch on the opening drive, Stanford (1-1) was in front nearly the entire game and dominated San Jose State (0-3) with an overpowering running game.

The defense kept the Spartans off the scoreboard. It was Stanford's first shutout since a 38-0 victory over Michigan State in the 1996 Sun Bowl and first at home since a 24-0 win over Washington in 1972.

T.C. Ostrander threw a 46-yard touchdown pass to Richard Sherman and a 27-yarder to Austin Gunder in the fourth quarter as coach Jim Harbaugh's offense once again looked light years ahead of where it was a year ago.

Ostrander finished 18-for-28 for 220 yards. The Cardinal topped 500 yards for the first time in five years and scored four more points than they did in five home games combined last year.

The Cardinal led for all of 2:30 in their first six games in the new stadium before putting together a 13-play drive on their first possession to set up Belch's career-long field goal.

Belch added a 37-yarder midway through the second quarter and then Ostrander put together an efficient drive late in the half to set up a 50-yarder with 31 seconds left that gave Stanford a 9-0 lead at the break.

The Cardinal finally made it into the end zone to start the third quarter. Gerhart, who missed the opener with a hamstring injury, had 45 of Stanford's 66 yards on the drive. He capped it with a 13-yard run. Gerhart had the first 100-yard rushing game for a Stanford back since J.R. Lemon ran for 162 yards on Oct. 2, 2004, against Washington.

Game 3 - Oregon 55, Stanford 31

STANFORD, Calif. (AP) -- Dennis Dixon threw a career-high four touchdowns and rushed for another score, and No. 13 Oregon scored 34 straight points and shut out Stanford in the second half of a 55-31 victory.

Jeremiah Johnson scored the go-ahead touchdown midway through the third quarter and Jonathan Stewart, who rushed for 160 yards on 19 carries, also scored as the Ducks (4-0, 1-0 Pac-10) .

Dixon, who was 27-for-36 for 367 yards, hit tight end Ed Dickson along the sideline for a 33-yard scoring toss early in the second half for a 31-31 tie. He also threw TD passes to Cameron Colvin, and two to Jaison Williams.

Oregon, the Pac-10 leader in scoring and total offense, was held to 48 yards during the second quarter, when they allowed 28 points to Stanford. The Ducks recovered nicely in the second half and finished with 589 yards. Anthony Kimble rushed for 115 of his career-high 119 yards in the first half for Stanford (1-2, 0-2). T.C. Ostrander threw for 262 yards and a pair of touchdowns.

The Ducks, who entered the game third nationally in turnover margin, turned the ball over more in one quarter than their previous three games combined. Three Oregon turnovers -- all fumbles -- in the second quarter resulted in three Stanford touchdowns.

Dixon's back pitch was recovered by Pannel Egboh, which led to Kimble's 60-yard TD romp down the middle of the field. Stanford linebacker Clinton Snyder caused and recovered a fumble that led to Kimble's 3-yard run for a score. Chike Amajoyi recovered another fumble, and that led to Ostrander's 12-yard touchdown pass to Mark Bradford for the go-ahead score.

Matt Evensen hit a short field goal just before halftime, bringing Oregon within 31-24 heading into intermission.

STANFORD, Calif. (AP) -- In a matter of seconds, Arizona State turned a close game into a blowout.

Rudy Carpenter threw a 62-yard touchdown pass to Rudy Burgess late in the second quarter and Omar Bolden returned an interception for a score on the next play from scrimmage to lead the 23rd-ranked Sun Devils to a 41-3 victory over Stanford.

Arizona State (5-0, 2-0 Pac-10) had been struggling offensively up until that point, giving up five sacks and being held to a pair of field goals by a Stanford team that had been unable to slow down its first two conference opponents.

Then on a third-and-8, Burgess took a pass from Carpenter and sped past the Cardinal defenders to the end zone for the first touchdown of the game with 2:31 left in the half. Keegan Herring ran in the 2-point conversion to make it 14-0.

After a touchback on the ensuing kick, T.C. Ostrander tried to connect with Richard Sherman for Stanford (1-3, 0-3). But Robert James knocked the ball away and into the hands of Bolden, who raced 29 yards for Arizona State's second touchdown in a span of 9 seconds.

Dimitri Nance added a 17-yard TD run and Herring scored on a 72-yard scamper in the fourth quarter as Arizona State won in its first road game of the season.

Arizona State got field goals from Thomas Weber on its first two possessions to take a 6-0 lead. The Sun Devils began their first drive at the 48 after a facemask penalty on the opening kick to set up Weber's 41-yard field goal.

Ostrander fumbled on a sack by Dexter Davis on Stanford's first drive. Dane Guthrie recovered at the 21 to set up Weber's 32-yard field goal that made it 6-0. Weber added two more field goals in the third quarter.

Game 5 - Stanford 24, USC 23

LOS ANGELES, Calif. (AP) - In what's been the year of the upset in college football, Stanford's stunner just might top them all.

Tavita Pritchard threw a 10-yard touchdown pass to Mark Bradford on fourth-and-goal with 49 seconds remaining Saturday night, giving the 41-point underdog Cardinal a 24-23 victory over No. 1/No. 2 Southern California.

A leaping Bradford caught the ball over cornerback Mozique McCurtis in the corner of the end zone, leaving the crowd of 85,125 at the L.A. Coliseum in stunned silence. Bo McNally's interception thwarted USC's final chance.

In a season that started with Appalachian State's improbable victory over Michigan at the Big House, and a week after half the Top 10 went down, the Cardinal is now the upset kings - at least for now.

Making his first career start, Pritchard had to convert on fourth-and-20 four plays before the winning TD, and because he couldn't hear his coach calling in the play, he was on his own.

Richard Sherman caught the critical fourth-and-20 pass over the middle before being leveled at the 9 - just past the first-down marker.

The Cardinal (2-3, 1-3 Pac-10) scored 17 points in the fourth quarter and moved 45 yards in 11 plays for the winning TD after USC's John David Booty threw the third of his four interceptions. Wopamo Osaisai's 18-yard return gave Stanford the ball with 2:50 remaining.

"It hasn't set in yet," a jubilant Pritchard said. "I'm beside myself - I don't know what to do. Our defense kept us in the game all night. It gave me a chance to get untracked."

Pritchard, filling in for T.C. Ostrander, completed 11-of-30 for 149 yards and the winning TD. The numbers weren't great, but he was awfully good when it counted most.

The Trojans rolled up 459 yards to just 235 for Stanford. But USC's five turnovers and Pannel Egboh's block of USC kicker David Buehler's PAT attempt early in the second quarter proved decisive.

A week after slowing down USC's offense and pulling off one of the signature upsets in college football history, the Cardinal could not solve the TCU passing attack.

The teams traded scores through most of the first three quarters, with Kimble's 15-yard touchdown early in the second half putting the Cardinal ahead 28-17.

Stanford extended its lead when Derek Belch kicked a 37-yard field goal with 3:54 left in the third quarter following a drive that lasted more than six minutes.

It took the Frogs two plays and 37 seconds to draw within 31-24. Dalton hooked up with Young over the middle for a 70-yard touchdown. Stanford then went three-and-out and the Frogs went 60 yards in nine plays, and a 2-yard pass from Dalton to Brown on fourth down tied the game at 31-31 with 9:55 left.

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) -Jeremy Stewart scored on a 1-yard run midway through the fourth quarter as Stanford rallied for a 21-20 victory over Arizona on Saturday night.

They went 52 yards in nine plays, with Evans running for a 2-yard touchdown to give Stanford a 14-10 lead with five seconds left before half-time.

Arizona didn't wait long to answer. The Wildcats took the second-half kickoff and marched 85 yards in 11 plays, with Tuitama hitting redshirt freshman A.J. Simmons for a 3-yard touchdown to put Arizona ahead 17-14.

Stanford fumbled once more, Serna kicked a 41-yard field goal and Doggett picked off Pritchard to seal the win.

STANFORD, Calif. (AP) - Louis Rankin ran for 255 yards and a touchdown in the best performance by a Washington running back in 11 years, helping the Huskies avenge a loss to Stanford last year and win their first Pac-10 game this season, 27-9 over the Cardinal on Saturday.

Rankin carried the ball 36 times as Washington (3-6, 1-5) relied on its ground game, finishing with a season-high 388 yards on the ground to snap a six-game losing streak.

Stanford quarterback Tavita Pritchard was taken to the locker room after the Cardinal's second drive of the game. He came back out in the second quarter but T.C. Ostrander remained in the game. Ostrander finished 16-for-28 for 133 yards.

The Huskies had six sacks and held the Cardinal to 253 yards.

After Stanford cut Washington's lead to 13-9 on a 1-yard run by Tyrone McGraw late in the third quarter, Rankin helped the Huskies regain control. He had a 42-yard run on the ensuing drive and then scored from the 1 on the opening play of the fourth quarter to make it 20-9. Locker added a score in the closing minute.

Washington dominated the first half statistically, outgaining Stanford 303-156. But the Huskies only led 10-3 at the break.

Stanford couldn't convert its chances. Derek Belch missed a 32-yard field goal on the first drive of the game. The Cardinal then failed to score after recovering a fumble by Rankin at the Washington 1. Corey Gatewood fumbled reaching for the end zone on a second-down run.

The only touchdown of the first half came on a 98-yard drive late in the first quarter. Locker completed a 26-yard pass to Russo on third-and-16 from the 8. Rankin followed with a 42-yard run and Locker capped the drive with a 17-yard scramble.

PULLMAN, Wash. (AP) - Alex Brink threw for 449 yards and broke the school record for career touchdown passes, leading Washington State to a 33-17 victory over Stanford on Saturday.

In a game marred by fumbles and penalties, Washington State (4-6, 2-5 Pac-10) had 561 yards of total offense and the Cougars withstood a third-quarter rally by the Cardinal (3-7, 2-6).

Brink completed 32 of 47 passes and upped his career yards passing to 10,200. He became only the sixth quarterback in Pac-10 history to surpass 10,000 yards.

Brink's 12-yard scoring pass to tight end Ben Woodard in the second quarter was the 71st in his career, breaking the school record of 70 set by Jason Gesser from 1999-2002.

Christopher Ivory, returning from a concussion, had 15 carries for 104 yards for the Cougars.

Husain Abdullah intercepted Stanford quarterback Tavita Pritchard's pass and returned it 55 yards to give the cougars a 33-17 lead late in the game.

Cougars kicker Romeen Abdollmohammadi hit field goals of 40, 23, 32 and 31 yards.

Trailing 13-0 at the start of the half, Stanford climbed to within 13-10 before Kevin McCall ran 12 yards to put the Cougars up 20-10.

Tavita Pritchard finished with 22 of 40 passes for 263 yards. He threw two interceptions and was sacked four times.

Tyrone McGraw and Jeremy Stewart split rushing duties for Stanford and each scored a touchdown. McGraw took a pitch from Pritchard and ran 4 yards to score Stanford's first TD. Stewart later scored on a 4 yard run to pull the Cardinal within 20-17 in the third quarter.

STANFORD, Calif. (AP) - Robert Hughes ran for 136 yards and the go-ahead 6-yard touchdown with 6:06 remaining to help the Fighting Irish end the season with consecutive wins for the first time in 15 years by beating Stanford 21-14 Saturday.

The game wasn't a pretty one, however, with six turnovers, five missed field goals, four plays overturned by instant replay and a number of personal foul penalties.

After Derek Belch missed his fourth field goal of the game for Stanford (3-8), a 49-yarder following an interception by Jimmy Clausen, Notre Dame drove for the winning score. Hughes broke off a 44-yard run down to the Cardinal 8 and scored two plays later to make it 21-14.

Doug Baldwin returned the ensuing kickoff 42 yards to the Stanford 48. T.C. Ostrander, who replaced an injured Tavita Pritchard earlier in the half, drove the Cardinal down to the 7. Evan Moore could not hold onto a pass in the end zone on third down and Ostrander couldn't connect with Richard Sherman on fourth down in the final minute to end Stanford's comeback attempt.

Both teams missed chances to break the tie earlier in the second half. Tom Zbikowski set up the Irish early in the third quarter with a 60-yard punt return to the 31. Notre Dame lost 16 yards on three plays, but kept the ball on a roughing the punter penalty by the Cardinal. Three plays later, Brandon Walker's 44-yard field goal attempt went wide right.

Later in the third quarter, the Cardinal appeared to turn the ball over when Terrail Lambert drilled Pritchard in the helmet, causing a fumble. After a replay review, Pritchard was ruled down before the fumble and T.C. Ostrander drove the Cardinal down for the go-ahead score but Belch was wide right on a 30-yard field goal attempt.
