Overall: 4-7, Pac-10: 2-6

CARDINAL CONCLUDES 2004 CAMPAIGN WITH 4-7 RECORD

Stanford concluded the 2004 season with an overall record of 4-7 and a conference record of 2-6 ... The Cardinal began the year with wins over San Jose State and BYU and found themselves with a 4-2 record after a conference win at Washington State on October 16 ... However, Stanford lost its final five games of the year ... Five of the Cardinal's seven losses were by a combined 22 points ... Stanford also lost three games by three points each ... Six of the Cardinal's seven losses came against teams that advanced to post-season bowl games ... Following the season, head coach **Buddy Teevens** was released from his position on November 29 ... **Walt Harris** was named Stanford's new head football coach on December 13.

TEN EARN ALL-PACIFIC-10 CONFERENCE RECOGNITION

Tight end **Alex Smith**, kickoff return specialist **T.J. Rushing** and sophomore **Michael Okwo** earned First-Team All-Pac-10 honors while linebacker **Jon Alston** received Second-Team recognition ... Stanford also had six players earn Honorable Mention honors in 2004 ... Smith was fifth in the league - and tops among tight ends - in receptions per game (4.73) and sixth in receiving yards per game (64.2) while Rushing led the conference with a 28.4 KOR average ... Okwo, a reserve linebacker, received First-Team All-Pac-10 honors as the league's top special teams player ... Alston, a junior in his first year in the starting lineup, led the Cardinal and was among the league leaders in sacks with 9.5 and tackles for loss with 14 ... Earning honorable mention recognition were: FS **Oshiomogho Atogwe**, DT **Julian Jenkins**, FL **Evan Moore**, NT **Babatunde Oshinowo**, ILB **Kevin Schimmelmann** and CB **Stanley Wilson**.

STANFORD PLACES LEAGUE BEST 25 ON ALL-ACADEMIC TEAM

Once again, the Cardinal led the conference with 25 players named to the 2004 Pacific-10 Conference All-Academic Team ... Stanford has six players chosen to the First-Team, including **Kevin Schimmelmann** for the third straight season, eight were selected to the Second-Team and 11 earned honorable mention recognition ... Players must have a minimum 3.0 grade point average to qualify for the team ... Along with Schimmelmann, First-Team honors went to **Babatunde Oshinowo** for the second consecutive year, and first-year selections RB **Kris Bonifas**, WR **Greg Camarillo**, FL **Evan Moore**, and DB **Bryan Bentrutt** ... Second-team honors went to OL **Brent Newhouse**, OL **Josiah Vinson**, DL **Nick Frank**, DL **Matt McClernan**, DL **Will Svitek**, LB **David Bergeron**, LB **Mike Silva** and DB **Leigh Torrence** ... Honorable mention selections included: LB **Emmanuel Awofadeju**, OL **Mikal Brewer**, OL **Preston Clover**, OL **Jon Co-**

11 PLAYERS CONCLUDE THEIR CARDINAL CAREERS IN 2004

Stanford had just 11 seniors in 2004 conclude their collegiate careers on The Farm ... The list includes seven defensive and four offensive players ... Seven of the departing seniors were starters, including FS **Oshiomogho Atogwe**, ILB **David Bergeron**, OLB **Jared Newberry**, DE **Scott Scharff**, TE **Alex Smith**, CB **Leigh Torrence** and CB **Stanley Wilson** ... The other four departing seniors include FL **Greg Camarillo**, QB **Ryan Eklund**, DE **Will Svitek** and RB **Kenneth Tolon**.

CARDINAL RETURNS 15 STARTERS, BOTH KICKERS, IN 2005

Stanford will return 15 starters and both kickers in 2005, including 10 returning starters on offense ... Only tight end **Alex Smith** will not be back for the Cardinal on offense in '05 ... Stanford returns its entire offensive line (LT **Jon Cochran**, LG **Ismail Simpson**, C **Brian Head**, RG **Josiah Vinson**, RT **Jeff Edwards**), QB **Trent Edwards**, RB **J.R. Lemon**, WR **Mark Bradford**, FL **Evan Moore** and FB **Kris Bonifas** ... Returning starters on defense include OLB **Jon Alston**, DT **Julian Jenkins**, NT **Babatunde Oshinowo**, ILB **Kevin Schimmelman** and SS **Brandon Harrison** ... The Cardinal will all return both kickers: PK **Michael Sgroi** and P **Jay Ottovegio**.

RECORD BOOK UPDATE; SMITH BREAKS SCHOOL RECORD

Tight end **Alex Smith** set a school record for receptions by a tight end after concluding his career with 107 catches ... Smith broke **Bob Moore**'s record of 100 receptions and became the first Cardinal tight end to lead the team in receptions since Moore in 1969 ... Smith caught 52 passes in 2004, the second best single season by a Cardinal tight end in school history ... PK **Michael Sgroi**, KOR

T.J. Rushing and FS **Oshiomogho Atogwe** also put themselves in the Cardinal record book after their performances in 2004 ... Sgroi, who hit 16-of-24 field goal attempts and led the team with 92 points, moved into the all-time top-10 in field goals ... He is now No. 6 at Stanford with 32 career field goals ... Rushing placed his name in the all-time top-10 in several categories, including season KOR average (28.4, tied for No. 3), season KOR yards (653, No. 2), career KOR average (26.9, No. 2) and season KOR yards (834, No. 8) ... Atogwe finished his career with nine interceptions, tied for eighth all-time at Stanford.

SMITH EARNS SEVERAL POST-SEASON AWARDS

Senior tight end **Alex Smith**, who became the most prolific receiving tight end in school history, was also the most honored Cardinal player in 2004 ... He finished the season with 52 receptions for 706 yards and three touchdowns and was No. 1 in the Pac-10 among tight ends in both categories ... Nationally, Smith was No. 2 among tight ends in receptions and receiving yards ... He was the runner-up for the Mackey Award, given annually to the nation's top tight end ... Smith was a consensus Second-Team All-America selection, First-Team All-Pac-10 and Team MVP in 2004 ... He became the first Stanford tight end to be named First-Team All-Pac-10 since **Greg Baty** in 1985 and the first tight end to lead the team in receiving since **Bob Moore** in 1969 ... Smith's final career numbers: 107 catches, 1,291 yards, 12.1 average, eight touchdowns ... His 52 receptions in '04 was the second best single season for a Cardinal tight end (61 by Baty in 1985) ... He has caught 24 passes for 358 yards and two TDs during a three game span midway through the season vs. Oregon (nine receptions, 110 yards), UCLA (10 catches, 136 yards) and Arizona State (five receptions, 112 yards, two TDs) ... Against Oregon (Oct. 23), Smith established career highs in both receptions and receiving yards, only to break both marks the following week at UCLA ... He caught four passes for 30 yards in the season opener vs. San Jose State and six catches for 87 yards and one TD vs. BYU ... Against top-ranked USC, he had five receptions for 45 yards ... Smith had four receptions for 46 yards against Washington and five catches for 73 yards at Notre Dame ... A fifth-year senior from Denver, Colorado, Smith started his final 32 games at Stanford from 2002-04.

Team Notes: Redshirt freshman punter **Jay Ottovegio** became the first freshman to average over 40 yards punt in school history ... In his first year as a starter, Ottovegio averaged 41.3 yards per punt ... He was named a *Sporting News* Second-Team Freshman All-America ... FL **Evan Moore** was named *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-District-8 ... Stanford led the Pac-10 and was seventh in the nation in kickoff returns, averaging 24.63 yards per return ... FS **Oshiomogho Atogwe** led the team in tackles for the third straight season and became just the third player in school history to lead the team in tackles for three consecutive years ... Atogwe finished his career with 241 total tackles, nine interceptions, 11 forced fumbles and seven fumble recoveries while starting all 33 games for Stanford in 2002, '03, '04 ... OLB **Jon Alston** led the team with 14 tackles for loss and 9.5 quarterback sacks, which both rank among the best single seasons in school history (No. 9 in tackles for loss, No. 12 in sacks) ... He finished fourth in the Pac-10 in sacks, sixth in tackles for loss and tied for fifth in forced fumbles with three) ... **Kenneth Tolon** finished his career with 1,636 rushing yards and 12 rushing touchdowns ... He fell 53 rushing yards and one rushing touchdown shy of the school's all-time top-10 ... Stanford finished second in the Pac-10 and No. 16 in the nation in turnover margin (+0.73 per game).

2004 Game-by-Game Reviews

Game 1 - Stanford 43, San Jose State 3

September 4, Stanford Stadium

Stanford broke the game open with three third quarter touchdowns and went on to beat visiting San Jose State 43-3 in the season opener. The Cardinal, which gained 333 yards through the air, limited SJS to five first downs and 130 yards of total offense in the first half as Stanford built a 15-0 lead at the intermission.

Trent Edwards was sharp in completing 14-of-22 for 187 yards and two touchdowns, which both went to sophomore receiver Evan Moore in the first half. Edwards and Moore hooked up on TD passes of 22 and 30 yards for the only scoring plays in the first half.

The Cardinal scored on its first three possessions of the second half to extend their lead to 36-0. RB Kenneth Tolon, who led the team with 96 rushing yards, scored two of those TDs on runs of four and one yard. Edwards scored himself on a four-yard run for the Cardinal's other score.

Stanford's 40-point win was its largest margin of victory since 1991.

Game 2 - Stanford 37, San Jose State 10

September 11, Stanford Stadium

Stanford erased an early 10-0 BYU lead and scored 37 unanswered points in earning its second consecutive victory in 2004. While the Cardinal was limited in its running game, Trent Edwards again led a potent passing attack that accounted for 297 yards and three touchdowns.

Trailing 10-0, Stanford received the spark it needed in the form of T.J. Rushing, who returned a kick 99 yards for the Cardinal's first score. Stanford drove 96 yards on seven plays on its next possession to take the lead for good. Edwards and tight end Alex Smith hooked up on a one-yard TD pass to put the Cardinal on top 14-10.

From there, it was all Stanford. A field goal by Michael Sgroi gave the Cardinal a 17-10 lead at the intermission. An interception by Oshiomogho Atogwe in the third period led to 50-yard scoring drive that ended with a 21-yard touchdown pass from Edwards to Justin McCullum and a 24-10 lead.

Stanford took the nation's top-ranked team to the brink of a major upset before falling to the Trojans 31-28. The Cardinal went into the locker room at the half up 28-17, but two second half touchdowns and a stingy USC defense allowed the Trojans to get out of town with a win.

USC jumped out to a 10-0 lead before Trent Edwards engineered touchdown drives of 79 and 76 yards that gave Stanford the lead at 14-10. Evan Moore and Patrick Danahy each scored on touchdown passes from Edwards. The Cardinal extended its lead to 21-0 when backup quarterback and holder Kyle Matter ran in from 11-yards out on a fake field goal.

Reggie Bush's TD run brought the Trojans within four at 21-17, but on the final play of the first half, Cardinal RB J.R. Lemon raced 82 yards for a touchdown that gave Stanford a 28-17 halftime lead.

In the second half, however, the Trojans scored two touchdowns and allowed the Cardinal just 26 yards of total offense.

Although the Cardinal committed four turnovers, including two in the Red Zone, had eight penalties and played sloppy at times, Stanford still managed to take a 10-year wrench off its back and beat the Washington Huskies to run its record to 3-1. The Cardinal, who had not defeated Washington since 1994, relied on the running of J.R. Lemon and a blocked punt to secure the win.

Lemon gained a career high 162 yards and scored three touchdowns in leading a Cardinal offense that did gain 456 yards in total offense, but turned the ball over twice inside the Huskies 12-yard line.

Two fourth quarter touchdowns by Notre Dame allowed the Irish to turn a 15-10 deficit into a 23-15 victory in South Bend.

Stanford drove down the field impressively against Notre Dame on its first two possessions of the game, but had to settle for two Michael Sgroi field goals and a 6-0 lead. The Cardinal has first-and-goal opportunities on each drive, including the second drive that ended at the Irish three.

The Cardinal won its first Pac-10 road game since 2001 as it built a 20-3 lead over Washington State before holding on for a 23-17 win in Pullman. PK Michael Sgroi kicked three field goals, the last one coming from 47 yards out with 8:16 to play to put the Cardinal on top by six, and the Stanford defense held off the charging Cougars in the fourth quarter.

Stanford suffered a hard-fought 16-13 defeat at home against Oregon on a day when starting quarterback Trent Edwards was knocked out of the game in the second quarter and Michael Sgroi missed a 49-yard field goal attempt on the game's final play.

The Cardinal lost its second straight game as UCLA pitched a shutout in beating Stanford 21-0 at the Rose Bowl. The loss pushed the Cardinal's record to 4-4 and dropped their conference mark to 2-3.

The Bruins rushed for 246 yards, the most allowed by the Cardinal in 2004, but UCLA's high-powered offense was limited to just two touchdowns against Stanford's defense.

Manuel White capped an 85-yard drive in the first quarter by scoring from two yards out to give the Bruins a 7-0 lead. In the second period, UCLA's Maurice Drew returned a punt 68-yards for a touchdown and a 14-0 Bruin advantage.
